PREHEARING ORDER

Concerning the Request of Jeremy Hargrove
For an
Interim Emergency Order

Pursuant to 52 Pa.Code § 3.4 and the filing of a request for Interim Emergency relief by Jeremy Hargrove on July 21, 2025, an expedited telephonic hearing, pursuant to that request, is scheduled for Tuesday, July 29, 2025, beginning at 9:00 a.m. from the Commission’s Hearing Room, Piatt Place, Suite 220, 301 Fifth Avenue, Pittsburgh, PA 15222.

THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED:

1. That requests for a change of the scheduled hearing date will not be granted absent agreement of all parties and where good cause exists. 52 Pa.Code § 1.15(b). Requests for a change of hearing date must be submitted in writing and be sent to me and all parties of record. My email address is kdunderdal@pa.gov and my mailing address is:

2. That the parties to this proceeding are Jeremy Hargrove and FirstEnergy Pennsylvania Electric Company.

3. **That the parties shall review the Commission's Rules of Administrative Practice and Procedure at 52 Pa.Code §§ 3-1-3.11 regarding emergency relief.**

4. That the parties shall provide a listing of proposed witnesses, the subject matter of each witness' testimony, and the proposed length of direct testimony for each witness on or before **12:00 p.m. (noon) on Monday, July 28, 2025**. If the parties provide me with an electronic copy of their prehearing memorandum, it is not necessary to also provide a hard copy.

5. That the parties shall stipulate to any matters they reasonably can in order to expedite this proceeding, lessen the burden of time and expenses in litigation on all parties and conserve precious administrative hearing resources. 52 Pa.Code §§ 5.232 and 5.234.

6. That if a party intends to present any documents or exhibits for consideration, that party must supply one copy to the presiding officer and one for each party listed on the attached service list, by email, provided the documents or exhibits are received by **12:00 p.m. (noon) on Monday, July 28, 2025**.

7. That the hearing in this matter constitutes a formal legal proceeding and will be conducted in accordance with the Commission's Rules of Administrative Practice and Procedure, as well as the rules of evidence as applied to administrative hearings.

8. That pursuant to 52 Pa.Code §§ 1.21 & 1.22, you may represent yourself, if you are an individual, or you may have an attorney licensed to practice law in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, or admitted *Pro Hac Vice*, represent you. However, if you are a partnership, corporation, trust, association, or governmental agency or subdivision, you must have an attorney licensed to practice law in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, or admitted *Pro Hac Vice*, represent you in this proceeding. Unless you are an attorney, you may not

represent someone else. Attorneys shall enter their appearance in accordance with the provisions of 52 Pa.Code § 1.24(b).

9. That the parties shall conduct discovery pursuant to 52 Pa.Code §§ 5.321–5.373. The parties are encouraged to cooperate and exchange information on an informal basis. The Commission and the presiding officer prefer that the parties cooperate, rather than engage in numerous or protracted discovery disagreements that require the presiding officer to participate to resolve. All motions to compel shall contain a certification by counsel setting forth the informal discovery undertaken and their efforts to resolve their discovery disputes informally. There are limitations on discovery and sanctions for abuse of the discovery process. 52 Pa.Code §§ 5.361, 5.371–5.372.

10. THAT IF A PARTY FAILS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE HEARING, THE HEARING WILL PROCEED WITHOUT THAT PARTY AND A DECISION MAY BE ENTERED AGAINST THAT PARTY.

11. That the parties must be prepared to offer evidence on the issues raised by Jeremy Hargrove in his request for Emergency Relief and in compliance with 52 Pa.Code §§ 3-1–3.11.
