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1 (On the record at 10:09 a.m.)

2 THE COURT: Okay. We are now on the
3 record. Good morning. This is the time and place for
4 the evidentiary hearing scheduled for Kenneth Burris
5 versus PECO Energy Company, the Electric Division.
6 The Docket Number is F-2025-3055071. My name is
7 Alphonso Arnold, III. I am the assigned
8 Administrative Law Judge to the case. The date is
9 August 11th of 2025, and the time currently is 10:09
10 a.m.

11 The complainant, Mr. Burris, is present
12 for today's hearing. He has a witness on the line,
13 one witness. Also present, representing PECO, is
14 Attorney Khadijah Scott, who has one witness on the
15 line as well.

16 So, at this time, I am going to explain
17 how today's hearing will -- today's hearing procedure.
18 So, Mr. Burris, as the complainant, you are the party
19 with the burden of proof, which means that you must
20 prove by a preponderance of the evidence that PECO is
21 responsible or accountable for the problem that you
22 described in your complaint.

23 That legal term, 'preponderance of the
24 evidence,' just means that your evidence has to be
25 more convincing than PECO's evidence. So you will be

1 presenting your evidence first. When you are finished
2 presenting your evidence, Respondent will have the
3 opportunity to ask you questions concerning your
4 testimony, and the same is true of your witness.
5 After your witness testifies, then Attorney Scott will
6 have the opportunity to ask them questions.

7 Once we are finished with the
8 complainant's case, we will turn over to PECO, who
9 will present his witness. And, Mr. Burris, you will
10 have the opportunity to ask questions of that witness
11 concerning their testimony. Does anyone have any
12 questions at this time?

13 MR. BURRIS: No, Your Honor.

14 MS. SCOTT: Thank you.

15 THE COURT: Attorney Scott, are you on?
16 It just sounded like Attorney Scott just left the
17 call, almost certainly by mistake, so.

18 MS. MILBURN: Your Honor, this is
19 Ramona Milburn, the witness for PECO. Ms. Scott was
20 dropped accidentally. She's dialing back in now.

21 THE COURT: Okay, thank you,
22 Ms. Milburn. We'll wait for her to call back in.

23 MS. SCOTT: I apologize, Your Honor. I
24 was disconnected.

25 THE COURT: Yes, that's okay, Attorney

1 Scott. Okay, Mr. Burris, let me swear you in. Do you
2 swear or affirm that the testimony that you're about
3 to give will be the entire truth?

4 MR. BURRIS: Yes. Yes, Your Honor, I
5 do -- I affirm, yes.

6 THE COURT: All right. So you can get
7 started and explain your complaint.

8 COMPLAINTANT'S STATEMENT

9 MR. BURRIS: All right. This is
10 Kenneth Burris, and I moved into the residence on
11 03/31/2025 of this year from my prior residence of
12 1817 Grange Street, for the past 20 years. And I
13 called to get service turned on in my name, in which
14 the owner of -- the owner of the residence was my
15 son's mother. She was leaving -- she was moving, and
16 I was moving in. And me and my son had the same name,
17 Your Honor. So I believe that's where -- I know
18 that's where they got the mistake from. Because of
19 the information PECO was saying, that I benefited from
20 benefits for the last, I believe they said four years.

21 First, it was -- so it was different
22 numbers they told me. First they told me from 2013 to
23 current. Then they switched it to say for the last
24 four years, which made me owe \$9,000, they were
25 telling me. And I'm telling them that I never lived

1 there.

2 And so I provided them with my voters
3 registration information, which had the address, you
4 know, from my prior residence, 1817 Grange Street. I
5 provided them -- I had just got a new ID, and I had
6 got that ID when I went to PECO. I got -- actually, I
7 got the ID maybe like April 2nd, maybe, possibly; I
8 could check with my ID. I got the new ID on April
9 2nd, and when I went to take that to PECO, the
10 receptionist was telling me there, how did you get the
11 ID if you didn't have any other -- I said, you can use
12 a lease, and that's what I used. I used my current
13 lease with the new address to get my ID.

14 And then, furthermore, when I noticed
15 they said that my son's mother, she put my name on the
16 financial statements. And when I looked at the
17 financial statements, the Social Security number that
18 they had on there for me was not my Social Security
19 number. They had a number that ends in 0616, which is
20 not my Social Security number. So I don't know how
21 they could use that information, and it's -- because
22 that's not even me. If you can look at the financial
23 statement that was made that PECO used for the
24 financial statement, it said 0616, which is not my
25 Social Security number, Your Honor.

1 So I don't understand how -- so that's
2 another -- I believe -- I know me and my son have the
3 same name, so that's -- that -- that's -- that's
4 pretty much the basis of my argument.

5 And then I've also been -- that's
6 the -- that's what I have in black and white or
7 whatever, Your Honor. But I've been, you know, I've
8 been -- I'm a recovering opiate addict, so this has
9 really been stressful. Thank God I haven't relapsed
10 with the harassment I've been getting from the new
11 neighbors around here, because I've been using the
12 generator since then to keep electric, so I have to
13 have power.

14 I've been getting harassed by the
15 neighbors, calling the police on me, lying to the
16 police and calling PECO as well, lying to them,
17 telling them that I'm squatting, that I'm in there
18 squatting or whatever, and that no one's supposed to
19 be in there, all because of PECO, and their
20 negligence. So I had -- but I had to have power. At
21 the same time, it's causing me anxiety. It's a
22 dangerous situation with the neighbors and the
23 generators.

24 Yeah, and I had to store gas cans on
25 the side of the property, which is not -- which is not

1 good and safe. So -- and -- and -- and -- and, like I
2 said, you know, it's -- it's very, very difficult with
3 my recovery, but I'm staying strong and, you know, I'm
4 hoping we can resolve this today. That's pretty much
5 what I have as far as my -- my black and white.

6 And I do have my aunt, Ms. Willistine
7 Jackson. She's on the line to confirm that I've lived
8 with her for the past 20 years. So that's pretty much
9 all I had to say, Your Honor. Thank you. Thanks for
10 allowing me to speak.

11 THE COURT: All right. Thank you.
12 Mr. Burris, let me ask you a couple of questions. Can
13 you provide your current -- or, excuse me -- your
14 previous address is 1817 Grange Street?

15 MR. BURRIS: Yes, sir.

16 THE COURT: And your testimony was that
17 you lived there for 20 years?

18 MR. BURRIS: Yes.

19 THE COURT: Okay. So do you know what
20 date you moved out of that address, according to you?

21 MR. BURRIS: March -- like March 30th
22 of this year, 2025.

23 THE COURT: And after you moved out of
24 that address, you attempted to get service in your
25 name at what address?

1 MR. BURRIS: 312 West Logan Street,
2 Philadelphia, Pennsylvania 19144, as of April 1st. I
3 believe I applied for it on March 31st.

4 THE COURT: And you said the owner of
5 this residence was your son's mother. What is that
6 woman's name?

7 MR. BURRIS: Tiffani Gunner.

8 THE COURT: Okay.

9 MR. BURRIS: T-I -- T-I-F-F-A-N-I,
10 Gunner, G as in Goat, U-N-N-E-R.

11 THE COURT: Okay.

12 MR. BURRIS: She's the owner. She's
13 the landlord.

14 THE COURT: Okay. I want to -- you
15 submitted four exhibits in advance of today's hearing.
16 I just want to go to those. And if you want to dive
17 into any of those exhibits, you can. But, so the
18 first exhibit -- and I'm going to label this exhibit
19 as Burris Exhibit One. And this appears to be a State
20 Identification License. So that is the document I --
21 I'm referring to with Burris Exhibit One, the State
22 Identification License. Is there anything that you'd
23 like to go over or state concerning this document?

