**Re: Petition of the Borough of Royersford, Pennsylvania for Emergency Order
Docket No. P-2025-3056530 – Status Report and Request for Rescheduling of
Telephonic Prehearing Conference**

Dear Judges Brady and Pell:

As counsel for the Borough of Royersford, we are writing on behalf of all parties to the above-captioned matter to provide you with a status update and attendant request to postpone the upcoming telephonic prehearing conference scheduled for November 3, 2025.

We are pleased to report that the parties have made significant progress towards complying with the Commission's August 1, 2025 Order directing that the parties confer with the Bureau of Technical Utility Services ("TUS") and remediate the conditions at the railroad crossings at issue. The parties have agreed in principle to a reasonable and voluntary set of protocols that will take place should any further malfunctions occur. In addition, Norfolk Southern and PECO have been investigating potential causes and potential long-term solutions to resolve the underlying crossing malfunctions presented in this proceeding.

PECO circulated a draft of its Confidential Report to the parties on October 29, 2025, and the parties require additional time to review and discuss that study. While the parties are certainly willing and able to participate in the scheduled prehearing conference on November 3, 2025, as directed, the information provided in this correspondence is essentially what we would report. Consequently, the parties respectfully request that the telephonic prehearing conference scheduled for November 3, 2025 be rescheduled for approximately 30 days, to December 4, 2025, or whenever your schedules permit. A rescheduled prehearing conference will permit the parties to continue working in the collaborative and cooperative fashion that we have fostered and enable us to provide more details and proposals for the timely resolution of this proceeding.
