Compliance Manual for Lancelot's MultiCare Transit

1. Introduction & Purpose

This manual establishes the compliance framework for Lancelot's MultiCare Transit, a division of Lancelot's Multi Services, to ensure strict adherence to Title 52 Pa. Code Chapter 29 and related safety and service regulations.

2. Driver Compliance System

Age Restriction (§ 29.503): Drivers must be 21 years or older. Copy of driver's license kept on file.

Driver History (§ 29.504): Certified 10-year PennDOT driving record required. Disclosure of suspensions, DUIs, or violations mandatory. Criminal Background (§ 29.505): All drivers must undergo PA State Police PATCH and FBI fingerprint background checks, renewed every 2 years. Certification of Truthfulness: Drivers must sign an affidavit certifying accuracy of information provided.

3. Hiring & Training Standards

Pre-employment: Drug test, CPR/First Aid certification, driving record verification. Orientation: Company policies, Title 52 compliance, passenger safety, HIPAA awareness. Annual Training: ADA compliance, emergency response, defensive driving refreshers.

4. Vehicle Safety & Maintenance

Daily Pre-Trip Inspection: Brakes, tires, mirrors, lift (if applicable). Preventive Maintenance: Oil changes every 5,000 miles, brake inspections every 6 months. Annual Inspection: Must comply with 67 Pa. Code Chapter 175. Logs retained 5 years.

5. Record-Keeping & Retention

Driver Records: Retained 3 years post-employment. Trip Records: Retained 3 years. Vehicle Records: Retained 5 years. Complaint Records: Retained 4 years. Records stored digitally with restricted access.

6. Communication & Dispatch System

Requests handled by phone, email, or dispatch software. Real-time communication with drivers via GPS-enabled smartphones/radios. Backup procedures in place. Dispatch logs retained 3 years.

7. Insurance & Financial Responsibility

Maintain PUC-required liability insurance. Certificates filed with the PUC and kept onsite. Financial statements updated every 6 months.

8. Complaint Handling & Resolution

Complaints logged and retained for 4 years. Reviewed monthly by Compliance Officer. Corrective actions documented.

9. Internal Audit & Compliance Oversight

Quarterly audits of driver, vehicle, and dispatch records. Annual compliance review for Title 52 adherence. Compliance Officer: Lancelot Anastil, CEO/Administrator.

10. Acknowledgment & Certification


