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**UNOPPOSED AND EXPEDITED MOTION BY THE JOINT SOLAR PARTIES FOR  
ADDITIONAL TIME TO REPLY TO  
EXCEPTIONS ON THE  
RECOMMENDED DECISION ISSUED ON JUNE 30, 2025**

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Pursuant to Sections 1.15 and 5.103 of the Pennsylvania public Utility Commission’s rules and regulations, 52 Pa. Code § 1.15, 5.103, the American Home Contractors, Inc. (“AHC”), Enphase Energy, Inc. (“Enphase”), the Solar Energy Industries Association (“SEIA”), SolarEdge Technologies, Inc. (“SolarEdge”), Sun Directed, Tesla, Inc. (“Tesla”), and Trinity Solar, LLC (“Trinity Solar”) (collectively, the “Joint Solar Parties,” “JSPs”), hereby file this Unopposed and Expedited Motion to extend the deadline for replies to exceptions on the Recommended Decision issued by the Commission in the above-captioned matter on June 30, 2025 by an additional three (3) calendar days.

In support of this Expedited Motion, the JSPs state:

1. On June 30, 2025, Secretary Matthew L. Homsher issued a copy of the Recommended Decision of the Office of Administrative Law Judge.
2. Simultaneously, Secretary Homsher issued a Secretary Letter establishing a deadline of fifteen (15) days from the date of the letter (or until July 15, 2025) for the filing of

Exceptions; and a deadline of seven (7) days of the date when Exceptions were due (or until July 22, 2025) for the filing of Replies to Exceptions.

3. Both the deadline for the Exceptions and for the Replies set by the Commission were abbreviated, as Pa. Code 52 §§ 5.533 and 5.535 provide deadlines of twenty (20) and ten (10) days, respectively, for each, unless otherwise ordered by the Commission.
4. PPL Electric Utilities Corporation (“PPL”) and the Joint Solar Parties filed Exceptions.
5. The Sustainable Energy Fund (“SEF”), the Office of the Small Business Advocate (“OSBA”), and the Office of Consumer Affairs (“OCA”) filed letters informing the Commission that they would not be filing exceptions. The PP&L Industrial Customer Alliance (“PPLICA”) did not file exceptions.
6. The Joint Solar Parties respectfully request an extension of time for all parties to file their replies to exceptions – from Tuesday, July 22<sup>nd</sup> to Friday, July 25<sup>th</sup>.
7. Certain key personnel who are relevant to the preparation of robust Replies have plans to be out of their respective offices which were booked when the date triggering the briefing schedule (the issuance of the Recommended Decision) was not able to be predicted.
8. The proposed extension of three (3) calendar days would comport with the timeframe otherwise provided for in the regulations.
9. No party (neither PPL, OCA, OSBA, SEF or PPLICA) objects to the proposal.

WHEREFORE, the Joint Solar Parties respectfully request that the Unopposed and Expedited Motion for an Extension be granted.
