**NOTICE OF APPEAL TO THE COMMONWEALTH COURT
OF PENNSYLVANIA**

Dear Prothonotary Krimmel:

This is my Notice of Appeal regarding the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission's April 10, 2025, Opinion and Order in the case of Pamela Scott v. Duquesne Light Company, PAPUC Docket No. C-2018-3004042, regarding forced smart meter installation as a condition of electric service. I suffer greatly from electromagnetic hypersensitivity syndrome (EHS), and rapidly become debilitated when I am within 28 feet of a Duquesne Light AMI mesh smart meter. I still have a solidly benign analog meter on my house and have been fighting Duquesne Light and the PAPUC since 2018 to keep it that way.

As I have been unsuccessful in finding information on the Commonwealth Court's website or googling as to how to most properly file this Notice of Appeal, and have thus far been unsuccessful in getting through to a clerk at the very busy Prothonotary's Office, I hope that this letter will suffice as a Notice of Appeal. My understanding is that I should now wait for the Commonwealth Court to snailmail instructions as to how to properly file my Petition for Review, including how to pay the filing fee(s).

I hope that the Commonwealth Court will see the merits of my case, and grant me the opportunity to file a Brief. My case and arguments differ from the consolidated cases that resulted in the Commonwealth Court's October 8, 2020, "Povacz I" decision that was subsequently overturned by the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania's August 16, 2022, "Povacz II" ruling.

These are particulars of the case that I wish to appeal:

The PAPUC's Opinion and Order ruling of April 10, 2025 is:

*"Based upon our review of the record and the applicable law, we shall: (1) deny the Complainant's Exceptions; (2) deny the Complainant's Petition to Reopen; (3) adopt the Initial Decision of ALJ Watson; and (4) dismiss the Complaint, with prejudice, consistent with this Opinion and Order; **THEREFORE,***

"IT IS ORDERED:

"1. That the Exceptions filed by Pamela R. Scott, on November 15, 2024, at Docket No. C-2018-3004042, are denied, consistent with this Opinion and Order.

"2. That the Petition to Reopen the Proceeding for the Purpose of Taking Additional Evidence, filed by Pamela R. Scott, on December 3, 2024, at Docket No. C-2018-3004042, is denied, consistent with this Opinion and Order.

"3. That the Initial Decision of Administrative Law Judge Jeffrey A. Watson, issued on October 29, 2024, at Docket No. C-2018-3004042, is adopted, consistent with this Opinion and Order.

"4. That the Formal Complaint filed on August 16, 2018, by Pamela R. Scott against Duquesne Light Company, at Docket No. C-2018-3004042, is dismissed, with prejudice.

"5. That this proceeding at Docket No. C-2018-3004042, be marked closed.
