**ORDER**

**BY THE COMMISSION:**

On January 14, 2025, Pike County Light & Power Company (Pike), Utility Code 110650, filed Supplement No. 105 to Tariff Electric Pa. P.U.C. No. 8 to become effective March 15, 2025, containing proposed changes in rates, rules, and regulations calculated to produce \$1,874,600 (11.6%) in additional annual revenues, an increase in residential customer's bills using 674 kWh from \$134.29 to \$149.81/month (11.6%).

On January 24, 2025, the Office of Consumer Advocate and the Office of Small Business Advocate filed Formal Complaints. Various oppositions were also filed.

Pike stated that it has been operating under electric rates that went into effect on July 28, 2021 and the requested increase in its base rates is necessary due to significant capital investments to improve its infrastructure and increase reliability, and to modernize its electrical system in order to better serve its customers.

Pursuant to 66 Pa. C.S. §1308(d), the filing will be suspended by operation of law until October 15, 2025, unless permitted by Commission Order to become effective at an earlier date.

Investigation and analysis of this proposed tariff filing and the supporting data indicate that the proposed changes in rates, rules, and regulations may be unlawful, unjust, unreasonable, and contrary to the public interest. It also appears that consideration should be given to the reasonableness of Pike's existing rates, rules, and regulations; **THEREFORE,**

**IT IS ORDERED:**

1. That an investigation on Commission motion be, and hereby is, instituted to determine the lawfulness, justness, and reasonableness of the rates, rules, and regulations contained in the proposed Supplement No. 105 to Tariff Electric Pa. P.U.C. No. 8.

2. That the proposed Supplement No. 105 to Tariff Electric Pa. P.U.C. No. 8 is suspended by operation of law until October 15, 2025, unless otherwise directed by Order of the Commission.

3. That pursuant to 52 Pa. Code §53.71 tariff supplements shall be filed with the Commission and posted at the company to announce that the aforementioned Original Tariff is suspended until the date stated in the Commission Order. Attached is a sample

copy of a suspension supplement which shall be filed in triplicate or, if applicable, e-filed with the Commission within 10 days following the Order entry date.

4. That this investigation shall include consideration of the lawfulness, justness, and reasonableness of the Pike County Light & Power Company's existing rates, rules, and regulations.

5. That the case be assigned to the Office of Administrative Law Judge for the prompt scheduling of such hearings as may be necessary culminating in the issuance of a Recommended Decision.

6. That a copy of this Order shall be served upon Pike County Light & Power Company, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement, the Office of Consumer Advocate, the Office of Small Business Advocate, and any persons who have filed Formal Complaints against the proposed tariff supplement.
