COMPLAINT

The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission) is a duly constituted agency of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania empowered to regulate public utilities within the Commonwealth. The Commission has delegated its authority to initiate proceedings which are prosecutory in nature to the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement and other bureaus with enforcement responsibilities. Pursuant to that delegated authority and Section 701 of the Public Utility Code, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement hereby represents as follows:

1. That KENNETH R HIGH, T/A KENNETH HIGH TRUCKING, Respondent, maintains its principal place of business at 99 Creek Rd, Newville, Pa 17241.

2. That Respondent was issued a Certificate of Public Convenience by this Commission on September 16, 2015, at A-2015-2491600, authorizing Respondent to transport, as a motor common carrier, property, excluding household goods in use, between points in Pennsylvania for compensation, at PUC No. 8917832.

3. The on May 11, 2017, Respondent filed for and received a discontinuance of authority/certificate at A-2017-2603573.

4. That on October 18, 2024, PUC Officer Jeremy Smith was conducting inspections at Fort Littleton Turnpike Interchange at Rt 522, Dublin Township, Fulton County. A Driver/Vehicle Compliance Report (DVCR) was completed indicating a 2020 Ford Truck, PA registration number ZJS3003, transporting building materials from Newville, PA to McConnellsburg, PA for compensation being operated by Kenneth Ray High.

5. That at the time of the inspection, Kenneth Ray High indicated he should have authority, unless he accidentally discontinued authority. A review of PUC documents reveals the lack of authority/certificate as indicated on the DVCR.

6. That Respondent, by transporting property between points in Pennsylvania for compensation while not possessing the authority/certificate to do so has violated 66 Pa.C.S. § 1101, 66 Pa.C.S. § 3310. The penalty for this violation is \$200.

WHEREFORE, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement hereby requests that the Commission fine the Respondent, KENNETH HIGH TRUCKING, LLC, the penalty of two hundred dollars (\$200) for the illegal activity described in this Complaint and order such other remedy as the Commission may deem to be appropriate.

- A. You must file an Answer within twenty (20) days of the date of service of this Complaint. The date of service is the mailing date as indicated at the top of the Secretarial Cover Letter for this Complaint and Notice, 52 Pa. Code §1.56(a). An Answer is a written explanation of circumstances wished to be considered in determining the outcome. The Answer shall raise all factual and legal arguments that you wish to claim in your defense and must include the reference number of this Complaint. Your Answer must be verified, and the original **shall be mailed to:**

- B. If you fail to answer this complaint within twenty (20) days, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement will request that the Commission issue a Secretarial Letter imposing a penalty. The penalty could include a fine, the suspension or revocation of your certificate of public convenience or other remedy.
- C. You may elect not to contest this complaint by paying the fine proposed in this Complaint by certified check or money order. Payment must be made to the **Commonwealth of Pennsylvania** and should be forwarded to:

- D. Your payment is an admission that you committed the alleged violation and an agreement to cease and desist from further violations. Upon receipt of your payment, the complaint proceedings shall be closed.
- E. If you file an Answer, which admits or fails to deny the allegations of the Complaint, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement will request that the Commission issue a Secretarial Letter imposing a penalty.

- F. If you file an Answer which contests the Complaint, the matter will be assigned to an Administrative Law Judge for hearing and decision. The judge is not bound by the optional fine set forth above.
