Dear Mr. Webster:

On March 21, 2023, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission) entered an Order at Docket No. P-2022-3032929 (March Order) that directed that, *inter alia*, if any fixed public utility subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission receives any funding deriving from the federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), the utility shall file a report pursuant to 66 Pa.C.S. § 504 by April 30 of each year indicating the amount and date of the IIJA funding received during the preceding calendar year, and identifying the program(s) for which the funding is associated. The reporting requirement commenced in 2023 and expires on May 1, 2027.

On April 19, 2024, PECO Energy Company (PECO) filed their report in accordance with the March Order. Upon Commission review it appears PECO is in substantial compliance with the March Order.

If you are dissatisfied with the resolution of this matter, you may, as set forth in 52 Pa. Code § 5.44, file a petition with the Commission within twenty (20) days after the date of this letter.
