

JOINT MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

AND NOW, comes Complainant Knox Township and Respondent, Buffalo & Pittsburgh Railroad Company ("BPRR"), by their undersigned attorneys and files their Joint Motion for Extension of Time, stating as follows:

INTRODUCTION

1. This matter involves three above-grade railroad crossings located in Knox Township, Jefferson County, Pennsylvania where Ramsaytown Road (T-841), East Bellport Road (T-405), and Harriger Hollow Road (T-420) cross the right of way of the Buffalo & Pittsburgh Railroad, Inc.

2. BPRR was directed to demolish and remove all three crossings pursuant to an Order of April 20, 2023, entered by the Public Utility Commission ("PUC"), with work to be completed on or before July 1, 2024, and Knox Township was directed to finish grade the roadway and shoulder approaches and to grade and seed the highway approaches with the work to be completed on or before October 1, 2024.

3. As of the filing of this Motion, the existing railroad structures have been completely removed and work to backfill and grade the areas has been performed.

4. However, additional time is needed for BPRR to complete the work related to the widths of the roadways and shoulders as well as the slopes of the embankments, and for Knox Township to complete the work related to the roadway and highway approaches.

5. In addition, two unexpected issues arose relating to the work at the Ramsaytown Road Crossing —namely that: (1) there is a residential gas line that is only six inches below the surface on one side of the road, which was not identified through PA One Call, and which has to be removed and relocated; and (2) the embankment on one side of Ramsaytown Road consists of a significant amount of rock, making excavation more difficult and time consuming.

6. BPRR, Knox Township, and I&E have met and conferred and are in agreement with regard to the remaining work and the time needed to complete the same.

7. Accordingly, BPRR and Knox Township file this Joint Motion for Extension of Time to request a brief extension for each party to complete its respective work related to the three crossings at issue in this matter.

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

8. On April 10, 2019, Knox Township filed a Formal Complaint against BPRR, in which it averred that three overpasses on a railroad right-of-way were creating a traffic and safety problem.¹

9. On April 25, 2019, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“PUC” or “Commission”) served the Complaint on BPRR, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT), Jefferson County, and Brookville Borough.

¹ The overpasses were identified as located on: (1) Harriger Hollow Road (DOT 863 296 J); (2) East Bellport Road (DOT 863 302 K); and (3) Ramsaytown Road (DOT 863 298 X).

10. On May 13, 2019, BPRR filed an Answer and New Matter to the Complaint admitting that the overpasses are located on its right-of-way but denying any traffic and safety problems.

11. On June 14, 2019, the Commission, through its Rail Safety Division, convened a field conference at the site of the public crossings during which the Parties agreed to certain mitigation measures that were memorialized in a Secretarial Letter dated September 10, 2019, (*September 2019 Secretarial Letter*).

12. By letters dated December 13, 2019, and February 10, 2020, BPRR advised the Commission that the work directed by the *September 2019 Secretarial Letter* had been completed.

13. A further field conference was held on February 21, 2020, and further settlement discussions commenced. The Parties were unable to reach an agreement regarding the resolution of Knox Township's Complaint. The Commission's Rail Safety Division, therefore, requested that the Complaint be referred to the Office of Administrative Law Judge (OALJ) for hearing.

14. On July 1, 2021, a prehearing conference was held.

15. An evidentiary hearing was conducted via telephone on January 25, 2022, by Administrative Law Judge Mary D. Long.

16. On June 24, 2022, a Recommended Decision was issued by Administrative Law Judge Mary D. Long recommending that all three bridges be removed at BPRR's cost, and that the crossings be abolished.

17. On April 20, 2023, the Commission adopted the Recommended Decision of ALJ Long, denied the Exceptions of BPRR, and entered an Order directing BPRR to *inter alia* demolish and remove existing railroad structures, at its sole cost and expense, at the public

crossings at Ramsaytown Road (T-841), Harriger Hollow Road (T-420), and East Bellport Road (T-405), within nine (9) months of the Commission's Order. See PUC Order ¶6.

18. On May 18, 2023, BPRR timely filed a Petition for Review with the Commonwealth Court of Pennsylvania at docket No. 489 CD 2023.

19. On November 16, 2023, the Commonwealth Court granted BPRR's Expedited Application for Stay Pursuant to Pa. R.A.P. 1781 and stayed the PUC's Order pending disposition of BPRR's appeal.