24 (Burris Exhibit No. 1 is marked.)

25 MR. BURRIS: Yes, it actually has the,

1 the day, the years, I believe that they were -- well,
2 originally that they were saying that I was -- I was
3 accountable for since 2013. They gave me so many
4 different stories, but, as you can see, that address
5 is 1817 Grange Street. The address is on that ID, but
6 even though it was expired -- it had expired in
7 2020 -- I do want to acknowledge that in spite of
8 2020, I was actually just being late. I hadn't gotten
9 another ID, Your Honor, until this year when it was
10 time -- well, you know, when I needed it for PECO,
11 which I should have been gotten one, but -- and, and I
12 didn't have to get that address. I didn't have to get
13 it. I didn't have to get 312 West Logan Street
14 address on there, but I did because that's where my
15 lease was at. That's what my lease -- and if you can
16 look on file the leases, or you can use that, you can
17 receive identification. You can use a lease to get
18 identification, and that's why I didn't have any mail
19 coming to that address, nothing. And I had just moved
20 in and I wouldn't -- I was able to go get my ID with
21 the lease that I used.

22 But that -- my identification, it says
23 1817 Grange Street, so that's the ID that I have.
24 That's -- that's -- that's what I presented to you,
25 yes. So that's why I want -- I can elaborate on that

1 -- with that. That's why I presented that, to show
2 the address that I was at.

3 THE COURT: Okay. And the ID -- the
4 identification card says it was issued April the 12th,
5 2016, and it expired April the 30th of 2020.

6 MR. BURRIS: Twenty, yes.

7 THE COURT: Okay. So --

8 MR. BURRIS: I just got another one. I
9 just received another one. Let me -- actually, I can
10 look at it right now and tell you exactly what date it
11 was when I acquired the new ID.

12 THE COURT: The new ID, I don't have
13 submitted as an exhibit by you.

14 MR. BURRIS: Right, right. I just -- I
15 just received that. They -- PECO might have it. I'm
16 not sure, because I gave it to them as well.

17 MS. SCOTT: I do not, Your Honor.

18 MR. BURRIS: Okay.

19 THE COURT: Okay. Let's stick to the
20 exhibits that you submitted.

21 MR. BURRIS: Okay.

22 THE COURT: So let's go to the second
23 document that you submitted. This is Burris Exhibit
24 Two. And this appears to be a Residential Lease
25 Agreement. So that is the document that I am

1 referring to and identifying as Burris Exhibit Two.
2 What would you like to address concerning this
3 exhibit, Mr. Burris?

4 (Burris Exhibit No. 2 is marked.)

5 MR. BURRIS: Just the date. This year
6 is when I, you know, signed April 1st of this year,
7 2025. The date -- but the date -- let me see, let me
8 look, let me pull. Can I pull you up, sir?

9 THE COURT: Yes, go ahead.

10 MR. BURRIS: Yes, yes, it was -- it was
11 signed on the 28th, but it started April 1st of 2025.
12 Started on the 1st of April -- April 1st. The
13 agreement began on April 1st, 2025, and it was signed
14 March 28th, 2025 by myself and the landlord. This is
15 the lease that I -- that we -- this is the agreement
16 that we both came upon, Your Honor, the lease that my
17 landlord gave to me.

18 So, I mean, it's pretty much, I really
19 don't have too much to speak on this, Your Honor, on
20 the lease, because this is my -- this is the lease
21 agreement that I have. Actually, this is my first
22 time ever dealing with a lease like this, or anything
23 in my name like that. So -- but this is -- this is --
24 I'm not sure if this is the lease that I have, which
25 you have, so I don't need to elaborate on that pretty

1 much anymore. I don't think so, unless there's
2 anything else you want me to -- you want me to
3 elaborate on. If you have any questions, Your Honor.

4 THE COURT: Okay. First, Exhibit Two
5 is a residential lease agreement between the landlord,
6 Tiffani Gunner, and --

7 MR. BURRIS: Yes.

8 THE COURT: -- tenant Kenneth Burris,
9 whereby according to the document, the landlord,
10 Ms. Gunner, agreed to lease 312 West Logan Street to
11 Mr. Burris for a term beginning April 1st, 2025 and
12 ending March 31st, 2026. And as Mr. Burris stated, it
13 appears to be signed by Ms. Gunner and Mr. Burris on
14 March 28th, 2025.

15 MR. BURRIS: Yes, sir.

16 THE COURT: Okay. All right, let's
17 move to the third document that you submitted. Give
18 me a second to -- it's not opening on my end, so give
19 me just one moment. Okay. The third document is a
20 letter from Ja'nae Williams, a psychiatrist, Penn
21 Medicine. This exhibit, I will mark and identify as
22 Burris Exhibit Three.

23 And Mr. Burris, just to state, this
24 transcript can be -- might be read by more individuals
25 than who are present here today. So if you don't want

1 to address maybe the specifics of this letter, if you
2 don't want people to know your condition --

3 MR. BURRIS: Yes, that's fine, Your
4 Honor. That's the part of my recovery.

5 THE COURT: Okay, so -- so I'm just
6 giving you that warning. But you can state -- you can
7 state right now what you want for me to know about
8 this letter.

9 (Burris Exhibit No. 3 is marked.)

10 MR. BURRIS: Just what it said, that I
11 -- I'm a recovery -- I'm presently still in recovery.
12 I've been in recovery for the last 11 months. I've
13 been on since September 24th last year, 2024. For 15
14 years I was doing opiates. I had an opiate addiction,
15 a very heavy opiate addiction. And I'm proud to say
16 August 24th of this year, I will be 11 -- 11 months'
17 clean. And that's -- that's pretty much it, Your
18 Honor.

19 Like, I just, you know, like epidemic
20 that's going on out here in this world, I was a part
21 of it. And I'm not ashamed to say, you know, it's
22 part of my -- so I don't mind speaking on it, you
23 know, part of my recovery, part of the process. But
24 at the same time this has been a very bad burden on me
25 with dealing with this electric. But I've been strong

1 at the same time, thank God. But I've been strong
2 enough to -- to deal with it, with the heat, it's
3 being hot in the house.

4 And, you know, just like I said with
5 the neighbors -- with the neighbors complaining and
6 lying to the police, having the cops, and I'm doing
7 right. I'm not -- I'm not gonna say I'm trying -- I'm
8 doing right -- doing right by myself in my recovery.
9 And, you know, it's just -- it's just -- but they say,
10 you know, won't -- well what is put on you just makes
11 you stronger or whatever.

12 So -- and this definitely has been a
13 burden when it hadn't even been my fault. And times
14 in the past, I would have used for something like
15 this. But I haven't, thank God. And I don't plan on
16 it. So I mean, but yeah, I had an opiate addiction
17 for the past -- I mean, it started from 2009 to 2024,
18 and which I'm currently in -- still fighting. And I'm
19 also in the process now of becoming a Certified
20 Recovery Specialist myself, as well, to help people
21 like -- other people like -- individuals like myself.

