

3. Evidence of minimum of 2 years experience with a licensed household goods carrier or the equivalent? I worked for Kinetic Movers based out of York, PA. Attached is a recommendation letter from the owner, Karsten.

4. Describe your facilities, record maintenance plan and your communication network. I run Reliance Moving Solutions out of my home, where I've set up a dedicated office space. This is where I handle all business communications, scheduling, and administrative tasks. I have a computer, printer, and phone line set up, and I use this space to manage everything day-to-day.

For recordkeeping, I use Smart Moving, a CRM system that helps me stay organized with all move details, customer information, and scheduling. I also use Pro Mover Accounting to handle our finances, track income and expenses, and generate reports for taxes. These tools help me keep everything in one place and make sure I'm following PUC requirements and staying on top of general business records.

I store our moving supplies and one leased truck at Extra Space Storage in York, PA. That unit holds things like blankets, straps, boxes, and equipment when not in use. We don't currently offer storage for customer belongings, so we're not storing household goods currently.

Our truck is equipped with an ELD (electronic logging device) through Motive, which helps me monitor hours of service and track activity in real time.

Customers can reach us by phone or through our website to request service. Once a move is booked, I use Smart Moving to schedule the job and assign it to the crew. I stay in touch with drivers through phone and the Motive app to coordinate everything on moving day. This setup keeps us connected and helps make sure every job runs smoothly from start to finish.

5. Number of drivers I intend to use or hire and why that number is appropriate for the size of the territory I will be serving? Reliance Moving Solutions is based in Spring Grove, PA, and we

plan to serve a 100-mile radius, covering areas like York, Harrisburg, Lancaster, Gettysburg, and parts of Maryland. Since there's a steady demand for moving services in this region, we plan to have 3-4 drivers to start, with the goal of growing to 5-6 as our business expands. This number will allow us to handle multiple moves each week while still providing great service and meeting customer needs. With summer approaching and the possibility of getting PUC Authority, we expect more jobs to come in, so expanding our team will help us keep up with demand.

A. **Driver Hiring Standards:** Reliance Moving Solutions believes in giving individuals opportunities to grow in the moving industry while ensuring they are qualified, professional, and responsible.

Our hiring standards include:

- ✓ A valid and active standard driver's license (CDL not required).
- ✓ A DOT physical meeting the required fitness-to-drive standards.
- ✓ The ability to demonstrate responsible and safe driving habits while operating company vehicles.
- ✓ Strong customer service skills and a professional attitude.
- ✓ The physical ability to lift and transport heavy furniture safely.

B. **Criminal Background Check:** At Reliance Moving Solutions, we believe in fair hiring practices while still making sure we're keeping our customers and team members safe. We're a second-chance company, which means we look at each applicant's background on a case-by-case basis instead of making blanket hiring decisions. When reviewing someone's history, we consider what the offense was, how long ago it happened, and whether they've shown signs of turning their life around. Our goal is to hire people who are professional, responsible, and committed to doing the job right.

Here's how our background check process works:

- ✓ We run PA PATCH criminal background checks on all potential hires.
- ✓ Each applicant's history is reviewed individually, so we can make fair and thoughtful decisions.
- ✓ However, we have strict hiring exclusions, which include:
 - Any offenses involving unlawful killing.
 - Any offenses, no matter how big or small, committed against a minor child.
- ✓ We also conduct sex offender registry screenings to help ensure customer safety.

C. **Driver Training Program:** Reliance Moving Solutions Driver Training Program makes sure all employees meet industry standards for safe and efficient moving services

Our training includes:

- ✓ We verify that all drivers have a valid license appropriate for operating a 26-foot truck.
- ✓ Drivers must complete a current DOT physical to meet medical fitness standards.
- ✓ We provide hands-on training to teach proper lifting techniques, how to secure loads correctly, and how to use moving equipment safely.
- ✓ Drivers are trained to handle customer belongings with care to minimize damage claims.

- ✓ We emphasize professionalism, communication, and customer interactions to provide top-quality service.

D. **System for Conducting Driver License Checks:** At Reliance Moving Solutions, we implement a structured system to verify and monitor driver licenses to ensure compliance with state and federal requirements.

