Results of Request for Proposal – Alternative Energy Credits January 2025

Dear Mr. Castanaro:

On January 29, 2025, PPL Electric Utilities Corp. (PPL) filed the results of its Request for Proposals (RFP) process and rules (January 2025 AEC Solicitation), to obtain Alternative Energy Credits (AEC) for compliance with Pennsylvania's Alternative Energy Portfolio Standards Act. This filing included bid results for the eighth of eight scheduled semi-annual solicitations to obtain AECs for the period beginning June 1, 2021, through May 31, 2025.


The January 2025 AEC Solicitation filing was submitted in accordance with the RFP Process and Rules filed by PPL on September 17, 2020, as part of a Joint Petition for Partial Settlement. The RFP Process and Rules were approved as modified by the Partial Settlement in the Commission's Opinion and Order, entered December 17, 2020, at Docket P-2020-3019356.

The January 2025 AEC Solicitation sought procurement of 29,200 Solar Photovoltaic AECs, 446,200 Tier I AECs, and 584,000 Tier II AECs with a vintage period beginning June 1, 2023, through May 31, 2025. PPL requests that the Commission approve the bid results for the January 2024 AEC Solicitation by close of business on January 30, 2025.

Further investigation does not appear to be warranted at this time, since the results of the January 2025 AEC Solicitation appear to have been conducted in accordance with the RFP Process and Rules as approved by the Commission. Therefore, we direct PPL to disclose the results of this January 2025 AEC Solicitation in accordance with the Commission's Secretarial Letter in Re: Disclosure of Default Service Solicitation Results and Creation of a Default Service Rate Calculation Model, issued October 12, 2010, at Docket No. M-2009-2082042.
