PREHEARING ORDER FOR TELEPHONE HEARING

An evidentiary hearing is scheduled in this matter for **November 5, 2025, at 10:00 a.m.** The parties are hereby directed to comply with the following requirements:

1. The parties are to attend the scheduled hearing. To participate in the hearing, you must dial the toll-free number listed below. You will be prompted to enter a PIN number, which is also listed below. You will be asked to speak your name, press the # key, and then the telephone system will connect you to the hearing. If you have any witnesses you want to have present during the hearing who are participating from a separate phone, you must provide them with the telephone number and PIN Number.

YOU MAY LOSE YOUR CASE IF YOU DO NOT TAKE PART IN THE HEARING AND PRESENT EVIDENCE ON THE ISSUES RAISED.

2. You may request a continuance of the hearing via motion made at least five (5) days before the hearing. Your motion should explain why you are seeking a continuance and the position of the other party to your request.

3. If you are an individual, you may represent yourself or you may have an attorney represent you. All others, including a partnership, corporation, trust, association, or governmental agency or subdivision, must be represented by an attorney licensed to practice law in Pennsylvania, or admitted *pro hac vice*. 52 Pa. Code §§ 1.21 & 1.22. And, unless you are an attorney, you may not represent someone else.

4. On or before **September 22, 2025**, Complainant is directed to serve copies of the written direct testimony and exhibits of its witness(es) on Respondent and the undersigned.

5. On or before **October 22, 2025**, Respondent is directed to serve copies of the written rebuttal testimony and exhibits of its witness(es) on Complainant and the undersigned.

7. That the parties shall serve the documents listed above so that the documents are received in-hand by the parties no later than 4:30 p.m. on the dates listed. Parties shall serve the documents listed above via e-mail to meet this requirement. Parties shall not file testimony with the Commission but shall file a certificate of service. 52 Pa.Code § 5.412(f).

8. That written testimony shall comply with the requirements of 52 Pa.Code § 5.412 and shall be marked with numerical, sequential statement numbers.

9. Any written testimony and exhibits submitted by the parties will still be subject to the procedural rules regarding admissibility and cross-examination of the sponsoring witness. 52 Pa. Code § 5.412(c).

10. That the parties shall stipulate to any matters they reasonably can to expedite this proceeding, lessen the burden of time and expenses in litigation on all parties and conserve administrative hearing resources. 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.232 and 5.234. All stipulations

entered into by the parties shall be reduced to writing, signed by the parties to be bound thereby, and moved into the record during the hearing in this case. An exception to this requirement may occur when circumstances of time and expediency warrant. If so, an oral presentation of a stipulation is permissible, if it is followed by a reduction to writing as herein directed.

11. That the evidentiary hearing in this matter constitutes a formal legal proceeding and will be conducted in accordance with the Commission's Rules of Administrative Practice and Procedure and the Pennsylvania Rules of Evidence as applied to administrative hearings.

12. If you intend to subpoena witnesses for the hearing, you should review the procedures established in 52 Pa. Code § 5.421. You must submit your written application to me sufficiently in advance of the hearing date so that the other parties will have the required ten (10) days' notice to answer or object, and so you will have enough time to receive the subpoena and serve it.

13. That the parties are to confer among themselves to attempt to resolve all or some of the issues associated with this proceeding. The parties are reminded that it is the Commission's policy to encourage settlements. 52 Pa. Code § 5.231(a).

14. That any provision of this prehearing order may be modified upon motion and good cause shown by any party in interest in accordance with 52 Pa. Code § 5.223(a).
