**Re:** Periodic Review of Pike County Light & Power Company's Long-Term  
Infrastructure Improvement Plan.

Dear Whitney E. Snyder:

The Commission is required to review a utility's Long-Term Infrastructure Improvement Plan (LTIIIP) periodically, but at least once every five (5) years.<sup>1</sup> Unless otherwise directed, the review shall begin at the midpoint of the term of the current LTIIIP. Pike County Light & Power Company's (Pike) current LTIIIP for its electric operations began with calendar year 2021 and thus the midpoint is approximately July 1, 2024.

Pike is hereby notified that the Commission will begin the review of its LTIIIP on August 22, 2024, at the above captioned docket number. The Commission's review will determine:

1. If Pike has adhered to its LTIIIP
2. If changes to the LTIIIP are necessary to maintain and improve the efficiency, safety, adequacy and reliability of Pike's existing distribution infrastructure.

Upon completion of the review, the Commission shall issue an Order with a determination of whether or not Pike has adhered to its LTIIIP and if any changes to the LTIIIP are necessary. The Commission will direct Pike to revise, update, or resubmit its LTIIIP as appropriate if it determines Pike's approved LTIIIP is no longer adequate to ensure and maintain efficient, adequate, safe, reliable and reasonable service. Upon such a determination, Pike may elect to withdraw its LTIIIP rather than comply with the Commission's direction. Pike's approved distribution system improvement surcharge (DSIC) mechanism would immediately terminate upon such a withdrawal.

To aid in its review the Commission is establishing a thirty (30) day comment period beginning from the date of this letter and a twenty (20) day reply comment period.<sup>2</sup> A copy of this letter has been served upon the statutory advocates, the Bureau of Investigation & Enforcement, and the parties of record from Pike's most recent base rate case proceeding, consistent with the LTIIIP