Our process includes the following:

- ✓ We verify that each driver holds a valid driver's license appropriate for operating our 26-foot non-CDL truck.
- ✓ We conduct a Motor Vehicle Record check through PennDOT prior to hire to review the applicant's driving history.
- ✓ We perform annual MVR checks to monitor for any violations, suspensions, or other safety concerns.
- ✓ We require all drivers to maintain a valid DOT medical certificate as our vehicle exceeds 10,000 lbs GVWR.
- ✓ Drivers must provide updated license as they are renewed.
- ✓ Any driver with a suspended or revoked license is immediately removed from driving duties.
- ✓ Drivers with serious violations are reviewed and may be disqualified based on safety and company policy.

E. **Drivers Alcohol and Drug Use Policy:** At Reliance Moving Solutions, we take safety seriously and have a zero-tolerance policy when it comes to drug and alcohol use. Our goal is to protect both our team and our customers.

Our policy includes:

- ✓ If a driver is involved in a workplace injury or accident, we'll require a post-accident drug test.
- ✓ We'll also do reasonable suspicion testing if there's a clear reason to believe someone might be under the influence, like unusual behavior or the smell of drugs or alcohol.
- ✓ If a driver has multiple incidents of damage or ongoing performance issues, we may require a test to help figure out what's going on.
- ✓ Anyone found to be under the influence while on the job will be immediately let go.

6. Number of vehicles I plan to use and why that number is appropriate to provide service to the territory I will be serving? Reliance Moving Solutions currently operates with one leased truck. As business continues to grow and demand picks up, especially with the busy season coming and the hope of getting approved for PUC Authority, we plan to expand our fleet to 2-3 trucks. This will help us continue providing timely, efficient service across the 100-mile radius we serve from Spring Grove, PA, including places like York, Harrisburg, Lancaster, Gettysburg, and parts of Maryland. Having more trucks will allow us to handle multiple jobs each week while keeping our service quality high. Growing our fleet will allow us to meet growing demands while maintaining reliability and efficiency.

7. Periodic vehicle maintenance plan? At Reliance Moving Solutions, we follow a routine maintenance schedule to keep our 2021 26-foot HINO truck in safe and reliable condition. Our goal is to catch potential issues early, minimize breakdowns, and ensure the truck is always ready for work.

Our maintenance plan includes:

- **Daily Pre-Trip Inspections:**
Each day before use, the driver performs a walk-around inspection that includes checking tires, brakes, lights, mirrors, fluid levels, horn, and any visible damage or leaks. Any issues are reported immediately, and the truck is not used until they're addressed.
- **Oil and Filter Changes:**
Oil and filter are changed every 5,000–7,000 miles or whatever Enterprises recommendation is. I lease the truck so Enterprise is responsible for the oil, filter, and any damages or pre-check violations we may come across.
- **Brake Inspections:**
Brakes are inspected every 3 months or sooner if there are any signs of issues. Pads, rotors, and brake lines are all checked for wear or damage. Enterprise is in charge of this.
- **Annual Safety Inspection:**
The vehicle undergoes the required annual PA safety inspection at a licensed inspection station to stay compliant with 67 PA Code, Chapter 175. Our vehicle is leased and Enterprise upholds the correct standards to ensure the truck is compliant with 67 PA Code, Chapter 175.
- **Recordkeeping:**
All inspections, maintenance, and repairs are logged and kept on file. This includes receipts, work orders, and notes on any issues found or resolved as of the date I am applying for the PUC. Enterprise will keep a long of all vehicle maintenance history during leasing term, which can be provided if necessary.

This schedule helps us stay ahead of potential problems and ensures that our vehicle remains compliant, safe, and dependable always.

8. Steps taken to determine I can obtain insurance and pay the required insurance premium? To figure out whether I could get the required insurance and afford the premiums, I reached out to my current commercial insurance provider, Progressive. I went over the coverage levels needed for PUC authority, like liability and cargo insurance, and confirmed that they can provide everything I need. I also reviewed the estimated premium costs and compared them with my company's current cash flow. After looking at the numbers, I'm confident that I can cover the insurance costs using the revenue from my day-to-day operations. Taking these steps helped me confirm that I can both get and maintain the proper insurance to operate under PUC authority.

9. Felony? Yes, I have been convicted of a felony, along with other charges in the past. I take full responsibility for my past and have worked hard to turn my life around. Over the years, I've focused on personal growth, building a better future, and becoming someone my family and community can be proud of.