22 But yes -- but it's been -- it's been a
23 hard task, as you know. You know, it's been a hot
24 summer, in summertime, but it's been extremely hot the
25 last few weeks and it's -- it's a struggle, Your

1 Honor, that's all. But I could talk about it and I'm
2 pleased to say I'm still fighting, I'm still holding
3 on, and I'm meeting all my meetings. As you can see,
4 I have my psychiatrist. That was something new. I
5 didn't know -- but yes, she does help me with my
6 opiate addiction. That's what it was, Your Honor, so.
7 This is very, very critical for my (Overlapping
8 speakers.) -- excuse me, can I finish, please?

9 THE COURT: Yes, finish.

10 MR. BURRIS: Okay, thank you. No, it's
11 just very critical for my, you know, to my recovery
12 and me having power and like it's very critical for my
13 recovery. So that's all. That's all I have to say.
14 I'm finished on that exhibit, Your Honor.

15 THE COURT: Okay, thank you,
16 Mr. Burris. And the last pre-submitted exhibit from
17 you appears to be a Voter Status Record Card. I will
18 mark and identify this exhibit as Burris Exhibit Four.
19 So go ahead and explain what you want us to know about
20 this exhibit.

21 (Burris Exhibit No. 4 is marked.)

22 MR. BURRIS: Yes, this is -- it just
23 states -- it has my voter's registration and it has
24 the address and the district that I voted -- that I
25 voted in it has 1817 -- this is the proof of address

1 along with the ID, which was expired. But this was --
2 this is the most recent Voter's Registration Card that
3 I had that was delivered, you know, to the mail by me
4 with this address.

5 Unfortunately, I don't have plenty of
6 mail that comes here, but I found this. And this is
7 the proof of, you know, my residence for the times
8 that they were saying that I was living at 312 West
9 Logan. This is -- this is a proof of address right
10 here, Your Honor, for those times -- for that time.

11 THE COURT: So, did you -- did you pull
12 this document from www.PAVoterService.pa.gov?

13 MR. BURRIS: This particular one?

14 THE COURT: Yeah.

15 MR. BURRIS: It's not the one that I
16 sent to you? Yes, this is the one. Yes, Your Honor.
17 This is the one. Yes. This the one I pulled up from
18 there. Yes, Your Honor. Because it's the same one
19 that's in the mail. It's the same one that's in the
20 mail, Your Honor.

21 THE COURT: Okay. Did you --

22 MR. BURRIS: Yes, I did.

23 THE COURT: Do you know when you
24 accessed this from this website?

25 MR. BURRIS: I just accessed it during

1 this. It was during the -- during this time with
2 PECO, Your Honor. It was -- it was during this time
3 with PECO, sometime after March 31st, after I applied
4 for the service.

5 THE COURT: Okay. All right. Thank
6 you. Mr. Burris, do you have any additional testimony
7 at this time?

8 MR. BURRIS: Like I said, I don't -- I
9 guess, PECO, like they -- I'm saying that they had --
10 the Social Security number that they had, that was
11 totally wrong that they was using. So if my name was
12 used -- I mean, well, I know it might have been
13 because it's my son's name. But as far as me being an
14 individual in the -- in the financial statements
15 that's on PECO -- That's on PECO's information that
16 they said that my son -- that Ms. Tiffani had wrote up
17 or whatever, that's not my Social Security number,
18 Your Honor. That's not me. I don't know where
19 PECO -- it's clearly not my Social Security number. I
20 know the last four -- when I looked at the statement
21 that they sent me, the last four was 0616, which is
22 not my -- my last four of my Social Security number.
23 So they had the wrong person, Your Honor. That's the
24 last statement I had to make. Thank you for allowing
25 me to take the floor.

1 THE COURT: Okay. Thank you,
2 Mr. Burris. Attorney Scott, do you have any questions
3 for Mr. Burris?

4 MS. SCOTT: Yes, Your Honor. Thank
5 you. Good morning, Mr. Burris. How are you?

6 MR. BURRIS: Good morning, Ms. Scott.

7 MS. SCOTT: Now, let me ask you, when
8 did you ever use the address of 312 Logan as your
9 mailing address prior to March 2025?

10 MR. BURRIS: I've never used it before,
11 Your Honor.

12 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Do you know why
13 public records would associate you with the address
14 all the way back to 2019?

15 MR. BURRIS: No, I do not. I was told
16 that, but no, I do not. Like I said, my -- you said
17 2019. My ID clearly states on it, I wasn't living
18 there. So if some -- if someone was -- some kind of
19 public record was using that, it wasn't -- I don't --
20 I didn't do it, Your Honor.

21 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Your ID doesn't
22 actually state that you weren't living there. What
23 your ID states is that in April of 2016, that was your
24 address. It does -- it expires four years later, so
25 there are times if the city tracks you --

1 MR. BURRIS: So 2020 --

2 MS. SCOTT: Right. So if you get a
3 license today at Logan and you move, you're -- how
4 would anyone know where you live? It lasts for four
5 years. So that doesn't necessarily tell us where you
6 live. It tells us where you lived in April 2016.

7 MR. BURRIS: Well, that -- that's --
8 that's -- that's -- that's the way of finding out
9 where I live at. That's where I lived at. And that's
10 where -- and I have my voter registration with that
11 address as well.

12 MS. SCOTT: Right. But if you live
13 somewhere for 20 years, did you have a deed or a lease
14 at the property of Grange Avenue?

15 MR. BURRIS: It's my -- it's my -- it's
16 my -- no, I don't have a deed. I don't have a deed.
17 I did, at least maybe 20 years ago, when I first moved
18 in, by word-of-mouth. This is my aunt. She helped
19 raise me, so it's the house I was born in -- I was
20 born and raised in, so.

21 MS. SCOTT: Okay, so then you got mail
22 there, right?

23 MR. BURRIS: Yes. Yeah, that's --
24 that's where that voter registration came from, the
25 mail. That was in the mail.

1 MS. SCOTT: Okay, but voter
2 registration, when are you saying you registered for
3 that voter registration? What year are you saying
4 you registered for voter registration? Are you saying
5 that's recent or are you saying that's 20 years ago?

6 MR. BURRIS: I can't remember when I
7 first registered. I haven't registered again since I
8 first registered, but I get that same card in the mail
9 every few years at that same address, and I go vote
10 there. And I go vote there every four years or every
11 two years, Your Honor, so.

12 MS. SCOTT: Okay, so why do you
13 think --

14 MR. BURRIS: That's the only place I --
15 I've always been registered there. That's the only
16 thing I've been registered at.

17 MS. SCOTT: I understand. How do you
18 think public records and PECO got information for you
19 -- not your son; I'm talking specifically about you--
20 on this account for Ms. Gunner? How do you think that
21 happened? The public records associated you with the
22 address, and PECO's information associates you with
23 the address. How do you think that happened?

24 MR. BURRIS: The information that PECO
25 has, that was not me. If you look -- if you look --

1 that -- what I was shown with those -- with that --
2 with what PECO had, those Social Security numbers,
3 that was not me.

4 MS. SCOTT: I'm not talking about the
5 Social Security number. The Social Security number,
6 just to clarify (Overlapping speakers.) --

7 THE COURT: Hold on. Yeah, let me just
8 -- let me just -- yeah, before you continue,
9 Mr. Burris, let's just watch and try to not talk over
10 one another. So if you could just wait until someone,
11 like, stops and pauses before the next person speaks,
12 that would be appreciated. But Mr. Burris, you can
13 continue.

