1. Complainants intend to submit an Appeal to the Commonwealth Court of Pennsylvania.
2. Complainants respectfully affirm that no changes will be made to the existing analog meter on Complainants' home while Complainants' case remains active. **The current meter should remain in place until final disposition in this case is made at the appellate court level**, whether it be the Commonwealth Court or the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania.
3. In addition, other legal actions are in process whose outcomes will affect the path forward of Complainant's case:
 - a. Decision pending in the Declaratory Judgment of Petitioner Nancy Colbert.
The Commonwealth Court has sent this case on to the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania.
 - b. Decision pending in the 'Petition for Allowance of Appeal' in 'Alexia and Lawrence McKnight v. Public Utility Commission' to the Pennsylvania Supreme Court.
4. Complainants respectfully request that the current meter remain in place, not only during their ongoing legal proceedings, but also until these other legal actions are completed in full because they may fundamentally impact their own case.
5. In leaving the current meter in place, PPL Electric Utilities Corporation will not be harmed, because Complainants pay their electric utility bills faithfully and on time and can provide meter readings if/as needed.

Therefore, Complainants affirm that PPL Electric Utilities will allow the current electric meter to remain in place during Complainants' ongoing case. The current electric meter will stay in place until:

(1) a final disposition of their case is made at a higher court; and

(2) final decisions are rendered in related cases, named *supra*, as these may impact the legal path forward for Complainants.
