REVISED ORDER SETTING LITIGATION SCHEDULE

On November 5, 2025, an Order Setting Litigation Schedule was issued to the parties in this matter. This Order revises the litigation schedule to reflect a Respondent's Direct Testimony Deadline of **April 30, 2026**.

IT IS ORDERED:

1. That my Order Granting Motion for Protective Order, issued on July 23, 2025, in this matter is hereby lifted.
2. That the parties shall conclude discovery in this proceeding by February 17, 2026.
3. The parties are directed to cooperate and exchange information on an informal basis. The parties are encouraged to resolve discovery issues among themselves; motions to compel should be filed only after such efforts have failed. All motions to compel must contain a certification of the informal discovery undertaken and their efforts to resolve their discovery disputes informally. There are limitations on discovery and sanctions for abuse of the discovery process. 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.361, 5.371-5.372.

4. That the parties shall comply with the following deadlines concerning the filing of written testimony and exhibits:

Complainant's Direct Testimony	March 19, 2026
Respondent's Direct Testimony	April 30, 2026
Rebuttal Testimony	May 21, 2026
Surrebuttal Testimony	June 11, 2026
Evidentiary Hearing	July 2026

5. That the parties comply with the Commission's requirements for the preparation and service of written testimony. 52 Pa. Code § 5.412. This includes the requirement that written testimony must be accompanied by all exhibits to which it relates and that written testimony shall be marked with numerical, sequential statement numbers. 52 Pa. Code § 5.412(e). Testimony shall not be filed with the Commission at the time of service but the parties shall instead file a Certificate of Service with the Commission's Secretary. 52 Pa. Code § 5.412(f).

6. All written testimony shall be accompanied by a verification or affidavit of the witness.

7. That the parties may serve documents electronically by 4:30 p.m. to meet any due date.

8. Written testimony and exhibits should be submitted by email to the opposing party and to the undersigned.

9. Evidentiary hearing exhibits need not include all pre-served testimony and exhibits which are circulated in this proceeding in accordance with the above-referenced procedural schedule.

10. That the parties shall comply with the provisions of 52 Pa. Code § 5.243(e) which prohibit the introduction of evidence during rebuttal which should have been included in the party's case-in-chief, or which substantially varies from the party's case-in-chief.

11. That the parties shall stipulate to any matters they reasonably can to expedite this proceeding, lessen the burden of time and expenses in litigation on all parties and conserve precious administrative hearing resources. 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.232 and 5.234. All stipulations entered into by the parties shall be reduced to writing, signed by the parties to be bound thereby, and moved into the record during the hearings in this case.

12. That the evidentiary hearings in this matter constitute formal legal proceedings and will be conducted in accordance with the Commission's Rules of Administrative Practice and Procedure, as well as the rules of evidence as applied to administrative hearings.

13. That the parties are to confer among themselves in an attempt to resolve all or some of the issues in this matter. The parties are reminded it is the Commission's policy to encourage settlements. 52 Pa. Code § 5.231(a). The parties are strongly urged to seriously explore this possibility.

14. That any provision of this order may be modified upon motion and good cause shown by any party in interest.