14 MR. BURRIS: You said -- you said
15 the -- what PECO had on me, that Social Security
16 number, I don't know -- They didn't -- they didn't
17 show me anything else. That's the only thing that I
18 know of. But you're talking about that PECO has a
19 record of -- with me. The public record, I don't know
20 what you're talking about as far as the public record.
21 But with PECO has -- but you -- what you're telling me
22 that PECO presented with my name on it, it's not my
23 Social. So that's not -- that -- I don't know who
24 that person -- I don't know what you're talking about.

25 MS. SCOTT: Well, I understand that

1 you're saying it's not your Social Security number
2 attached to your name. I'm not disputing that one way
3 or the other. What I'm asking you is, how do you
4 think your name got on the financial account statement
5 of Ms. Gunner?

6 MR. BURRIS: What I'm saying is I'm not
7 sure if that's my name or not, if that's not my
8 Social.

9 MS. SCOTT: Well, let me ask you this.
10 (Overlapping speakers.)

11 MR. BURRIS: Go ahead.

12 MS. SCOTT: Is your son's name Burris
13 Jr.?

14 MR. BURRIS: Yes. Yes.

15 MS. SCOTT: Did he live with Tiffani
16 Gunner?

17 MR. BURRIS: You said, did he?

18 MS. SCOTT: Yes.

19 MR. BURRIS: Yes, he did. Yes, he
20 does. Yes, he does.

21 MS. SCOTT: Well, what I'm saying is
22 this. He doesn't have a Social Security number
23 attached to his name on the financial statement
24 either. So the Social Security number isn't exactly
25 my question. What I'm asking you is, how do you think

1 it got attached to her account? Are you saying she
2 did it without your knowledge? Are you saying you
3 were a victim of fraud in some way? How do you think
4 that you, you and your son, are both attached to this
5 address and her financial activity statement?

6 MR. BURRIS: And so, in the financial
7 activity (Overlapping speakers.) -- go ahead. Are you
8 finished?

9 MS. SCOTT: I am.

10 MR. BURRIS: All right. The Financial
11 Activity Statement, is that -- do I have a copy of
12 that?

13 MS. SCOTT: Yes, you do. You said you
14 were looking at it. It's PECO's Exhibit Three.

15 MR. BURRIS: Right, exactly. So that's
16 the one that has -- with the Social Security next to
17 it -- with the Social Security number next to it. So,
18 what I am saying is that's not me. So, if she wrote
19 that, if she did that, then she put the wrong Social
20 Security number. I don't know. Somebody was doing
21 some kind of fraud. (Overlapping speakers.) Excuse
22 me, sir. I mean, ma'am.

23 MS. SCOTT: Did you ask her?

24 MR. BURRIS: I was talking. I asked
25 her. She said she couldn't remember. She told me she

1 couldn't remember doing it. And then, when I showed
2 it to her, she said -- she looked at it and was like,
3 'I don't know. That's not your Social Security
4 number.' I don't know. So, the financial statement
5 you're talking about has the Social Security number
6 attached to it.

7 MS. SCOTT: So the information that you
8 have to show where you lived prior to 2021, which is
9 the year that's now at issue, is an expired
10 identification and your voter registration. Is that
11 accurate?

12 MR. BURRIS: Yes.

13 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Thank you. Your
14 Honor, I have no further questions for this witness.

15 THE COURT: All right, I'll ask you
16 again, Mr. Burris, if you have any additional
17 testimony at the time.

18 MR. BURRIS: Yes, I want to look at the
19 financial statement. I gotta pull it. If you give me
20 a second, please, Your Honor.

21 THE COURT: Well, yeah, Mr. Burris, you
22 have -- you have the opportunity to cross-examine
23 people concerning that exhibit.

24 MR. BURRIS: Okay.

25 THE COURT: Yeah, because they have a

1 witness who will address that financial statement.
2 Okay, but did you have any additional testimony at
3 this time?

4 MR. BURRIS: No, sir, Your Honor, I
5 don't.

6 THE COURT: Okay, so let's address,
7 then, the admission of the four exhibits. Attorney
8 Scott, do you object to the admission of Burris
9 Exhibits 1 through 4 into the record?

10 MS. SCOTT: No, Your Honor. Thank you.

11 THE COURT: Okay, so Burris Exhibits
12 One, Two, Three, and Four are admitted into the record
13 in this proceeding.

14 (Exhibits Burris Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4 are
15 admitted.)

16 THE COURT: All right, so let's move to
17 your witness here. Mr. Burris, you indicated that
18 your witness is Ms. Jackson. She's your aunt?

19 MR. BURRIS: Yes, sir. Yes.

20 THE COURT: And the subject of her
21 testimony is, I guess, to testify with respect to your
22 residence prior to April of 2025?

23 MR. BURRIS: Yes. Yes, sir, Your
24 Honor.

25 EXAMINATION BY THE COURT

1 THE COURT: Okay. Ms. Jackson, are you
2 on the line?

3 MS. JACKSON: Yes, good morning. I am
4 on the line.

5 THE COURT: Okay, good morning, Ms.
6 Jackson. Can you spell your name, please?

7 MS. JACKSON: I'm sorry. Can you
8 repeat yourself, please? I think my phone broke up a
9 little.

10 THE COURT: Yes. Can you spell your
11 name?

12 MS. JACKSON: Oh, sure. First name is
13 Willistine, W-I-L-L-I-S-T-I-N-E. Last name is
14 Jackson, J-A-C-K-S-O-N.

15 THE COURT: Okay. Let me -- let me
16 swear you in. Do you swear or affirm that the
17 testimony that you're about to give is the entire
18 truth?

19 MS. JACKSON: Yes, I do.

20 THE COURT: Okay. What is your
21 relationship with the complainant, Mr. Burris?

22 MS. JACKSON: I'm his aunt. That's my
23 nephew.

24 THE COURT: Okay. And what is your
25 current address?

1 MS. JACKSON: 1817 Grange Street,
2 Philadelphia, Pennsylvania 19141.

3 THE COURT: Okay. And, Attorney --
4 excuse me -- Mr. Burris indicated that you can speak
5 to where Mr. Burris resided, I guess, according to
6 him, for the past 20 years. All right, Ms. Jackson,
7 you can go ahead and, you know, testify. What do you
8 want us to know?

9 MS. JACKSON: Okay, so Mr. Kenneth
10 Burris, my nephew, has been residing at 1817 Grange
11 Street for, yes, at least the last 20 years. I have
12 been residing there myself since 1990. You know, we
13 never -- we just had a mutual agreement. You know, I
14 let him move in. He, you know, didn't have anywhere
15 to go, and that's my nephew; I love him, so I let him
16 stay there until March 30th of this year. And that's
17 when, you know, he decided to rent the house at 312
18 West Logan Street. And that's when he moved out.

19 THE COURT: Okay. Thank you,
20 Ms. Jackson. Attorney Scott, do you have any
21 questions for Ms. Jackson?

22
23 MS. SCOTT: Just briefly, Your Honor.
24 Thank you.

