Re: Application of *Immaculate Non-Medical Transportation Services LLC* for Paratransit authority, 5665 East Wister Street, Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, Philadelphia, 19144. (484) 632-6144.

To whom it may concern:

The purpose of this Letter is to advise you that your application for Paratransit authority at Docket No. A-2025-3058158 has been **DENIED** by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission). The Commission has determined that a Certificate of Public Convenience shall not be granted for the following reason(s):

- On October 28, 2025, the application of Immaculate Non-Medical Transportation Services LLC was accepted by the Commission for consideration of Paratransit service. Financial information presented by the applicant, Immaculate Non-Medical Transportation Services LLC, lacked adequate financial fitness to render safe, efficient, and reasonable transportation. On October 29, 2025, a data request was served giving the applicant an opportunity to fully fund the LLC asking to do so prior to submitting their response. In their response the cash assets were raised but it is deemed not enough to cover continuance overhead costs. Again, it was indicated the applicant has not acquired a vehicle.

The record demonstrates there is a significant lack of the necessary financial liquidity that will be required to acquire, maintain, replace, and ensure a vehicle for the proposed service. It is the responsibility of the applicant seeking motor common carrier authority to demonstrate that it possesses the financial ability to provide the proposed service. As per 52 Pa. Code §41.14, applications may be denied if the applicant fails to satisfy fitness standards. Please know you can re-apply when the business is fully funded.

For this reason(s), your application is **DENIED** and **DISMISSED**.

APPEAL RIGHTS

If you disagree with this determination, you may send a Petition for Reconsideration from Staff Action (Petition) to: Secretary, PA Public Utility Commission, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, PA 17120. Such a Petition is a written statement asking the Commission to change its determination.

ALL Parties to proceedings pending before the Commission are advised to open and use an e-filing account through the Commission's website, OR you may submit your filing by mail. If a filing contains confidential or proprietary material, the filing is required to be submitted by mail.

The Petition must be filed with the Commission within twenty (20) days of the date of this letter. If no timely request for reconsideration is made, this action will be deemed to be the final action of the Commission.

The Petition MUST include: (1) a written statement (divided into numbered paragraphs) outlining the reasons for the request, (2) the case docket number(s) (they are provided for you at the top right-hand corner of this letter), (3) the name of the person on whose behalf the petition is made, (4) copies of relevant documentation, and (5) a verification with original signature. *See* 52 Pa. Code §§1.31 and 5.44. Below is a sample Verification:
