MAY 6 AND 7, 2025**

To PGW Customers:

Philadelphia Gas Works (PGW) filed a request with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (PUC) to change your gas base rates as of November 28, 2025. The base rates are part of the Distribution Charge on your bill. This notice describes the Company's request, the PUC's role, what actions you can take, and the dates and times of the Public Input Hearings.

**The Amount of the Requested Base Rate Change**

PGW has requested an overall base rate increase of \$105 million. The table below shows how each type of heating customer's average bill would be affected, if the PUC approves the Company's entire rate request.