25 EXAMINATION BY RESPONDENT

1 MS. SCOTT: Good morning, Ms. Jackson.
2 How are you?

3 MS. JACKSON: Good morning. I'm doing
4 well. How about yourself?

5 MS. SCOTT: Good, thank you. Now, are
6 you aware if Mr. Burris ever used a mailing address at
7 312 Logan?

8 MS. JACKSON: No, I am not aware of him
9 using that address. He would -- he gets all his mail,
10 you know, at the address he was at, 1817 Grange
11 Street. I don't know why he would have gotten mail
12 there. All his mail came to 1817 Grange Street,
13 always.

14 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Do you have any idea
15 how Public Record Database would have him associated
16 with that address at 312 West Logan Street prior to
17 March of 2025?

18 MS. JACKSON: No, I -- I have no idea.
19 He's been living at 1817 Grange Street. So I'm -- I
20 don't -- public records shouldn't have had him at that
21 address.

22 MS. SCOTT: Are you aware --

23 MS. JACKSON: Ma'am, does the public
24 record have him at Grange Street at all? Because they
25 definitely should have him at Grange Street.

1 MS. SCOTT: What I can tell you is that
2 although I normally can't answer questions, I will say
3 that that wasn't the address the search was run, since
4 the issue was at 312.

5 MS. JACKSON: Okay.

6 MS. SCOTT: So I can't say yes or no.
7 I'm not saying it doesn't have him at Grange Avenue.
8 What I'm saying is, it has him as an associated of 312
9 West Logan Street. Now, are you aware that the lights
10 are disconnected at 312 West Logan Street?

11 MS. JACKSON: He did inform me of that,
12 yes. Absolutely, yes.

13 MS. SCOTT: Now, is he back with you,
14 or is he still at 312 West Logan Street?

15 MS. JACKSON: No, he's still been
16 staying there at 312 West Logan Street. I can attest
17 to, he has been using a generator that's, you know,
18 very, very loud. And, you know, he's been telling me
19 he's been getting complaints, like, from the neighbors
20 and things like that. You know, calling me, you know,
21 very upset and stressed out, you know, about the
22 situation. But, you know, I'm just telling him to,
23 you know, just pray and, you know, hopefully, you
24 know, everything will, you know, work itself out.

25 MS. SCOTT: Now, it's your testimony

1 that he's been at this property, 312 West Logan
2 Street, since, I guess, April 1st of this year?

3 MS. JACKSON: Yes, absolutely, yes.

4 MS. SCOTT: Do you know if the utility
5 service has been paid at all from that time?

6 MS. JACKSON: For 312 West Logan
7 Street?

8 MS. SCOTT: Yes.

9 MS. JACKSON: I -- I'm -- not that I
10 know of, if it's been paid. You know, I -- no, no, I
11 don't -- I -- I mean, I don't know. I don't live
12 there, so, you know, I wouldn't know if it was paid or
13 not. I wouldn't know about any bills being paid
14 there.

15 MS. SCOTT: Okay, thank you,
16 Ms. Jackson. I have no further questions, Your Honor,
17 for this witness.

18 THE COURT: Okay. Thank you, Attorney
19 Scott. Ms. Jackson, is there anything else you want
20 to say? (Pause.) Ms. Jackson, is there anything else
21 you'd like to say? (Pause.) Okay, I don't hear --

22 MS. JACKSON: I'm sorry. What did you
23 say, Your Honor?

24 THE COURT: Yes. I'm asking if -- is
25 there anything final that you'd like to say?

1 MS. JACKSON: No. No, that's it.
2 Thank you for your time today.

3 THE COURT: Okay. Thank you for your
4 testimony, Ms. Jackson. All right, so at this point
5 in time, we'll turn things over to PECO. Attorney
6 Scott, you may present PECO's witness.

7 MS. SCOTT: PECO would call Ramona
8 Milburn as its witness, Your Honor.

9 THE COURT: Okay, Ms. Milburn, let me
10 swear you in. Do you swear or affirm that the
11 testimony that you're about to give will be the entire
12 truth?

13 MS. MILBURN: I affirm, Your Honor.

14 THE COURT: Okay, Attorney Scott, you
15 can proceed.

16 MS. SCOTT: Thank you, Your Honor.

17 EXAMINATION BY RESPONDENT

18 MS. SCOTT: Good morning, Ms. Milburn.
19 How are you?

20 MS. MILBURN: I'm well, thank you.

21 MS. SCOTT: Can you please state, for
22 the record, your current employer and business
23 address?

24 MS. MILBURN: Current employer is
25 Exelon PECO Energy, 2301 Market Street, Philadelphia,

1 PA 19101.

2 MS. SCOTT: And how long have you been
3 employed with PECO?

4 MS. MILBURN: 40 years.

5 MS. SCOTT: What's your current job
6 title?

7 MS. MILBURN: Regulatory Assessor.

8 MS. SCOTT: Can you give a brief
9 description of what a Regulatory Assessor does?

10 MS. MILBURN: Regulatory Assessors will
11 review cases that come in for the PUC for PECO. And
12 we analyze them and make sure that the company is in
13 compliance.

14 MS. SCOTT: Okay. How did you become
15 familiar with the formal complaint that brings us here
16 today?

17 MS. MILBURN: This complaint was
18 assigned to me.

19 MS. SCOTT: Did you have an opportunity
20 to review the account that's associated with the
21 complaint?

22 MS. MILBURN: Yes, I had.

23 MS. SCOTT: Okay. I want to direct
24 your attention to PECO's Exhibits, so can you go to
25 PECO's Exhibit One? Just let me know when you have

1 that.

2 (PECO Exhibit No. 1 is marked.)

3 MS. MILBURN: I have Exhibit One before
4 me.

5 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Now, what is this
6 document?

7 MS. MILBURN: This is what they call an
8 Activity Statement -- Financial Activity Statement.
9 It's for the billing and payment history for the
10 property Logan.

11 MS. SCOTT: And is that 312 West Logan
12 Street?

13 MS. MILBURN: Yes, 312 West Logan
14 Street.

15 MS. SCOTT: Now, who is the customer of
16 record for PECO at 312 West Logan Street?

17 MS. MILBURN: Tiffani Gunner is the
18 customer of record.

19 MS. SCOTT: And what is the current
20 account balance at 312 West Logan Street?

21 MS. MILBURN: We're showing \$14,134.04
22 for the account balance.

23 MS. SCOTT: Is the account currently
24 active? Is the service on?

25 MS. MILBURN: Service is off.

1 MS. SCOTT: And why is the service off?

2 MS. MILBURN: We have non-payment.

3 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Do you know
4 approximately when the service was cut out for
5 non-payment?

6 MS. MILBURN: Just one moment. Let me
7 double-check the date. I have March 31st, 2025.

8 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Now, at some point
9 in time, are you aware of Mr. Burris contacting PECO
10 regarding this account?

11 MS. MILBURN: Yes.

12 MS. SCOTT: And what, if anything, do
13 you know about that?

14 MS. MILBURN: Mr. Burris contacted PECO
15 to have the service placed into his name at this
16 address.

17 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Now, when a customer
18 contacts PECO to have service placed into their name,
19 what's that process look like? Why wasn't it placed
20 into his name?

21 MS. MILBURN: Because of history with
22 people changing account balances over to avoid paying
23 the bill. When there is a large balance on an account
24 and a new person is applying, PECO will confirm by
25 checking to see if they have any affiliation with the

1 previous Customer of Record. If there is no
2 affiliation, we start a new account. If there is an
3 affiliation, then a determination is made as to what
4 amount of the bill that they would be responsible for,
5 and then we would go forward: If they accept
6 responsibility, if they need to pay the full amount
7 that they're responsible for, if they need to make
8 arrangements on the bill before the service is started
9 with the new account.