I'm currently building my own moving company, Reliance Moving Solutions, with a mission centered around professionalism, second chances, and doing things the right way. I've also stayed active in my community — I coach a youth baseball team and surround myself with people who support positive change.

I've included several recommendation letters with this application, including one from my parole officer, the owner of another moving company (Kinetic Movers), the instructor of the Moving Army training program (Austin Yarborough), the youth baseball league I coach for, and others who've seen the work I've put in firsthand. I've also completed a threat-level assessment with the State of PA that supports my ability to operate responsibly.

I'm asking for the opportunity to continue moving forward — not just for myself, but for the business I'm building and the people I hope to employ and inspire.

Purpose for Assessment: Mr. Arthur Robinson was referred for a Threat of Harm Assessment (5329) evaluation based on the requirements of Act 112: Section 5329. The purpose is to determine if Mr. Robinson poses a threat of harm to his child, Amiyah Howard age 7, and whether Mr. Robinson requires any further clinical treatment to address issues that may affect his ability to effectively care for his daughter.

Assessment Procedure:

X Clinical Interview: Childhood History, Academic History, Adult History, Adult Relationship History, Employment History, Legal History, Substance abuse History, Mental Health History, Treatment History, Medical History and Prescription Medication History.

Substance Abuse Subtle Screening Inventory (SASSI-4): is a psychological questionnaire designed to screen individuals for substance dependence and substance abuse. The SASSI-4 is currently used by many diverse types of organizations including addictions treatment centers, criminal justice programs, hospitals, other healthcare organizations, and employee assistance programs.

X Personality Assessment Inventory (PAI): Is a self-administered, objective test of personality and psychopathology designed to provide information on critical client variables in professional settings. Background Information

Childhood History

Born and Raised – **B:** York, PA **R:** Hanover, PA

Family of Origin History – Parents separated when Arthur was 5 years old; From ages 5-13, he was raised by his Maternal Aunt. She got custody of Arthur as a result of his biological mother beating him with a belt that his aunt had witnessed. At the age of 13, Arthur returned home to his mother; she worked two jobs, Arthur said he had no supervision. He was a straight A student and plays several sports. He began to “slack off” in school and began to get into some trouble. At the age of 15, his mother could not “handle Arthur” and he moved to York, PA, to his biological father’s residence for one year and then moved back with his Maternal Aunt and Uncle. He lived with them until he graduated high school in 2011.

Arthur has a biological brother Tyler Robinson who is 28 years old and a biological sister Ciarra who is 25 years old. Arthur said his relationship with his siblings is positive. Arthur's relationship with his parents has improved as he has gotten older.

Academic History

Arthur made A's and B's from elementary through middle school; he was in learning support classes for Reading during this time. He attended Hanover HS for 9th grade, William Penn HS from 10-11th grade, and graduated from Southwest HS in 2011. During his high school years Arthur said he made failing grades because of hanging out with a "wrong crowd" of peers. He attended summer school after 11th grade and passed his classes. His senior year was placed in an inclusive classroom with other students and did well, he graduated in January of 2011 and finished with a 2.9 GPA.

Relationship History

Arthur met Ms. Brooke Howard in the latter part of 2013 and began dating in 2014. They were together until April 2015. They have a child together, a daughter Amiyah who is 7 years old. Arthur described his relationship with Brooke as "toxic and bad." He said, "we were bad for each other, I was in the wrong crowd, and she followed me into it. I wanted to get out but she wanted to continue doing what we did, we were both into drugs also at that time."

In 2015 or 2016, Arthur was arrested for terroristic threat directed at Brooke as a result of Brooke threatening to take their daughter from him. Brooke filed a 2 year PFA against Arthur that he violated. After his release from prison, he and Brooke hooked up, she dropped the PFA in 2018. Arthur said he as seeing other women and Brooke found out he was introducing his daughter to these women, which upset Brooke. Since then, he has only been able to see his daughter when Brooke gave permission, the visits had to be supervised by Brooke. Current visitation is on Fridays at Brooke's house, Arthur said he last saw his daughter in November 2022.

