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MOTION FOR DEFAULT JUDGMENT

NOW COMES the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission’s (“Commission”) Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement (“I&E”), by its prosecuting attorney, and files this Motion for Default Judgment against Blue Ribbon Transit, Inc. (“Respondent”) pursuant to Section 5.103 of the Commission’s regulations, 52 Pa. Code § 5.103. In support thereof, I&E respectfully represents as follows:

1. I&E commenced this action on May 29, 2024, by filing an assessment-related Complaint.

2. The Complaint was served by certified mail to two addresses: 350 E. Main St., New Holland, PA 17557, the address provided by Respondent to the Commission as its main mailing address, and 556 E. Main St., New Holland, PA 17557, a secondary address to which Respondent had mail forwarded.

3. The Complaint alleged that Respondent violated Section 510(b) of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 510(b), by failing to file completed assessment reports for the 2022 and 2023 calendar years.

4. The Complaint also alleged that Respondent violated Section 510(c) of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 510(c), by failing to satisfy its 2022-2023 and 2023-2024

Fiscal Year assessments in that it did not pay the amounts due within thirty (30) days of receipt of each Assessment Invoice.

5. Attached to the Complaint was a Notice advising Respondent that it must file an Answer within twenty (20) days of service of the Complaint.

6. The Notice also advised Respondent that if it failed to answer the Complaint, I&E would request that the Commission issue an Order imposing the penalty set forth in the Complaint.

7. On June 17, 2024, the Complaint mailed to the 350 Main St. address was returned as “insufficient address unable to forward” to the Commission.

8. On June 20, 2024, the Complaint mailed to the 556 Main St. address was returned as “vacant unable to forward” to the Commission.

9. On September 7, 2024, notice of the Complaint was published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, effecting service in accordance with 52 Pa. Code § 1.53(e).¹

10. Included in the publication of the Complaint in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* was a Notice advising Respondent that it must file an Answer within twenty (20) days of service of the Complaint.

11. The Notice also advised Respondent that if it failed to answer the Complaint, I&E would request that the Commission issue an Order imposing the penalty set forth in the Complaint.

12. The twenty (20) days to file an Answer to the Complaint expired on September 30, 2024.

13. Respondent did not file an Answer to the Complaint.

14. Pursuant to Section 5.61(c) of the Commission's regulations, a Respondent who fails to file an Answer to a Complaint within the 20-day response period may be deemed in default, and the relevant facts stated in the Complaint may be deemed admitted. 52 Pa. Code § 5.61(c).

15. The Commonwealth Court has upheld the Commission's authority to sustain complaints that are not answered within twenty days. *See Fusaro v. Pa. Pub. Util. Comm'n*, 382 A.2d 794, 797 (Pa. Cmwlth. 1978).

16. Respondent did not pay the total outstanding assessment balance of \$36.00 for the 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 Fiscal Years or the civil penalty of \$1,700² that was sought in the Complaint for Respondent's failure to pay its 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 Fiscal Year assessments and to report its gross intrastate operating revenues for the 2022 and 2023 calendar years.

17. I&E respectfully requests that the Commission enter a Default Order against Respondent that:

- a. Directs Respondent to pay a total of \$1,792.00, which consists of its outstanding assessment of \$592.00 and the requested civil penalty of \$1,200.00 within thirty (30) days of the entry date of the Commission's Order;
- b. Directs the Bureau of Technical Utility Services to cancel Respondent's Certificate of Public Convenience at A-2018-3005930 if Respondent fails to pay the total set forth in subparagraph (a), above, within thirty (30) days of the entry date of the Commission's Order;

² This civil penalty is based on a review of Respondent's history of compliance with the Public Utility Code and Commission regulations and orders for three years prior to the date that I&E filed its Complaint in this matter, the need to deter future violations, the amount of Respondent's outstanding assessment balance for the 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 Fiscal Years, and prior Commission decisions in similar situations pursuant to 52 Pa. Code §§ 69.1201(c)(6), (8), and (9).

- c. Notifies Respondent that a copy of this Order will be sent to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation for the suspension or revocation of vehicle registrations that were used under Respondent's operating authority if Respondent fails to pay the total set forth in subparagraph (a), above, within thirty (30) days of the entry date of the Commission's Order; and
- d. Directs the Bureau of Administration, Assessment Section, to refer the matter to the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General for collection of the total set forth in subparagraph (a), above, if Respondent fails to pay that total within thirty (30) days of the entry date of the Commission's Order.


