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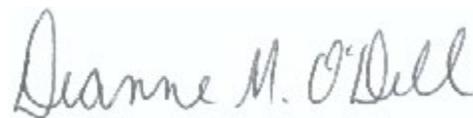

A Prehearing Conference is scheduled for Wednesday, November 5, 2025 before Deputy Chief Administrative Law Judge Christopher P. Pell and Administrative Law Judge Barbara Shadie Nause (“ALJs”). RESA submits this Memorandum in compliance with the Prehearing Conference Order issued on October 23, 2025.

II. SERVICE OF DOCUMENTS

RESA requests that all documents be served on:

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RESA prefers that documents be served electronically to the above email address and agrees to receive service of documents electronically in this proceeding. To the extent that materials are not available electronically, RESA requests that only one hard copy of documents, if any, be served upon Deanne O’Dell at the above mailing address.

Lauren Burge will be the primary speaker on behalf of RESA for purposes of the prehearing conference.

III. ISSUES

As explained in its Petition to Intervene, many RESA members are licensed to provide electric supply to retail customers in the markets of Pennsylvania’s major electric distribution companies, including in PPL’s service territory. RESA members will be specifically and substantially affected by the outcome of this proceeding, as PPL’s rate filing includes proposal that would significantly increase costs to electric generation suppliers (“EGSs”) and which would be harmful to competitive markets. If approved, the Company’s proposals would have a significant impact on EGS operations in PPL’s service territory.

While RESA members are continuing to evaluate PPL's rate filing, below is a list of preliminary issues of concern to RESA:

1. PPL's proposal to modify its supplier coordination tariff to begin recovering the costs for EDI transactions on a per transaction basis from EGSs.
2. PPL's proposal to assign costs to each EGS of testing a new DUNS system that PPL will set up for each EGS.
3. Other proposed modifications to PPL's supplier tariff.

RESA reserves the right to raise other issues identified through its continued review and analysis of PPL's rate filing as well as any of the testimony and positions developed by other parties in the proceeding.

IV. WITNESSES

At this time, RESA is still considering whether to present testimony in this matter.

RESA reserves the right to present a witness, as may be necessary, depending on the course of the proceeding. If RESA decides to present testimony, RESA will provide reasonable notice to the ALJs, as well as the parties. RESA also reserves its right to add or change the identity of its witnesses at any time, upon appropriate notice the ALJs and the parties.

V. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

RESA is amenable to working with the other parties to adopt a reasonable procedural schedule in this proceeding.

VI. DISCOVERY MODIFICATIONS

RESA does not have any proposals regarding discovery modifications.

VII. HEARINGS

At this time, RESA continues to evaluate the issues in this proceeding and is unable to estimate the amount of hearing time that may be needed.

VIII. POSSIBILITY OF SETTLEMENT

RESA is willing to participate in settlement discussions with the parties to narrow the issues in this matter.
