**Please find attached Freight Pa. P.U.C. No. 12, effective March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025 (this tariff cancels Freight Pa. P.U.C. No. 11), for Canterbury International, Incorporated t/d/b/a Two Men and A Truck (PA PUC Certificate #A-00121505), 3555 Valley Drive, Pittsburgh PA 15234.**

Changes to this tariff are an **INCREASE** in local hourly rates (both Non-Peak Season and Peak Season) for all time periods. Weekday rates in Column 3 were **CHANGED** to Monday-Thursday rates and rates for Friday moves were combined with the Saturday rates in Column 4. Column 2 still contains the rates for Sundays & Holidays.

SECTION 1  
RULES & REGULATIONS

ITEM 20 - GOVERNING PUBLICATIONS

For rates, rules, regulations, and provisions applicable to the transportation of household goods, in use, except as otherwise provided herein, see Tariff Freight PA. P. U. C. No. 53 (Carrier Directory), loose-leaf revisions thereto and successive issues thereof, issued by Tristate Household Goods Tariff Conference, Inc., Agent.

ITEM 20 - DECLARED VALUE

Rates and charges named herein are applicable when value declared by shipper does not exceed sixty (60) cents per pound, per article. For method of determining rates when value declared exceeds sixty (60) cents per pound, per article, see provisions of Governing Tariff.

ITEM 30 - CLASSIFICATION OF PROPERTY

Class 1 shipments are personal effects and property used or to be used in a dwelling when a part of the equipment or supply of such dwelling and such other similar property; except that this subparagraph shall not be construed to include property moving from a factory or store, except such property as the householder has purchased with the intent to use in his dwelling and which is transported at the request of, and the transportation charges paid to the carrier by the householder.

NOTE 1 - Traveling charges (Column 1) are in addition to hourly rates (Columns 2, 3, and 4).

NOTE 2 - Hourly rates (Columns 2, 3, and 4) are based on the day or days, or period of days, as indicated during which services are performed,

NOTE 3 - Hourly rates (Columns 2, 3, and 4) computed in quarter-hour periods; fractions of one-quarter hour considered one-quarter hour.

NOTE 4 - When a holiday falls on a weekday or Saturday, the rates named in Columns 1 and 2 shall be applicable.

NOTE 5 - Applicable travel charge will be determined based on the distance from the carrier's terminal to either the origin or destination of shipment, whichever is furthest.

MILES		Travel Time

0	10	One (1) hour
10	15	One and one-half (1.5) hours
15	20	Two (2) hours
20	40	Three (3) hours

For distances exceeding 40 miles, the additional travel charge will be computed at one half (.5) hour per each additional 15 miles.

NOTE 6 - Minimum total transportation charges: Sundays and Holidays (any hour): four (4) hours at rates named in Column 2 plus applicable travel charge and fuel surcharge. Monday-Friday (any hour): three (3) hours at rates named in Column 3 plus applicable travel charge and fuel surcharge.

Saturdays (any hour): four (4) hours at rates named in Column 4 plus applicable travel charge and fuel surcharge.