10 MS. SCOTT: Okay. In this particular
11 case, how, if at all, was Mr. Burris associated, or
12 not associated, with 312 West Logan Street, when a
13 research was conducted?

14 MS. MILBURN: The research was
15 conducted and public records returned that he was
16 associated with the account.

17 MS. SCOTT: I want to direct your
18 attention to PECO's Exhibit Two. Just let me know
19 when you have that.

20 (PECO Exhibit No. 2 is marked.)

21 MS. MILBURN: I have Exhibit Two before
22 me.

23 MS. SCOTT: Now, what is this
24 information?

25 MS. MILBURN: This is what the public

1 records through the program LexisNexis has shown to
2 have Senior and Junior associated with the property.

3 MS. SCOTT: Okay.

4 MS. MILBURN: For 312 West Logan.

5 MS. SCOTT: Now, I see two different
6 images for Exhibit Two, okay? And the first one says
7 Kenneth Burris, and then it has Senior as the second
8 entry. I just want to look at the first snip for a
9 moment. What's the date of birth of the person
10 associated with this research?

11 MS. MILBURN: March 18th, 1977.

12 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Were you able to
13 confirm or not confirm whether that's the actual birth
14 date of Mr. Burris?

15 MS. MILBURN: Just one moment. I'm
16 checking. Yes, the ID confirmed that that was the
17 birth date. It's the same birth date. The ID that
18 Mr. Burris provided to the company.

19 MS. SCOTT: Okay, so, and what's the
20 address that's associated with Mr. Burris and the
21 LexisNexis research?

22 MS. MILBURN: 312 West Logan.

23 MS. SCOTT: During what time frame?

24 MS. MILBURN: It's reporting September
25 2019 through June 2025.

1 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Now, with regard to
2 the account of Ms. Gunner, when did that account open?

3 MS. MILBURN: 2017.

4 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Is PECO holding
5 Mr. Burris responsible for the balance dating back to
6 September 2019 in order to have service placed in his
7 name?

8 MS. MILBURN: Just as of 2021.

9 MS. SCOTT: Okay, and why is that? If
10 the account associates him back to 2019, why is it
11 only a four-year look back?

12 MS. MILBURN: The company would only
13 hold people responsible for the past four years. They
14 won't go longer than that.

15 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Now, were you able
16 to correspond Mr. Burris to the address of 312 West
17 Logan Street in any other way?

18 MS. MILBURN: The financial records
19 that we received shows him associated.

20 MS. SCOTT: Okay. I want to direct
21 your attention to PECO's Exhibit Three. Just let me
22 know when you have that information.

23 (PECO Exhibit No. 3 is marked.)

24 MS. MILBURN: I have Exhibit Three
25 before me.

1 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Now, what is this
2 information that says financial statement?

3 MS. MILBURN: The financial statement
4 will list the peoples that are noted for the property
5 address, and it will give detailed information as far
6 as what their name is, if they're employed, what the
7 status would be, and what the income would be, and
8 what their age would be.

9 MS. SCOTT: Okay. And why is it that
10 somebody would even give a financial statement to
11 PECO?

12 MS. MILBURN: They usually want to
13 apply for assistance -- payment arrangements. For
14 this one, it was to apply for the PECO Customer
15 Assistance Program.

16 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Now, there are
17 multiple persons represented on this financial
18 statement, but are you able to identify Mr. Burris in
19 particular? And, if so, where do you see that?

20 MS. MILBURN: Mr. Burris is listed on
21 the third person on the financial statement, Senior
22 and his age.

23 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Now, did you hear
24 the testimony of Mr. Burris that he may be getting
25 mixed up with his son because they share the same

1 name?

2 MS. MILBURN: Yes, I did hear that
3 testimony.

4 MS. SCOTT: Okay. And how, if at all,
5 can you confirm or deny that he's being misidentified
6 as his son?

7 MS. MILBURN: Well, because it shows
8 Senior and the age 46, and then it shows Junior and
9 the age 14.

10 MS. SCOTT: Okay. So when this
11 financial information was taken, is it your testimony
12 that it was provided for two separate individuals?

13 MS. MILBURN: That is correct.

14 MS. SCOTT: Let me ask you, are you
15 familiar with how financial statement information is
16 gathered from a customer?

17 MS. MILBURN: Yes, I am familiar.

18 MS. SCOTT: Are they required to have
19 the correct Social Security number for the family
20 members, or just household members that are listed in
21 the property when they're providing the information?

22 MS. MILBURN: We request the Social
23 Security number. Sometimes, the person might say they
24 don't have it or they're not sure of it, but we
25 request it. It's not a requirement.

1 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Now, I see for line
2 four, where it says Kenneth Burris Jr., it has 0000 as
3 the last four of his Social Security number. From
4 your experience, does that mean that that's the last
5 four digits of his Social Security number?

6 MS. MILBURN: Not necessarily.
7 Sometimes they'll, if they're not sure of it, it could
8 be all zeros, all nines.

9 MS. SCOTT: Okay. When you look at
10 this financial statement, do you see the first three
11 residents: Royal Williams, Riley, and Kenneth Burris
12 Senior, all their Social Security numbers are listed
13 as ending in 2222; do you see that on the financial
14 statement?

15 MS. MILBURN: That is correct. Yes,
16 that is listed on the statement.

17 MS. SCOTT: And what reason would that
18 be?

19 MS. MILBURN: That the person providing
20 the information wasn't able to give the actual numbers
21 for the last four of the Socials.

22 MS. SCOTT: Okay. And if they aren't
23 able to give the actual four numbers for the Socials,
24 what, if anything, would be input into the system?

25 MS. MILBURN: The information that they

1 provide is inputted into the system.

2 MS. SCOTT: And what if they don't know
3 the Social?

4 MS. MILBURN: They have dummy numbers.

5 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Now, in your
6 experience, if someone has a dummy number assigned to
7 their Social Security number, does that mean they did
8 or did not reside or associated with the property?

9 MS. MILBURN: No, it doesn't mean that
10 they did or did not reside or associated at the
11 property.

12 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Do you know of any
13 way, in your experience, that a customer would be
14 associated with an address that they've never lived at
15 in public records?

16 MS. MILBURN: They could be associated
17 if they have mail going there, if they're related
18 going there, if they list their address there for
19 other things, if they have bills and they list that
20 address. There's a number of things that can
21 associate a person with an address.

22 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Did this particular
23 customer, Ms. Gunner, receive Customer Assistance
24 Program funds from PECO?

25 MS. MILBURN: Yes.

1 MS. SCOTT: Okay. I want to direct
2 your attention to PECO's Exhibit Four. Just let me
3 know when you have that.

4 (PECO Exhibit No. 4 is marked.)

5 MS. MILBURN: I have four before me.

6 MS. SCOTT: And what is this
7 information?

8 MS. MILBURN: This is the data for the
9 Customer Assistance Program. Ms. Gunner was approved,
10 and she was enrolled in the program.

11 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Now, are you aware
12 of any other complaints that Mr. Burris made against
13 PECO trying to get service into his name at the
14 address of 312 West Logan Street?