Currently, Arthur has been in a 3-year relationship with Kianna Bell. They have a one-year son, Azarel Robinson and they are expecting another son in August 2023. Arthur said he has known Kianna since middle school. He said over the years she became friends with his younger sister. As a result, he and Kianna started hanging out and began to date.

Arthur does have another child from a previous relationship, her name is Sophia age 12.

Criminal History

Arthur first arrest was in 2013 for Manufacture, Delivery, or Possession with Intent to Manufacture or Deliver drugs and his last arrest was in 2020, for Manufacturing/Distribution of Designer Drug. He has been arrested eight times from 2013-2020. The court docket information is listed with the offenses he was arrested and offenses he was found guilty for.

According to Arthur his probation will be completed sometime in 2025.

Employment

Arthur's employment history is scarce. He had worked for Kinsely Construction laying gas pipe. He left after 8 months and then was working for Reliance Moving Solutions, LLC in August 2023.

Substance Use History:

Alcohol History: He first used alcohol at age 18. He said he would rarely drink alcohol 1-2 times per year. When he would drink, he would consume 3 mixed drinks. He said he last drank alcohol when he was released from prison on November 3, 2022.

Cocaine: first used at age 21, used for about one year until age 21 or 22.

Interview with: Brooke Howard – I initially sent Brooke on June 17, 2023, a list of 8 questions for her to answer. Questions 1 and 2 were personal information and Questions 3-8 were regarding her relationship with Arthur Robinson. They were to be returned to me by June 24, 2023. I did not receive her responses, so after talking with Arthur Robinson in December 2023, I sent Brooke another email with the questions attached on December 17, 2023, and still did not get any response from her.

I have attached copies of the text message from June 17, 2023, that I sent to Brooke and her response to me on June 22, 2023 and my response to her question on June 22, 2023. I also sent a copy of the emails I sent to her on June 17, 2023 and on December 17, 2023, along with the questions that I sent to Brooke on June 17, 2023 and again on December 17, 2023.

Test Results

Personality Assessment Inventory (PAI)

The PAI provides a number of validity indices that are designed to provide an assessment of factors that could distort the results of testing. Such factors could include failure to complete test items properly, carelessness, reading difficulties, confusion, exaggeration, malingering, or defensiveness. For this protocol, the number of uncompleted items is within acceptable limits. Mr. Robinson attended appropriately and responded consistently to the content of test items. Mr. Robinson's scores on these scales suggest that he did attend to item content in responding to PAI items however, there appears to have been some inconsistent responses to similar items.

With respect to positive impression management, there is no evidence to suggest that Mr. Robinson was generally motivated to portray himself as being relatively free of common shortcomings or minor faults. With respect to negative impression management, there are subtle suggestions that Mr. Robinson attempted to portray himself in a negative or pathological manner in particular areas.

The PAI clinical profile reveals no marked elevations that should be considered to indicate the presence of clinical psychopathology.

Mr. Robinson reports that drug use may be the source of some problems in his life. These problems may include strained interpersonal relationships, vocational and/or legal problems, and use of drugs to manage stress.

According to Mr. Robinson's self-report, he describes no significant problems in the following areas: unusual thoughts or peculiar experiences; problems with empathy; undue suspiciousness or hostility; extreme moodiness and impulsivity; unhappiness and depression; unusually elevated mood or heightened activity; marked anxiety; problematic behaviors used to manage anxiety; difficulties with health or physical functioning.

Mr. Robinson's self-concept appears to involve a reasonably stable and positive self-evaluation that, as is the case with most individuals, may be occasionally punctuated by periods of self-doubt or pessimism. He describes approaching life with a clear sense of purpose and distinct convictions, with a well-articulated sense of who he is and what his goals are.

Mr. Robinson's interpersonal style seems best characterized as pragmatic and independent. He may tend to view relationships as a means to an end, rather than as a source of satisfaction. He is not likely to be perceived by others as a warm and friendly person, although he is not necessarily lacking in social skills and he can be reasonably effective in social interactions. Those who know him well are likely to see him as being shrewd, competitive, and self-confident.

With respect to anger management, Mr. Robinson describes his temper as within the normal range, and as fairly well-controlled without apparent difficulty.

With respect to suicidal ideation, Mr. Robinson is not reporting distress from thoughts of self-harm.

