**ORDER**  
**GRANTING CONTINUANCE**

On February 16, 2024, Ryan Flynn (“Mr. Flynn”) filed a Formal Complaint against the Pennsylvania American Water Company - Wastewater (“PAWC”) with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission”). In his Complaint, Mr. Flynn complained of incorrect billing in relation to a mobile home park that he owns. The Complaint was served on PAWC on March 12, 2024.

On April 1, 2024, PAWC filed an Answer to the Complaint, admitting or denying the allegations of the Complaint.

On June 24, 2024, the Commission issued a Hearing Notice scheduling this case for an evidentiary hearing on August 6, 2024. The hearing was cancelled after Michael A. Gruin, Esquire, representing PAWC in this proceeding, asked via email for the hearing to be continued for approximately 60 days so the Parties could continue their settlement discussions. This informal continuance request was granted, and the August 6, 2024, hearing was cancelled and rescheduled for October 8, 2024.

On October 1, 2024, the Parties asked for further postponement of the case, so they could continue their settlement discussions. This informal continuance request was granted, and the October 8, 2024, hearing was cancelled and rescheduled for December 3, 2024.

On November 20, 2024, Lawrence J. Rosen, Esquire, entered his Notice of Appearance on behalf of Mr. Flynn.

On the same date, Mr. Flynn filed a Petition for Issuance of Subpoenas (“Petition”). In his Petition, Mr. Flynn sought the issuance of subpoenas for four individuals.

Pursuant to the Commission’s regulations, a party, person or individual objecting to an application for a subpoena may do so within 10 days of service. 52 Pa. Code § 5.421(f). The Commission’s regulations further provide that the administrative law judge will address any objection 10 days of the assignment of any objection. *Id.*

On November 27, 2024, Mr. Flynn filed a Motion for Continuance (“Motion”). In the Motion, Mr. Flynn requests a continuance of the hearing of at least 60 days. Mr. Flynn indicates that the reason for the Motion was to provide additional time for the Petition to be addressed and to allow Mr. Flynn to gather additional information concerning the case. Further, Mr. Flynn represents that PAWC does not oppose the Motion.

The Commission’s regulations provide that continuances will be considered only upon “good cause” shown. 52 Pa. Code § 1.15(b). Given that the Petition was not filed in a time significantly in advance of the hearing to be addressed prior to the hearing, I find that good cause exists to grant the Motion. Further, it has also been considered that PAWC did not object to the Motion.

For the above reasons, Mr. Flynn’s Motion will be granted in the Ordering paragraphs below.
