2025 Operating Plan and Budget

Mr. Costlow, Ms. Sanders, and Mr. DeStefon presented the 2025 Operating Plan and Budget.

Mr. Costlow presented the new direction of the organization, changes to operations and culture, and the development of a zero-based budget. Starting in 2025 the organization will focus on more holistic programs centered around regenerative and circular energy. Additionally, the organization will redirect its efforts from energy conservation and energy efficiency, which have become commonplace to increasing the knowledge of passion of sustainable energy. And values-based energy utilization. The organization culture will transition from mechanistic to holistic and regenerative. The budgeted loss for 2025 is \$367,618. Mr. Costlow noted that the budget will likely need revisions in June due to changes to Federal and State incentives for energy conservation, energy efficiency, and renewable energy.

Mr. DeStefon presented information on investments and development to meet the organization's revenue needs. The development of revenue is a combination of grants, sponsorships, program related investments, program services, such as C-PACE, and investment portfolio income. The organization will continue to work with NEIF to originate and service smaller commercial and consumer loans for energy efficiency and renewable energy. The revenue target is \$1.3 million.

Ms. Sanders presented information on outreach and education initiatives. These initiatives include the Sustainable Energy Science Fair for middle school and high school students, expansion of the Energy Service Provider Network and growth of the Energy Service Provider Experience, and increasing awareness of and knowledge of regenerative energy among energy services providers and the public in general. The estimated costs for educational and outreach efforts for 2025 is \$263,000.


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