Clinical Impression

Based on current information from Mr. Robinson he is employed and is in a steady relationship that sounds healthier than his relationship with Ms. Howard. He and Ms. Bell are expecting their second child in August 2023, and Mr. Robinson is employed full-time. There is no evidence of any illicit drug use since 2020 and based on his most recent substance abuse assessment through TrueNorth, he did not need any further substance abuse treatment.


Mr. Robinson had not (as of March 2023) seen his daughter Amiyah since November 2022. As the research supports, it is important for a child’s psychological development to have equal time with both of their parents, this has not been the case. Given the length of time since both Mr. Robinson and his daughter have spent time together, if he is granted visitation, the visitation should be set up on a time frame that allows for a period of transition to gradually increase time spent together and when to introduce Amiyah to Ms. Bell and her half-siblings. I would recommend family therapy for Mr. Robinson and his daughter and to have the family therapist, based on her observations of their interactions, set up the visitation schedule and determine the appropriate visitation transition periods and time frame to introduce Amiyah to Ms. Bell and Amiyah’s half siblings.

At this time, based on my professional judgement and to the best of my professional knowledge, I do not feel that Mr. Robinson poses a threat of harm to his daughter, Amiyah Howard.

Clinical Recommendations:

- 1) Continue to abstain from using any illicit drugs
- 2) Continue to follow the requirements of his probation.
- 3) Attend family therapy with his daughter Amiyah



Background Information

Childhood History

Born and Raised – **B:** York, PA **R:** Hanover, PA

Family of Origin History – Parents separated when Arthur was 5 years old; From ages 5-13, he was raised by his Maternal Aunt. She got custody of Arthur as a result of his biological mother beating him with a belt that his aunt had witnessed. At the age of 13, Arthur returned home to his mother; she worked two jobs, Arthur said he had no supervision. He was a straight A student and plays several sports. He began to “slack off” in school and began to get into some trouble. At the age of 15, his mother could not “handle Arthur” and he moved to York, PA, to his biological father’s residence for one year and then moved back with his Maternal Aunt and Uncle. He lived with them until he graduated high school in 2011.

Arthur has a biological brother Tyler Robinson who is 28 years old and a biological sister Ciarra who is 25 years old. Arthur said his relationship with his siblings is positive. Arthur's relationship with his parents has improved as he has gotten older.

Academic History

Arthur made A's and B's from elementary through middle school; he was in learning support classes for Reading during this time. He attended Hanover HS for 9th grade, William Penn HS from 10-11th grade, and graduated from Southwest HS in 2011. During his high school years Arthur said he made failing grades because of hanging out with a "wrong crowd" of peers. He attended summer school after 11th grade and passed his classes. His senior year was placed in an inclusive classroom with other students and did well, he graduated in January of 2011 and finished with a 2.9 GPA.

Relationship History

Arthur met Ms. Brooke Howard in the latter part of 2013 and began dating in 2014. They were together until April 2015. They have a child together, a daughter Amiyah who is 7 years old. Arthur described his relationship with Brooke as "toxic and bad." He said, "we were bad for each other, I was in the wrong crowd, and she followed me into it. I wanted to get out but she wanted to continue doing what we did, we were both into drugs also at that time."

In 2015 or 2016, Arthur was arrested for terroristic threat directed at Brooke as a result of Brooke threatening to take their daughter from him. Brooke filed a 2 year PFA against Arthur that he violated. After his release from prison, he and Brooke hooked up, she dropped the PFA in 2018. Arthur said he as seeing other women and Brooke found out he was introducing his daughter to these women, which upset Brooke. Since then, he has only been able to see his daughter when Brooke gave permission, the visits had to be supervised by Brooke. Current visitation is on Fridays at Brooke's house, Arthur said he last saw his daughter in November 2022.

Currently, Arthur has been in a 3-year relationship with Kianna Bell. They have a one-year son, Azarel Robinson and they are expecting another son in August 2023. Arthur said he has known Kianna since middle school. He said over the years she became friends with his younger sister. As a result, he and Kianna started hanging out and began to date.

Arthur does have another child from a previous relationship, her name is Sophia age 12.

Criminal History

Arthur first arrest was in 2013 for Manufacture, Delivery, or Possession with Intent to Manufacture or Deliver drugs and his last arrest was in 2020, for Manufacturing/Distribution of Designer Drug. He has been arrested eight times from 2013-2020. The court docket information is listed with the offenses he was arrested and offenses he was found guilty for.

