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COMPLAINT

The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission) is a duly constituted agency of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania empowered to regulate public utilities within the Commonwealth. The Commission has delegated its authority to initiate proceedings which are prosecutory in nature to the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement and other bureaus with enforcement responsibilities. Pursuant to that delegated authority and Section 701 of the Public Utility Code, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement hereby represents as follows:

1. That CPM ENTERPRISES LLC, Respondent, maintains a mailing address AT 4389 Greenwood Drive, Kunkletown, PA 18058.
2. That on February 22, 2023, by Commission Secretarial letter, Respondent was issued a certificate of public convenience by this Commission authorizing transportation, as a common carrier, by motor vehicle, property, excluding household goods in use, between points in Pennsylvania at PUC utility code no. 8925954 at A-2023-3038247.
3. That PA PUC Enforcement Officer John Allen attempted to reach the Respondent and on July 24, 2024 a certified letter was mailed. An attempt was made by the post office to deliver a letter requesting the respondent contact the officer. The certified letter was returned, unclaimed, to the Scranton District office On August 27, 2024.
4. That Respondent, by failing to respond to and achieve a satisfactory evaluation on a safety fitness review, violated 66 Pa §501(c) & §504. The penalty for this violation is cancellation of the certificate held by Respondent with this Commission at utility code 8925954.

WHEREFORE, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement hereby requests that the Commission revoke the certificate of public convenience issued to CPM ENTERPRISES, LLC, at PUC utility code number 8925954.

- C. If you file an Answer, which admits or fails to deny the allegations of the Complaint, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement will request that the Commission issue a Secretarial Letter imposing a penalty.
- D. If you file an Answer which contests the Complaint, the matter will be assigned to an Administrative Law Judge for hearing and decision. The judge is not bound by the optional fine set forth above.
