Dear Ms. Savage:

By Order entered November 21, 2024, the Commission authorized FirstEnergy Pennsylvania Electric Company (FirstEnergy or the Company) to file the pro forma tariff supplement contained in Appendix "A" to the Joint Petition For Approval of Settlement Stipulation in the above-docketed rate investigation, designed to produce \$225 million in additional annual base rate operating revenue, consistent with the Order. On December 5, 2024, the Company filed Supplement No. 14 to Electric - Pa. P.U.C. No. 1 to become effective January 1, 2025, in compliance with the Order.

Commission Staff has reviewed the tariff revisions and found that suspension or further investigation does not appear warranted at this time. Therefore, in accordance with 52 Pa. Code Chapter 53, Supplement No. 14 to Electric - Pa. P.U.C. No. 1 is effective by operation of law as of the effective date contained on each page of the supplement. However, this is without prejudice to any formal complaints timely filed against said tariff revisions.

Also by Order entered November 21, 2024, the Commission directed a refund to FirstEnergy customers of \$13.6 million through a one-time bill credit on customer counts due to certain costs from prior distribution base rate cases that were improperly classified, misallocated, or lacked proper supporting documentation. The Commission directed FirstEnergy to file with its Bureau of Technical Utility Services a list, on or before thirty (30) days after Order entry, detailing by rate class how much in dollars will be refunded to each rate class as a result of the regulatory liability refund. On December 5, 2024, the Company filed information showing the credit to be paid for each rate class. According to the Company, the credits will be paid over the January 2025 billing cycle on a bills-



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rendered basis and will be reflected on each bill as a separate line item labeled, “Refund for Non-eligible costs.”

Commission Staff has reviewed the list and found that the \$13.6 million refund to customers detailed by rate class is in compliance with the Order, and acceptance and approval is warranted.
