120-Day Status Report, Requesting that the Stay Be Extended for Another 120 Days

Dear Secretary Homsher:

In accordance with Paragraph 6 of the Stay Order issued on May 19, 2025, Veolia Water Pennsylvania, Inc. ("VWPA") hereby files this 120-day status report to advise the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission ("Commission") on the progress of negotiations between (a) VWPA and (b) Wonderview Water Company, Inc. ("Wonderview Water") and Wonderview Sanitary Facilities, Inc. ("Wonderview Wastewater") (collectively, "Wonderview"). VWPA respectfully requests that the stay be extended for another 120 days to allow VWPA and Wonderview to continue their negotiations and to continue drafting the multiple agreements and filings that will be necessary to transfer control of the Wonderview water and wastewater systems to VWPA.

As stated in VWPA's status report of July 18, 2025, VWPA has held productive discussions with Wonderview for the voluntary transfer of Wonderview's water and wastewater systems to VWPA. VWPA and Wonderview continue to believe that reasonable progress is being made and they see no reason why a fair and reasonable agreement should not be reached.

The process, however, is time-consuming. The parties have had to clarify the ownership of certain real property on which Wonderview's facilities are located. At the current time, VWPA and Wonderview continue to negotiate separate agreements for the transfer of the Wonderview Water system, the Wonderview Wastewater system, and certain real property presently owned by Mr. Yohey that is used by Wonderview to provide public utility service. Following the execution of these agreements, the parties anticipate preparing multiple applications for the necessary certificates of public convenience.

Considering the amount of work that remains to be completed, VWPA requests that Administrative Law Judge John M. Coogan (the "ALJ") extend the stay in this proceeding. Specifically, VWPA requests that the ALJ direct VWPA to:

- (a) provide a 60-day status report to the ALJ via e-mail; and
- (b) file a status report with the Secretary's Bureau at the end of the 120-day stay period indicating whether the stay should be extended and, if so, for how long or, in the alternative, advising the ALJ that the Section 529 Investigation should proceed.

VWPA has discussed this request for an extension of the stay with counsel for the other active parties to this proceeding (*i.e.*, Wonderview, the Office of Small Business Advocate, the Office of Consumer Advocate, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement, the Department of Environmental Protection, Aqua Pennsylvania, Inc. and Community Utilities of Pennsylvania, Inc.). VWPA is authorized to report that none of these parties object to the request to extend the stay.
