Dear Secretary Homsher:

Pursuant to 66 Pa.C.S. §2101 et. seq., Duquesne Light Company (“Duquesne Light” or “Company”) filed for approval the confidential Affiliate Services Agreement (“ASA”) between The Efficient Network (“TEN”) and the Company on July 8, 2025. The subject agreement concerns selecting a professional energy consultant to provide customer-facing consulting services, technical guidance, engineering support, etc. to inform, develop, and execute new customer projects involving edge of the grid technologies (i.e., solar, battery storage, EV, etc.). The consultant would work directly with the customer on DLC's behalf and would also potentially arrange various types of financing structures to support these customer projects. In seeking this type of consultation, eight service providers were invited to participate. Of those eight, four submitted a formal bid. Two providers gave final presentations and after evaluation TEN was selected as the prevailing bidder.

The agreement is designed to be used on an ad-hoc basis, and a specific scope of work would be generated and signed for each project as needed. No such scopes of work exist yet. Please find attached the general scope of work included in the procurement solicitation.



Background and Objectives

Current Program Overview
