**INTERIM ORDER
GRANTING A REQUEST FOR A FURTHER CONTINUANCE**

On April 21, 2025, Jacqueline Fielder (Complainant) filed a formal complaint against Peoples Natural Gas Co. LLC (Peoples), alleging that she had been enrolled in Peoples' customer assistance program (CAP) against her wishes. She averred that she only wished to apply for a Dollar Energy grant. Peoples filed an answer on May 20, 2025, noting that Dollar Energy directly enrolls qualified clients into CAP and denied any fraudulent activity.

The complaint was assigned to me on May 22, 2025, and scheduled for a hearing on July 17, 2025. I issued a prehearing order on May 22, 2025, setting forth the procedures for the conduct of the hearing, including procedures for providing proposed exhibits, requesting a continuance and other matters pertaining to the hearing.

The hearing was held in the above matter on July 17, 2025. The Complainant requested a continuance of the hearing. Peoples did not oppose the request. The parties agreed to schedule a further hearing for November 5, 2025.

A further hearing notice and second prehearing order were served on July 18, 2025.

By email on October 30, 2025, the Complainant requested a further continuance because she was suffering significant health issues. Peoples did not object to the further continuance. Jennfier Petrisek, Esquire noted that the Complainant did not want to meet with Peoples discuss settlement of her complaint. Counsel noted that the Complainant's dispute might be better addressed with the assistance of Mediation so that Peoples could explain its review of the Complainant's concerns and share enhancements to the Company's processes.

It is the policy of the Commission to encourage settlements. 52 Pa.Code § 5.231. Also, it is Commission policy to encourage mediation during which the parties may attempt to resolve the case with the aid of a mediator. 52 Pa.Code §§ 69.391– 69.397. The mediator, a neutral staff member within the Mediation Unit of the Commission's Office of Administrative Law Judge, does not give advice, represent any party, evaluate or make a decision. Instead, the mediator assists the parties in their efforts to come to an agreement thereby avoiding the time, expense and uncertainty of litigation. Mediation is an informal process where the parties can discuss a full range of settlement options beyond those which can be ordered by the Commission in the formal adjudication process.

As of the date of this order, the Complainant has not responded to the invitation to resolve her complaint with the assistance of Mediation. Accordingly, I will direct that this matter be scheduled for a hearing. In the event the Complainant elects to make use of mediation assistance, I will cancel the hearing and transfer the complaint to the mediation unit for review.

THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED:

1. That the Complainant's request for a continuance is granted.
2. That a further hearing shall be scheduled for an available date.

3. In the event that the Complainant consents to participate in mediation, the hearing shall be cancelled, and the case will be transferred to the Mediation Unit.