15 MS. MILBURN: Before going to the
16 formal, he started off with an informal complaint.

17 MS. SCOTT: Okay. I want to direct
18 your attention to PECO's Exhibit Five. Just let me
19 know when you have that.

20 (PECO Exhibit No. 5 is marked.)

21 MS. MILBURN: I have five in front of
22 me.

23 MS. SCOTT: What's this information on
24 page one of Exhibit Five?

25 MS. MILBURN: Page one would list the

1 complainant's name, Kenneth Burris, the address, which
2 is the 312 West Logan, and then the nature of their
3 complaint. It is noted the reason was that they were
4 applying for service at this address.

5 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Now, how much time
6 had passed between PECO disconnecting the service and
7 Mr. Burris then contacting PECO wanting service in his
8 name?

9 MS. MILBURN: Same day.

10 MS. SCOTT: Okay. Now, what was the
11 date of this particular complaint?

12 MS. MILBURN: It was open April 4th.

13 MS. SCOTT: All right. Now, I want to
14 direct you to the second page of Exhibit Five. And
15 just let me know when you have that.

16 MS. MILBURN: I have the second page.

17 MS. SCOTT: What's the Case ID Number
18 for this particular complaint?

19 MS. MILBURN: 4051985.

20 MS. SCOTT: And when was the decision
21 rendered on the complaint?

22 MS. MILBURN: April 17th.

23 MS. SCOTT: And what ultimately was the
24 decision that was rendered by the Public Utility
25 Commission Bureau of Consumer Services?

1 MS. MILBURN: It held that the
2 applicant was responsible for some or all of the
3 outstanding balance on the account.

4 MS. SCOTT: Okay. (Overlapping
5 speakers.) Go ahead. I'm sorry.

6 MS. MILBURN: Oh, I was going to say,
7 and since PECO, as we've already stated, would not
8 hold a person responsible for a balance that accrued
9 over four years to put the service in their name, the
10 total balance, which was \$9,835.90, had accrued since
11 April 1st, 2021. And the PUC stated that they could
12 not offer payment arrangements to restore the service
13 because of a balance that was owed while the account
14 was under CAP. But the case was dismissed.

15 MS. SCOTT: Do you know if the
16 complainant's voter registration, license, and leasing
17 information was provided to the Bureau of Consumer
18 Services before they made their decision?

19 MS. MILBURN: Yes, it was.

20 MS. SCOTT: Thank you, Ms. Milburn. I
21 have no further questions of this witness, Your Honor.

22 THE COURT: Thank you, Ms. Milburn.
23 Mr. Burris, do you have any questions for the witness
24 here?

25 MR. BURRIS: Yes, Your Honor, I do.

1 Yes, I do. May I proceed, please?

2 THE COURT: Yes.

3 MR. BURRIS: Okay, thank you.

4 EXAMINATION BY COMPLAINANT

5 MR. BURRIS: Is it Ms. Milburn -- Ms.
6 Milburn; is that your name?

7 MS. MILBURN: Milburn.

8 MR. BURRIS: Milburn. Okay, sorry.
9 Pardon me if I got it wrong. Now, you stated that the
10 service was cut off due to Tiffani's non-payment. I
11 have a discrepancy with that. Tiffani, from what I
12 was told and what we discussed, is that she called in
13 to get it cut off because she was moving and that I
14 was moving in. That -- that she had a tenant moving
15 in. From what I was told, she didn't say who, but she
16 called in first. She got cut off, because she was
17 moving and I was moving in.

18 From what I was -- my understanding,
19 PECO didn't cut it off. She called them and told them
20 to cut it off. And I called the same day. I called
21 literally the same day to get service put on in my
22 name, but on the same day that she called to get it
23 cut off -- or she called me maybe the 25th or the 26th
24 to get it cut off. And I had called -- and I called
25 them maybe a couple days later or whatever. I called

1 to get service turned on before the service was even
2 cut off. The service got cut off, I believe, on April
3 1st, but she called to get it cut off prior to that.

4 And I was going -- and so that's a
5 discrepancy as far as they said. They might have owed
6 the bill, but that's not what -- she called to get the
7 service cut off. It wasn't because of the bill. She
8 called, and they cut it off because she told me that
9 she had a tenant moving in. So that's -- that's the
10 discrepancy that I have, that you said that PECO cut
11 it off because -- because of, you know, because of
12 non-payment of a bill. Are you aware of that? Is
13 that what you said, right, that PECO cut it off
14 because of non-payment of a bill? Is that what you
15 said, Ms. Milburn?

16 MS. MILBURN: Yes, I did state that.
17 They also had issued a 10-day termination notice for
18 the bill not being paid.

19 MR. BURRIS: Okay, but -- but -- but
20 she -- but you are aware that she called in to get it
21 cut off on a certain day because she had a tenant
22 moving in. Are y'all aware -- are you aware of that?

23 MS. MILBURN: We're aware that she also
24 requested to have the service stopped in her name.

25 MR. BURRIS: Okay, which was before --

1 which was the day that she told them to not -- so PECO
2 didn't do it. She requested -- so the ten days wasn't
3 even up yet from what you're telling me. She could
4 have had -- she could have kept it on for however many
5 more days it was before they cut it off. So that
6 wasn't the actual cut-off date that PECO gave her.

7 Okay. All right. And exhibit, I
8 believe this is Exhibit Three. Let me pull it up. I
9 have another question. Yes, Exhibit Three. When you
10 were saying that, you know, you don't -- it's not
11 necessary to have the Social Security number on there
12 or someone putting them there. What about the gender?
13 If it said female for everything and you have -- and
14 you said Junior. Why is it Junior if they're all
15 females. Are you -- were you unaware of that?

16 MS. MILBURN: Yes. And that could be
17 human error, where they put down an F instead of an M.

18 MR. BURRIS: For all -- for all five
19 people, human error. So for Senior, it says a female.
20 Junior, it says a female. Clearly, Junior and Senior
21 are clearly males. So, I mean, I don't know. To me,
22 Junior and Senior, they're clearly male. You all
23 didn't mention about being a human error. Tiffani
24 knows who was a male and female. I'm pretty sure she
25 knows who her son is and who her son's father is. So

1 she would have put male for them, so it would have
2 been human error on people's behalf, if I'm not
3 mistaken.

4 So that's all I had -- that's all I had
5 to add on that, and I'm done with the questions, Your
6 Honor. Thank you, Ms. Milburn. Thank you, Your
7 Honor.

8 THE COURT: Okay. Thank you,
9 Mr. Burris.

10 EXAMINATION BY THE COURT

11 THE COURT: Give me -- okay, Ms.
12 Milburn, excuse me if you answered this already, but
13 what is the amount that PECO is looking for, for Mr.
14 Burris to pay in order to get this account in his
15 name?

16 MS. MILBURN: We offered \$9,835.

17 THE COURT: Is that on -- is that found
18 on -- can that be found on Exhibit One?

19 MS. MILBURN: It's on the Exhibit with
20 the decision, which I believe is Exhibit Five.

21 THE COURT: Okay.

22 MS. MILBURN: The second page.

23 THE COURT: Okay. It also says -- so
24 this 9,835, that was the balance that Ms. Gunner
25 accrued starting from April 1st, 2021. Is that

1 correct?

