**I. INTRODUCTION**

1. Pennsylvania-American Water Company (“PAWC”, “Company”, or “Applicant”) hereby respectfully requests that the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) issue a Certificate of Public Convenience evidencing its approval under Section 1102(a)(1)(i) of the Public Utility Code, of PAWC’s right to offer, render, furnish of and supply water service in additional portions of West Mahanoy Township, Schuylkill County, Gilberton Boro, Schuylkill County, Ryan Township, Schuylkill County and New Castle Township, Schuylkill County, Pennsylvania, *Nunc Pro Tunc*.

**II. DESCRIPTION OF THE APPLICANT**

4. PAWC is a public utility corporation organized and existing under the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and is a wholly owned subsidiary of the American Water Works Company, Inc. PAWC furnishes water service in a certificated service territory encompassing portions of 37 counties and 418 municipalities across the Commonwealth. As of January 31, 2025, PAWC furnished water service to 688,148 residential, commercial, industrial, municipal, fire and bulk customers in Pennsylvania. The total number of customers by class are as follows:

5. In addition, Pennsylvania-American furnishes wastewater service to approximately 115,119 customers as of January 31, 2025, the total number of wastewater customers by class are as follows:

6. Attached hereto as **Exhibit A** is pertinent information with respect to the corporate history, authority, and service territory of PAWC.

### **III. PROPOSED SERVICE TERRITORY**

7. During a recent review of its certificated service territory, PAWC discovered that it does not have a certificate of public convenience for existing facilities located in New Castle Township, Schuylkill County, West Mahanoy Township, Schuylkill County, Gilberton Boro, Schuylkill County and Ryan Township, Schuylkill County, Pennsylvania that either abut or are near other PAWC certificated service areas.

8. The proposed service territory for which the Company is seeking a Certificate of Public Convenience consists of approximately 301 acres and the boundaries of the four service locations are identified in the attached map at **Exhibit B-1** (the “Applied for Service Territory”). Also attached hereto is **Exhibit B-2**, the metes and bounds for the Applied for Service Territory.

9. PAWC is already certificated to serve several portions of West Mahanoy Township and the adjacent New Castle Township and the City of Frackville. Please see relevant information below, and relevant Orders and Certificates of Public Convenience attached at **Exhibit C:**<sup>1</sup>

10. The Applied for Service Territory serves a total of 81 connections. This total consists of 60 Residential customers, 10 Commercial customers, 1 Private Fire Service Customer, 1 Other Public Authority (Schuylkill County Fire School), 9 Public Fire Hydrants. The signed Public Fire Hydrant Applications for the aforementioned public hydrants are attached as **Exhibit D**.

11. No additional mains or facilities or permits, easements or rights-of-way are required to continue providing water service in the Applied for Service Territory.

12. Operations for this Applied for Service Territory will continue through the Company's Center Street Water Treatment Plant ("WTP") and a system interconnection with Schuylkill County Municipal Authority ("SCMA Interconnection"). The Center Street WTP obtains raw water from four wells in Schuylkill County. The SCMA Interconnection obtains finished water from SCMA. The Center Street WTP, which was constructed around 1992, serves Frackville Borough and surrounding municipalities. The SCMA Interconnection, which was constructed around 1996, serves portions of the Township West Mahanoy. Areas 1 & 2 in the attached map at **Exhibit B-1** are part of the Frackville water system and are supplied by the Center Street WTP. Area 3 is partially supplied by the Frackville water system and the SCMA Interconnection. Area 4 serves a power plant (Gilberton Power) and is only supplied by SCMA Interconnection.

13. As indicated above, the Applied for Service Territory consists of four separate areas totaling approximately 301 acres as set forth herein on the attached **Exhibit B-1**.

14. Attached as **Exhibit E** are letters that have been sent to Schuylkill County, West Mahanoy Township Planning Commission, Gilberton Boro Planning Commission, Ryan Township Planning Commission and New Castle Planning Commission requesting verification that this Application complies with applicable county/township comprehensive plans. As of this writing, PAWC has sent multiple letters to these municipalities but has not received a response. Recently, the Company has sent additional letters requesting this information. Because PAWC did not receive a response, Bruce Brubaker, PAWC, Sr. Project Engineer, has reviewed the

comprehensive plans of West Mahanoy Township and New Castle Township and confirmed that PAWC's Application is consistent with these plans.

15. The Commission has deemed PAWC to be financially and technically fit, as reflected in documents on file with the Commission.

16. It is in the public interest for Pennsylvania-American to continue providing water service in the proposed Applied for Service Territory because the Company is financially and technically capable of continuing to provide said service, and there is a need to continue to make water service available to the existing customers. These customers will continue to be served by a large, financially-sound company that has the capability to finance necessary capital additions. Given its size, access to capital and its recognized strengths in system planning, capital budgeting and construction management, PAWC is well-positioned to ensure that high quality water service meeting federal and state requirements will continue to be provided to these customers and maintained for PAWC's existing customers. The customers will continue to benefit from enhanced customer service in several areas, such as, but not limited to, additional bill payment options, extended customer service and call center hours, customer information and education programs, and PAWC's customer assistance program.