According to Arthur his probation will be completed sometime in 2025.

Employment

Arthur's employment history is scarce. He had worked for Kinsely Construction laying gas pipe. He left after 8 months and then was working for Reliance Moving Solutions, LLC in August 2023.

Substance Use History:

Alcohol History: He first used alcohol at age 18. He said he would rarely drink alcohol 1-2 times per year. When he would drink, he would consume 3 mixed drinks. He said he last drank alcohol when he was released from prison on November 3, 2022.

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The PAI provides a number of validity indices that are designed to provide an assessment of factors that could distort the results of testing. Such factors could include failure to complete test items properly, carelessness, reading difficulties, confusion, exaggeration, malingering, or defensiveness. For this protocol, the number of uncompleted items is within acceptable limits. Mr. Robinson attended appropriately and responded consistently to the content of test items. Mr. Robinson's scores on these scales suggest that he did attend to item content in responding to PAI items however, there appears to have been some inconsistent responses to similar items.

With respect to positive impression management, there is no evidence to suggest that Mr. Robinson was generally motivated to portray himself as being relatively free of common shortcomings or minor faults. With respect to negative impression management, there are subtle suggestions that Mr. Robinson attempted to portray himself in a negative or pathological manner in particular areas.

The PAI clinical profile reveals no marked elevations that should be considered to indicate the presence of clinical psychopathology.

Mr. Robinson reports that drug use may be the source of some problems in his life. These problems may include strained interpersonal relationships, vocational and/or legal problems, and use of drugs to manage stress.

According to Mr. Robinson's self-report, he describes no significant problems in the following areas: unusual thoughts or peculiar experiences; problems with empathy; undue suspiciousness or hostility; extreme moodiness and impulsivity; unhappiness and depression; unusually elevated mood or heightened activity; marked anxiety; problematic behaviors used to manage anxiety; difficulties with health or physical functioning.

Mr. Robinson's self-concept appears to involve a reasonably stable and positive self-evaluation that, as is the case with most individuals, may be occasionally punctuated by periods of self-doubt or pessimism. He describes approaching life with a clear sense of purpose and distinct convictions, with a well-articulated sense of who he is and what his goals are.

Mr. Robinson's interpersonal style seems best characterized as pragmatic and independent. He may tend to view relationships as a means to an end, rather than as a source of satisfaction. He is not likely to be perceived by others as a warm and friendly person, although he is not necessarily lacking in social skills and he can be reasonably effective in social interactions. Those who know him well are likely to see him as being shrewd, competitive, and self-confident.

With respect to anger management, Mr. Robinson describes his temper as within the normal range, and as fairly well-controlled without apparent difficulty.

With respect to suicidal ideation, Mr. Robinson is not reporting distress from thoughts of self-harm.

Clinical Impression

Based on current information from Mr. Robinson he is employed and is in a steady relationship that sounds healthier than his relationship with Ms. Howard. He and Ms. Bell are expecting their second child in August 2023, and Mr. Robinson is employed full-time. There is no evidence of any illicit drug use since 2020 and based on his most recent substance abuse assessment through TrueNorth, he did not need any further substance abuse treatment.

Mr. Robinson had not (as of March 2023) seen his daughter Amiyah since November 2022. As the research supports, it is important for a child’s psychological development to have equal time with both of their parents, this has not been the case. Given the length of time since both Mr. Robinson and his daughter have spent time together, if he is granted visitation, the visitation should be set up on a time frame that allows for a period of transition to gradually increase time spent together and when to introduce Amiyah to Ms. Bell and her half-siblings. I would recommend family therapy for Mr. Robinson and his daughter and to have the family therapist, based on her observations of their interactions, set up the visitation schedule and determine the appropriate visitation transition periods and time frame to introduce Amiyah to Ms. Bell and Amiyah’s half siblings.

At this time, based on my professional judgement and to the best of my professional knowledge, I do not feel that Mr. Robinson poses a threat of harm to his daughter, Amiyah Howard.

Clinical Recommendations:

- 1) Continue to abstain from using any illicit drugs
- 2) Continue to follow the requirements of his probation.
- 3) Attend family therapy with his daughter Amiyah