2 MS. MILBURN: Yes, Your Honor.

3 THE COURT: And what was the end date?

4 MS. MILBURN: March 31st, 2025..

5 THE COURT: Okay. With respect to
6 Exhibit Two, do you know the details surrounding how
7 this search that was performed on Lexis?

8 MS. MILBURN: When you say the details,
9 like, how do you put it into the system? I don't do
10 the search myself, but our department that handles the
11 application, they would have placed the information
12 regarding the name, the social -- the actual social --
13 to do a tracer to see if anything came up for the
14 address. They put the address in. They put the name
15 in the social to see if it has an affiliation.

16 THE COURT: Do you know the source of
17 this information at all, or?

18 MS. MILBURN: For NexisLexis?

19 THE COURT: Well, you -- well,
20 specifically, you just said --

21 MS. MILBURN: Oh, you mean the source
22 of information that they use it. I'm sorry, I'm
23 getting confused what you're asking me. It's a public
24 database. It pulls all forms of information. And if
25 you're saying, like, the source, Mr. Burris gave us

1 his name, his social, his date of birth.

2 THE COURT: So, when the search comes
3 back that, I guess, Kenneth D. Burris Sr. is
4 associated with Logan Street -- I know you went over
5 this briefly -- what type of information would
6 associate with him with this property?

7 MS. MILBURN: It doesn't give me the
8 exact details, but it could be gun registration,
9 voters registration. It could be IRS information.
10 There's driver's license, state ID.

11 THE COURT: Okay. And with respect to
12 Exhibit Three -- and again, it's my -- just to
13 clarify, this financial statement, that's information
14 that Ms. Gunner provided to PECO in order to -- in the
15 process of her requesting to be signed up for customer
16 assistance?

17 MS. MILBURN: Correct.

18 THE COURT: Okay. Okay, Ms. -- or,
19 excuse me, Attorney Scott, do you have any redirect
20 for the witness?

21 MS. SCOTT: No, Your Honor. Thank you.

22 THE COURT: And does that conclude
23 PECO's evidence?

24 MS. SCOTT: Yes, PECO would ask that
25 Exhibits One through Five be admitted into evidence,

1 Your Honor.

2 THE COURT: Mr. Burris, do you have any
3 objection to the admission of those exhibits into the
4 record?

5 MR. BURRIS: Yes, sir. You just asked,
6 I believe it was Ms. Milburn, about their reference in
7 there and what they get -- where the sources come
8 from. And the information that she told you was
9 voters registration, gun registration, like, I
10 presented the voter registration, but I cannot
11 register a gun because, unfortunately, I am a
12 convicted felon, so it couldn't have been through
13 that.

14 (Overlapping speakers.)

15 THE COURT: Go ahead.

16 MR. BURRIS: Like I was saying about
17 Exhibit Three, as far as the genders, but that's all I
18 have to say.

19 THE COURT: Okay. PECO Exhibits One
20 through Five are admitted into the record in this
21 proceedings.

22 (PECO Exhibit Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, are
23 admitted.)

24 MR. BURRIS: I'd ask if my stuff can be
25 admitted to the record as well, Your Honor.

1 THE COURT: Yes, I already admitted
2 your four exhibits.

3 MR. BURRIS: Thank you, sir.

4 THE COURT: Give me -- give me just one
5 moment. All right. Let me -- let me take just a
6 couple, one or two additional questions for
7 Mr. Burris. I'm just taking additional testimony
8 here, Mr. Burris, and you're still sworn in; you're
9 still under oath?

10 MR. BURRIS: Yes.

11 THE COURT: With respect to the address
12 at 312 Logan Street, before you -- before April 2025,
13 have you spent any significant period of time residing
14 there?

15 MR. BURRIS: No, sir. No, Your Honor,
16 I did not. None at all. I'd go see my son and that
17 would be it.

18 THE COURT: Okay. So your son lives
19 there. Did your son live there full time?

20 MR. BURRIS: Yes, he did. Yes, he did.
21 They don't -- they no longer live there.

22 THE COURT: Okay. Okay, that's it.
23 Attorney Scott, any questions for the witness, based
24 on those two questions?

25 MS. SCOTT: No, thank you.

1 THE COURT'S FINAL STATEMENT

2 THE COURT: All right, so we will, at
3 this time, move to conclude today's hearing. Just a
4 couple of things before we do that. Ms. Grzywacz, can
5 you provide the email address for the submission of
6 the admitted exhibits?

7 COURT REPORTER: Yes, they can be sent
8 to dependable.lea@gmail.com.

9 THE COURT: Okay, so I'll just repeat:
10 dependable.lea@gmail.com.

11 COURT REPORTER: Correct.

12 THE COURT: Okay. And Lea is L-E-A?

13 COURT REPORTER: Correct.

14 THE COURT: Okay. Okay. So, Attorney
15 Scott, please submit your exhibits to that email, and
16 I will submit the complainant's exhibits to that email
17 that were admitted.

18 All right, so following today's
19 hearing, I will await the transcript of today's
20 hearing. Once I receive that, the record will be
21 closed. Then I will have 90 days to write my initial
22 decision.

23 In my initial decision, I would either
24 grant or deny the complaint. If any party disagrees
25 with my decision, they may submit exceptions, and then

1 the other party may submit reply exceptions. A
2 document that explains the exception and reply
3 exception process will be included alongside my
4 initial decision. Does anyone have any questions at
5 this point in time?

6 MR. BURRIS: Yes, Your Honor, I do.

7 THE COURT: Okay.

8 MR. BURRIS: Yes. Did you -- you said
9 we wait 90 days, you say? It could be up to 90 days
10 for your decision, Your Honor, or before a decision to
11 be made?

12 THE COURT: Ninety days after I receive
13 the transcript, which usually is submitted within 21
14 days.

15 MR. BURRIS: Okay, so -- wow. So that,
16 is that business days, Your Honor, or just --

17 THE COURT: No, that's --

18 MR. BURRIS: Ninety days, okay. And
19 during this time, I request, if it's possible, if I
20 can have service until then, until a decision is made.
21 Because I've been out service now. I have to wait
22 another -- possibly another three more months. And I
23 know I, you know, I -- I can't keep standing there. I
24 don't want to -- I don't want to die. It's dangerous
25 living out here with the generator. I just ask, you

1 know, if it's possible, if I can have service until
2 then, until a decision is made?

3 THE COURT: Yeah, well, unfortunately,
4 I -- I can't do anything in that regard. If I were to
5 -- if I were to rule in your -- rule in your favor,
6 then things can move in the direction of getting
7 service for you, I'm pretty sure. But, yeah, I can't
8 do anything for you at this point in time until I
9 issue my decision.

10 And I would also note that, following
11 my issuance of my decision, the Commission would then
12 pretty much have to approve my decision. They may
13 disapprove or approve of my decision. And then, of
14 course, if any exceptions are filed, they would have
15 to review the exceptions. So -- so it would be longer
16 than even that, even after my decision is issued, in
17 order for my decision to become final.

18 MR. BURRIS: All right. Okay. All
19 right, well -- wow. Okay. Thank you, Your Honor.

20 THE COURT: Yeah. I don't want to get
21 into your business, but maybe moving into your aunt
22 would be -- back into your aunt's home would be a
23 possibility. But, in any event, do you have any
24 additional questions?

25 MR. BURRIS: No, sir, Your Honor, I

1 don't.

2 THE COURT: All right. So, at this
3 point in time, the hearing is adjourned and we are off
4 the record.