17. Applicant has been providing water service in the geographic proximity of these customers and PAWC's existing water certificated service territory continues to create opportunities for functional and operational consolidation, and associated efficiencies and cost savings.

18. To the best of the Applicant's knowledge, no corporation, partnership,

or individual is currently furnishing or has corporate or franchise rights to furnish service similarly in the proposed Applied for Service Territory, thus, no competitive condition will be created.

19. Applicant has been providing water service to the Applied for Service Territory under the Rules and Regulations of PAWC's approved tariff.

#### IV. FINANCIAL AND OTHER RELEVANT INFORMATION

20. There is attached hereto, as Exhibit F, PAWC's balance sheet as of December 31, 2024.

21. There is attached hereto, as Exhibit G, PAWC's statement of income and retained earnings for the 12 months ending December 31, 2024.

22. PAWC will continue to charge its then existing Rate Zone 1 rates for service in the Applied for Service Territory as set forth in its Tariff. Current Rate Zone 1 rates are shown on Exhibit H and may be changed from time to time.

23. The estimated annual revenues and expenses of PAWC in the Applied for Service Territory are set forth in Exhibit I attached hereto.

24. PAWC furnishing service in the Applied for Service Territory will have no adverse effect upon the service furnished or the rates charged to its existing customers.

**WHEREFORE**, Pennsylvania-American Water Company respectfully requests that the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, for the foregoing reasons, approve this application and grant it a Certificate of Public Convenience *Nunc Pro Tunc* to provide water service in an additional portion of West Mahanoy Township, Schuylkill County, Gilberton Boro, Schuylkill County, Ryan Township, Schuylkill County and New Castle Township, Schuylkill County, Pennsylvania as aforesaid.

## PENNSYLVANIA-AMERICAN WATER COMPANY

Pennsylvania-American Water Company, an investor-owned water company, with corporate offices at 852 Wesley Drive, Mechanicsburg, is a subsidiary of American Water Works Company, Inc. On February 1, 1989, the then-existing Pennsylvania-American Water Company (the result of the January 1, 1987 merger of Riverton Consolidated Water Company with and into Keystone Water Company) was merged with and into Western Pennsylvania Water Company, and the name of the surviving corporation was changed to Pennsylvania-American Water Company. A brief summary of each of the three predecessor companies follows.

Riverton Consolidated Water Company was formed by the merger and consolidation of six operating water companies in 1904. It subsequently acquired seven additional systems, and at the time of its merger with Keystone, supplied water to 12 municipalities on the Harrisburg west shore, Cumberland County, and Fairview Township in York County.

Keystone Water Company resulted from the 1973 merger of 14 companies with and into White Deer Mountain Water Company. The Company later acquired four systems. It provided water service in 14 eastern Pennsylvania counties through the following distribution systems: Abington, Bangor, Berwick, Frackville, Hallstead, Hershey/Palmyra, Montrose, Moshannon Valley, Norristown, Northumberland, Susquehanna, Thompson, White Deer (Milton), and Yardley.

Western Pennsylvania Water Company was the product of the merger of 16 water companies with and into South Pittsburgh Water Company at various times from 1970 to 1973. WPW added seven water distribution systems, extending its service territory into portions of 12 western Pennsylvania counties. The company operated through the following district offices: Butler, Clarion, Connellsville, Ellwood, Indiana, Kane, Kittanning, McDonald, Mon Valley, New Castle, Pittsburgh, Punxsutawney, Uniontown, Warren, and Washington.

After the merger of Riverton and Keystone in 1987, the former Pennsylvania-American Water Company purchased five systems: Red Land Water Company in York County, Campbelltown Water Company in Lebanon County, and three systems in the Moshannon Valley area, Clearfield County - Woodland-Bigler Area Authority, Allport Water Authority, and Graham Water Association.

Since the merger of the former Pennsylvania-American Water Company (Riverton and Keystone) into Western Pennsylvania Water Company on February 1, 1989, the Company has acquired the following water and wastewater systems: Smith Township Municipal Authority system (Washington County, February 27, 1989); Abington Township system (Lackawanna County, August 5, 1989); Summit Township Municipal Authority system (Butler County, August 31, 1993); Skyline Water Company (Dauphin County, December 2, 1993); Gregg Township Municipal Authority system (Union County, April 25, 1994); P-F Area Water Association system (Washington County, October 1, 1994); Country Place Water Company, Inc. and Country Place Waste Treatment Company, Inc. (Monroe County, June 30, 1995); Hickory Water Company, Pocono Farms East Water Company, Inc., and Silver Water Company (Monroe and Pike Counties, December 21, 1995); the water utility assets of Pennsylvania Gas and










Pennsylvania-American Water Company




Pennsylvania-American Water Company

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


Pennsylvania-American Water Company
