On November 7, 2025, EV.ENERGY, CORP filed an application to register as a Conservation Service Provider (CSP) with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission. A registered CSP can advise an electric distribution company (EDC) and/or provide consultation, design, administration or management services to an EDC related to the EDC's energy efficiency and conservation plan.


Upon review, it appears that the applicant meets the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission's minimum qualifications to provide consultation, design, administration, management or advisory services to an EDC regarding energy efficiency and conservation plans required under Act 129 of 2008, P.L. 1592. Therefore, effective from the date of this Secretarial Letter, EV.ENERGY, CORP is registered as a CSP on the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission's Registry of Conservation Service Providers.

This registration is valid for two years from the date of this letter. A CSP must renew registration every two years to remain on the registry. In addition, the applicant is advised that if any information in the application changes, it must provide a written notice of said change to the Commission within 45 days of the change.

This approval is not meant to constitute a license, certification or warranty of any kind by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission.
