Request for Information

- 1.) The responses to questions 5(a), 5(b), 5(c), 5(d) and 5(e) of the verified statements are insufficient. **Title 52 Pa. Code § 29 provides detailed requirements. Please provide a system which incorporates code specified compliance requirements for frequency and retention of records.** Each of your answers to sections of this question were insufficient:

- § 29.503. Age restrictions.
- § 29.504. Driver history
- § 29.505. Criminal history.

5a. § 29.503 Applicant currently employs two (2) drivers. When demand for Applicant's services increases through an increase in individuals seeking reimbursable transportation to/from the clients, Applicant will employ additional drivers. An increase in individuals seeking reimbursable transportation to/from the adult day centers, churches, medical appointments, or otherwise (as described above), Applicant will employ additional drivers, be at least twenty-one years of age (21). Speak and read English to effectively communicate with clients, understand traffic signals, make legible reports and records, operate vehicle safely, and have a valid driver's license issued by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Comply with Applicant's Driver Job Description.

5b. § 29.504 Applicant will require all applicants for a driver position to submit a criminal history background check. The applicant may not permit a person to operate a vehicle in its authorized service until it has obtained and reviewed a driver history from the appropriate agency of every state in which that person held a motor vehicle operator's license or permit during the preceding 3 years.

- (2) Following receipt of the initial driver history report, a common or contract carrier shall, at least once every 12 months from the date of the last report, obtain a driver history for each driver operating under its authority from the appropriate agency of the state in which the driver held an operator's license during the time period. Compliance with this subsection does not relieve a common or contract carrier of the responsibility to ensure its drivers hold a current, valid driver's license.
- (3) A copy of the driver history shall be maintained by the common or contract carrier for at least 2 years.

§ 29.505

(1) Criminal history record required. A common or contract carrier may not permit a person to operate a vehicle in its authorized service until it has obtained and reviewed a criminal history record from the Pennsylvania State Police and every other state in which the person resided for the last 12 months. For current drivers, carriers shall obtain a criminal history record by November 9, 2006.

(2) Frequency of record check. Following receipt of the initial criminal history record, a common or contract carrier shall obtain and review a criminal history record for each driver operating under its authority from the Pennsylvania State Police every 2 years from the date of the last criminal history check.

(3) Disqualification. A common or contract carrier may not permit a person to operate a vehicle in its authorized service when the person was convicted of a felony or a misdemeanor under the laws of the Commonwealth or under the laws of another jurisdiction, to the extent the conviction relates adversely to that person's suitability to provide service safely and legally.

(4) Record retention. A copy of the criminal history shall be maintained by the common or contract carrier for at least 3 years.

5c. Company will provide training programs on motor vehicle incident prevention and personal securement to all new drivers.

5d. 29.502 A common or contract carrier may not permit a person to operate a vehicle in its authorized service unless that person has a current, valid driver's license. This may be verified through the DMV or applicant screening service.

5e. § 29.506. Alcohol prohibition

A driver may not use alcohol, be under the influence of alcohol, or have any measured alcohol concentration or detected presence of alcohol, while operating a vehicle in passenger service. A driver may not use a controlled substance, be under the influence of a controlled substance, or have any measured concentration or detected presence of a controlled substance, while operating a vehicle in passenger service.
