Enclosed for filing is the executed **CONFIDENTIAL** Amendment Number Seven (“Amendment 7”) to the Conservation Service Provider (“CSP”) Contract between PPL Electric Utilities Corporation (“PPL Electric” or the “Company”) and the CSP selected to implement the Non-Residential Program under the Company’s Phase IV Energy Efficiency and Conservation (“EE&C”) Plan.

On April 15, 2021, PPL Electric filed the Non-Residential CSP Contract with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) with the documentation required under the Commission’s *Phase IV Implementation Order*.¹ On May 6, 2021, Commission staff approved the Non-Residential CSP Contract. On February 23, 2024, Commission staff approved Amendment Numbers 1, 2, and 3 to the Non-Residential CSP Contract. On April 1, 2024, PPL Electric filed Amendment 4 to the Non-Residential CSP Contract. On May 29, 2024, PPL Electric filed Amendment 5 to the Non-Residential CSP Contract. On January 23, 2025, PPL Electric filed Amendment 6 to the Non-Residential CSP Contract. On March 11, 2025, Commission staff approved Amendment 6 to the Non-Residential CSP Contract.

The purpose of the enclosed **CONFIDENTIAL** Amendment 7 is to, among other things, amend the Scope of Work’s compensation provisions.
