Formal Complaint of the Indiana Township Police Department alleging unsafe conditions exist due to falling concrete from the existing arch bridge at the public crossing (DOT 051 637 G) where State Route 1015 (Little Deer Creek Road) and Little Deer Creek cross, below grade, the track of Bessemer & Lake Erie Railroad Company located in Indiana Township, Allegheny County.

To Whom It May Concern:

By Secretarial Letter dated December 1, 2023, the Commission approved the alteration, allocation of costs, and assignment of future maintenance responsibilities at the subject crossing.

On September 6, 2024, Bessemer & Lake Erie Railroad Company efiled a notice of completion with the Commission averring that the alteration of the crossing was completed.

A final inspection was arranged by a Commission staff engineer and held on September 23, 2024, where it was determined by the attending parties that all work had been satisfactorily completed.

No party present at the final inspection stated they were seeking any reimbursement for costs it incurred on the project. We have carefully reviewed the record of this proceeding and find that all outstanding matters have been satisfied by the parties.

On September 25, 2024, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (Department) provided a Commission staff engineer a sketch plan via email of the overhead (vertical) clearance measurements taken following the alteration of the crossing. The Department averred that revision of the existing signs associated with the restricted vertical clearance of the crossing was not necessary.

On September 26, 2024, a Commission staff engineer received a letter via email from Indiana Township averring they were satisfied with the completed work and requested the complaint be closed.

The Commission issues this Secretarial Letter in accordance with Section 2702 of the Public Utility Code and finds that since all work has been satisfactorily completed, the record in this proceeding be "CLOSED."

The Parties are reminded that failure to comply with this or any Order or Secretarial Letter in this proceeding may result in an enforcement action seeking civil penalties and/or other sanctions pursuant to 66 Pa. C.S. § 3301.



If your filing contains confidential material, you are required to file by overnight delivery to ensure the timely filing of your submission. There are certain filings that cannot be eFiled, such as filings containing confidential or proprietary material. These must be submitted to the Secretary by overnight delivery, priority, or certified mail to allow tracking of your filing.

If you are dissatisfied with the resolution of this matter, you may, as set forth in 52 Pa. Code §§ 1.31 and 5.44, file a Petition for Reconsideration from Staff Action (Petition) with the Commission within twenty (20) days of the date of this letter. The Petition shall be eFiled with the Secretary of the Commission or sent to: Secretary, PA Public Utility Commission, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, PA 17120, and must be filed within twenty (20) days, or if no timely request is made, the action will be deemed to be a final action of the Commission.

The Petition MUST include: (1) a written statement (divided into numbered paragraphs) outlining the reasons for the request; (2) the case docket number (it is provided for you at the top right-hand corner of this letter); (3) the party on whose behalf the petition is made; (4) a Certificate of Service on the other parties of record; and (5) a Verification with original signature in accordance with 52 Pa. Code § 1.36.