20. On March 1, 2024, the Commonwealth Court entered an Order affirming the PUC's Order and extending the stay of the PUC Order for 120 days.

21. BPRR filed an Application for Reargument with the Commonwealth Court on March 15, 2024, and an Expedited Application for Extension of Stay Pursuant to Pa. R.A.P. 1781 on March 22, 2024.

22. The Commonwealth Court denied BPRR's Application for Reargument by Order dated April 25, 2024.

23. Pursuant to the Commonwealth Court's stay of the PUC Order and subsequent extension of the same, the date for BPRR to complete the work to remove the three railroad crossings was July 1, 2024.

24. On July 5, 2024, BPRR filed a Motion for Extension of Time to comply with time deadlines for completion of work at the three railroad crossings, which the PUC granted on August 1, 2024.

REMOVAL OF RAILROAD CROSSINGS

25. BPRR has proceeded with diligence and without delay since the Commonwealth Court denied its Application for Reargument.

26. BPRR served copies of the plans for the removal of the three railroad crossings on all parties on May 15, 2024.

27. No parties filed exceptions or objections to the plans.

28. The plans were approved by the PUC on June 5, 2024.

29. BPRR's contractor began the process of removing the three crossings as soon as the plans were approved.

30. BPRR was advised that the removal of the Harriger Hollow Road crossing was completed on or about June 14, 2024, and the removal of the East Bellport Road crossing was completed on or about June 21, 2024.

31. The removal of the Ramsaytown Road crossing was on schedule to be completed by the end of June, but on Thursday June 27, 2024, Knox Township requested that work be stopped so that Ramsaytown Road could remain open through the weekend to accommodate traffic for a race being held at Thunder Mountain Speedway.

32. The undersigned advised counsel for Knox Township and the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement that accommodating this request would result in the work not being completed by July 1, 2024, which was understood and agreed to by the parties.

33. Upon resuming the work to complete the removal of the Ramsaytown Road crossing, the contractor encountered a greater amount of subsurface concrete than anticipated, which resulted in the complete removal taking more time.

34. BPRR was advised that the removal of the Ramsaytown Road crossing was completed on Thursday, July 11, 2024.

35. On July 25, 2024, following a field conference in another matter, the crossings were observed by William Sinick, P.E., the PUC's Senior Civil Engineer Manager,

Bureau of Technical Utility Services – Rail Safety, along with Jarrod Hutcheson, BPRR's General Manager, and Aaron M. Ponzio, Esquire, counsel for BPRR.

36. It was determined that the roadway widths at each crossing were not wide enough to satisfy the directives of the PUC's Order, and the embankments required additional work to meet the 2:1 slope specification in the PUC's Order.

37. BPRR immediately contacted its contractor to address the roadway width and slope issues identified on July 25, 2024.

38. On August 5, 2024, the undersigned, PUC representatives, counsel for Knox Township, and BPRR's contractor met and conferred via telephone conference to discuss the work needed to bring the roadway widths and embankments into compliance with the PUC's Order and how to accomplish the same.

39. In addition, two issues were discussed during the telephone conference relating to outstanding work at Ramsaytown Road: (1) there is a residential gas line that is only six inches below the surface on one side of the road, which has to be removed and relocated before any further excavation; and (2) the embankment on one side of the road consists of a significant amount of rock, making excavation more difficult.

40. Over the ensuing days, BPRR's contractor and representatives of Knox Township discussed how to proceed at Ramsaytown Road and reached an agreement to resolve the issues identified above, and to complete the work in a manner compliant with the directives in the PUC's Order.

41. Further, as of the filing of this Motion, BPRR is advised that the work to bring the roadway widths and embankments at Harriger Hollow Road and East Bellport Road into compliance with the PUC's Order has been completed.

REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

42. Based on the foregoing, BPRR and Knox Township request a brief extension of the timeframe to complete each parties' respective scope of work.

43. BPRR requests that its time be extended to September 20, 2024.

44. Knox Township requests that its time be extended to ninety (90) days following the completion of BPRR's work.


45. The parties have at all times acted diligently, in good faith, and in cooperation with each other parties with regard to the removal of the three railroad crossings, and have otherwise complied with the PUC's Order.

46. Reasonable grounds exist to extend the time period for completion of the work in paragraph 6 of the PUC's Order pursuant to Pa. Code §1.15.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner Knox Township and Respondent Buffalo & Pittsburgh Railroad, Inc. respectfully requests that the Commission grant its Second Motion for Extension of Time.
