3. PPL Electric Utilities wishes to replace two existing poles in Danville Borough, Montour County, PA to support existing and future loading conditions. Aerial cables that cross North Shore Railroad Company track within the public right of way of Wall Street are to be raised to meet clearance requirements. The above ground facilities to be replaced are PPL poles numbered 31631N28863 and 31640N28870.

4. The proposed construction will be the replacement of two existing utility poles on the northeastern side of the railroad crossing. The facility will be aerial. Wall Street intersects the railroad at grade. See attached Exhibit "A". The proposed completion date for this project is March 6, 2025.

5. The public utilities, municipalities, corporations and property owners concerned in, or affected by, the crossing alteration are identified in Exhibit "B" attached hereto

6. The expected cost for the construction procedure is \$20,000. PPL Electric Utilities will pay all costs of construction or alteration of the facility, as well as be responsible for installing, maintaining and inspecting the facilities.

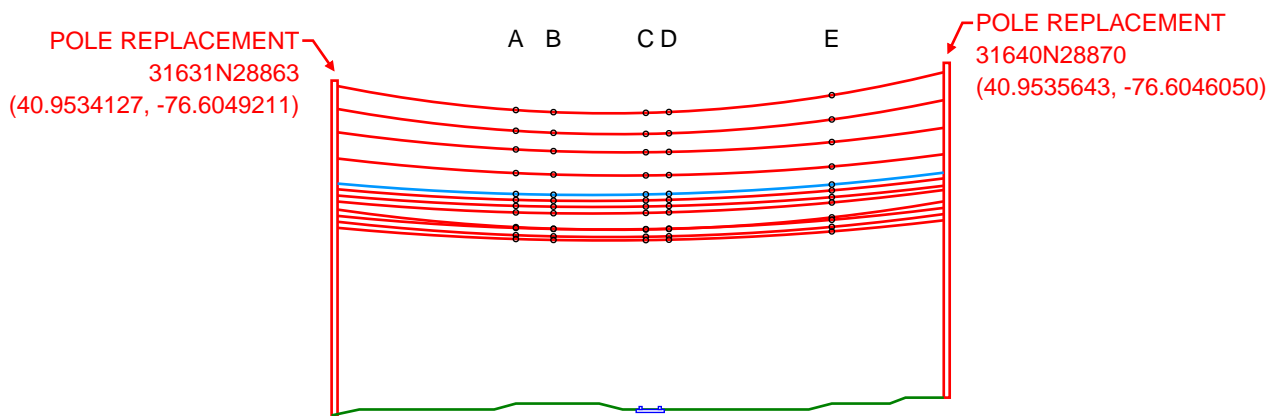
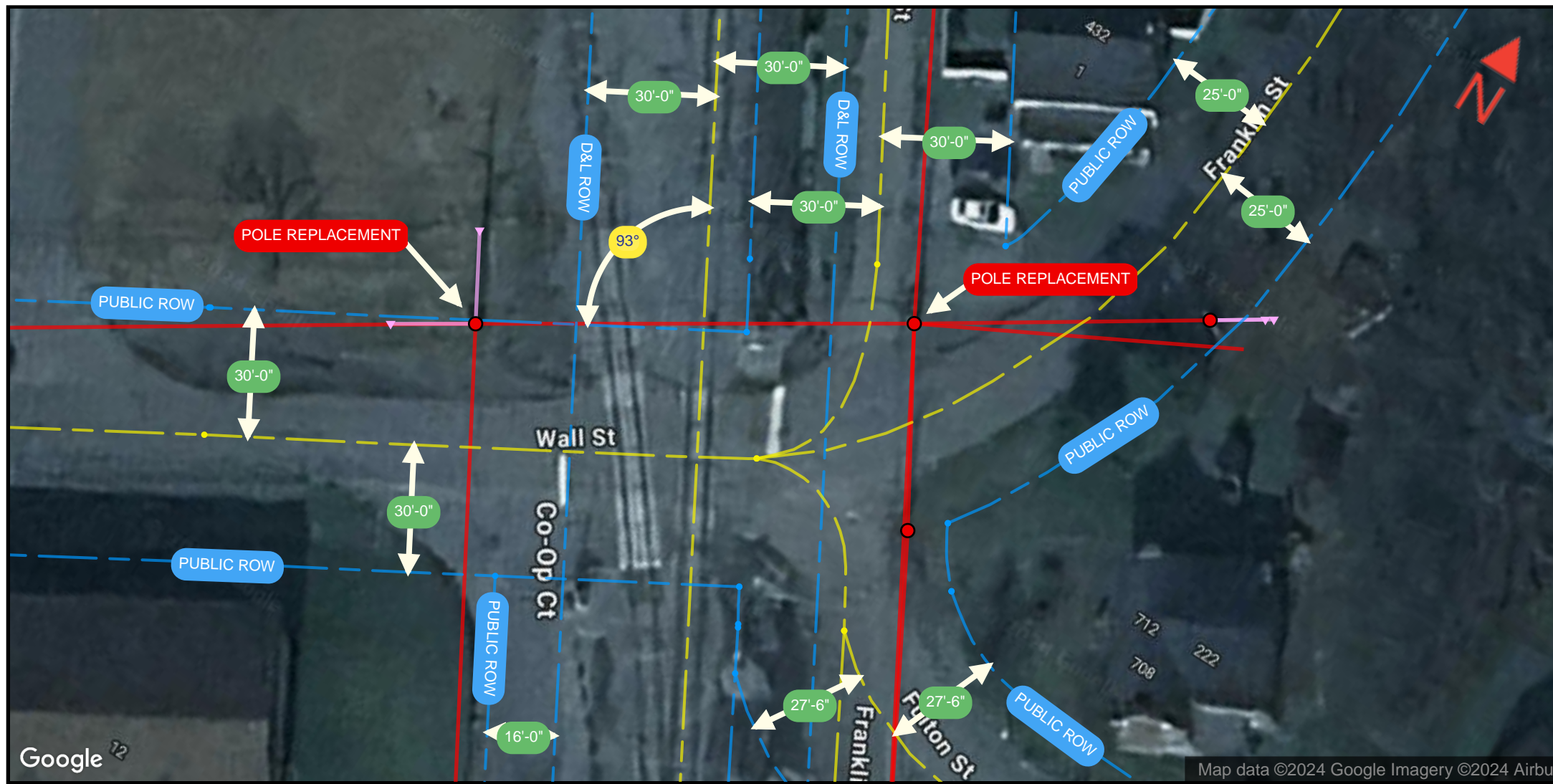

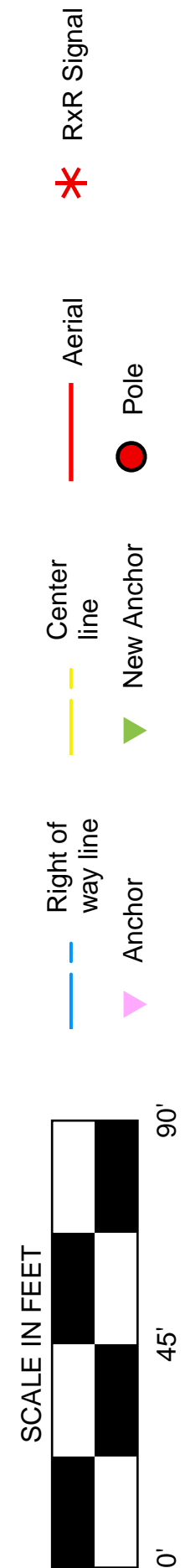
