
Dear Parties:

On September 3, 2025, Brightspeed of Pennsylvania, LLC (Brightspeed) filed a Letter Request for a 10-day extension to file a response to Complainant's Formal Complaint. The original response was due September 4, 2025. In its request, Brightspeed represented that it was working with Complainant to resolve Complainant's Formal Complaint and that the parties needed more time to finalize a settlement.

Based on the representations made by Brightspeed in its September 3, 2025 request, Brightspeed is granted an extension to file its responsive pleading to the above captioned Formal Complaint. Additionally, it is specifically noted again that any further requests for extension must include written affirmation that all parties agree to the extension.¹ No further extensions to file a responsive pleading will be granted unless the request includes written affirmation that all parties agree to the extension.

Brightspeed's responsive pleading is due to be filed with the Commission by the close of business (4:30 p.m. EST) on September 15, 2025.

Brightspeed did not include such language in its September 3, 2025 request for extension.
