MOTION TO CHANGE HEARING TO TELEPHONIC

TO ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE ALPHONSO ARNOLD III:

Now comes the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission’s (“Commission”) Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement (“I&E”), by its prosecuting attorney, and files this Motion to Change Hearing to Telephonic (“Motion”) pursuant to Section 5.103 of the Commission’s regulations, 52 Pa. Code § 5.103. In support thereof, I&E respectfully represents as follows:

1. I&E commenced this action on May 2, 2025, by filing a Formal Complaint.
2. The Formal Complaint alleged that Respondent violated the Public Utility Code, in that Respondent transported persons by motor vehicle between points in the Commonwealth in exchange for compensation without a certificate of public convenience, failed to equip a taxi with a meter, failed to post tariffs in its taxi, failed to furnish records or papers to the Commission, and hired a disqualified driver.
3. The Formal Complaint seeks a \$15,100 civil penalty.
4. Respondent filed an Answer on May 16, 2025, denying any violations.
5. On June 2, 2025, an Initial In-Person Hearing Notice was issued, scheduling a hearing **in-person** in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on July 29, 2025, at 10:00 am.
6. In the presentation of its case, I&E intends to call as its witness Motor Carrier Enforcement Officer Elliott Miller.

7. Officer Miller is located in Scranton and works out of the Motor Carrier Division's Scranton field office.
8. Respondent is located in Wilkes-Barre and, if it plans to be represented at the hearing, would also need to travel to Philadelphia.¹
9. Undersigned counsel is located in Harrisburg and based out of the Commission's Harrisburg office.
10. An in-person hearing would require travel from Scranton to Philadelphia of approximately 2 hours and 30 minutes one way and approximately 5 hours round trip.
11. An in-person hearing would require travel from Wilkes-Barre to Philadelphia of approximately 2 hours and 30 minutes one way and approximately 5 hours round trip.
12. An in-person hearing would require travel from Harrisburg to Philadelphia of approximately 2 hours and 30 minutes one way and approximately 5 hours round trip.
13. An in-person hearing would result in additional expenses to be incurred by the Commonwealth for the undersigned counsel as well as Officer Miller for travel expenses, lodging, and meals.
14. Holding the July 29, 2025, hearing in-person in Philadelphia would require at a least a full day for travel and conducting the hearing for undersigned counsel and Officer Miller, as well as for Respondent.
15. In contrast, holding the hearing telephonically would require no more than one to two hours of Commission staff time and no travel expenses.

¹ As a corporation, Respondent is required to be represented by counsel, pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 1.22. *See Spirit of the Avenger Ministries v. Commonwealth*, 767 A.2d 1130 (Pa. Cmwlth. 2001) ("It is well settled that, with a few exceptions not applicable here, non-attorneys may not represent parties before the Pennsylvania courts and most administrative [sic] agencies.") (citing cases).

16. In light of the burden placed on both parties, I&E respectfully requests that the July 29, 2025, hearing be re-designated as a telephonic hearing for the convenience of the parties, the witnesses, and in the name of conserving the Commission's resources and staff time.

17. I&E sought Respondent's concurrence for this Motion, but as of the date of this Motion, Respondent has not provided any response to I&E.

18. Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 5.483(a), a presiding officer has the authority to regulate the course of the proceeding.

WHEREFORE, I&E respectfully requests that the presiding officer grant I&E's Motion to Change Hearing to Telephonic or, alternatively, to permit Officer Miller to testify telephonically at the July 29, 2025, hearing.
