Dear Parties:

On July 7, 2025, Pronto Plumbing & Draining, Inc. d/b/a Pronto Plumbing Heating Air Drains (Pronto) filed a motion for an extension of time in which to file a response to BIE’s Formal Complaint. In its motion, Pronto makes several imprecise averments and presumptions relating to the service and dates of service of the Formal Complaint in this matter.¹ Based upon those averments and presumptions, Pronto is requesting an extension to July 28, 2025, to file its response to the complaint.

The June 27, 2025 Secretarial Letter accompanying the Formal Complaint, along with the complaint, was served on Pronto via certified mail on June 30, 2025. Because the complaint was served on Pronto on June 30, 2025, Pronto would have 20 days from that date in which to file its response. However, 20 days from June 30, 2025, is July 20, 2025, which is a Sunday. Consequently, the original due date for Pronto’s response is Monday, July 21, 2025.²


Nevertheless, because BIE does not object to the extension requested by Pronto, Pronto’s request for an extension to July 28, 2025, is granted.

² “Except as otherwise provided by statute, in computing a period of time prescribed or allowed by this title or by statute, the day of the act, event or default after which the designated period of time begins to run is not included. The last day of the period is included, unless it is Saturday, Sunday or a legal holiday in this Commonwealth, in which event the period shall run until the end of the next day which is neither a Saturday, Sunday or holiday. A part-day holiday shall be considered as a holiday. Intermediate Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays shall be included in the computation.” 52 Pa. Code § 1.12(a).

Pronto's Answer and any other responsive pleadings are due to be filed with the Commission by the close of business (4:30 p.m. EST) on July 28, 2025.
