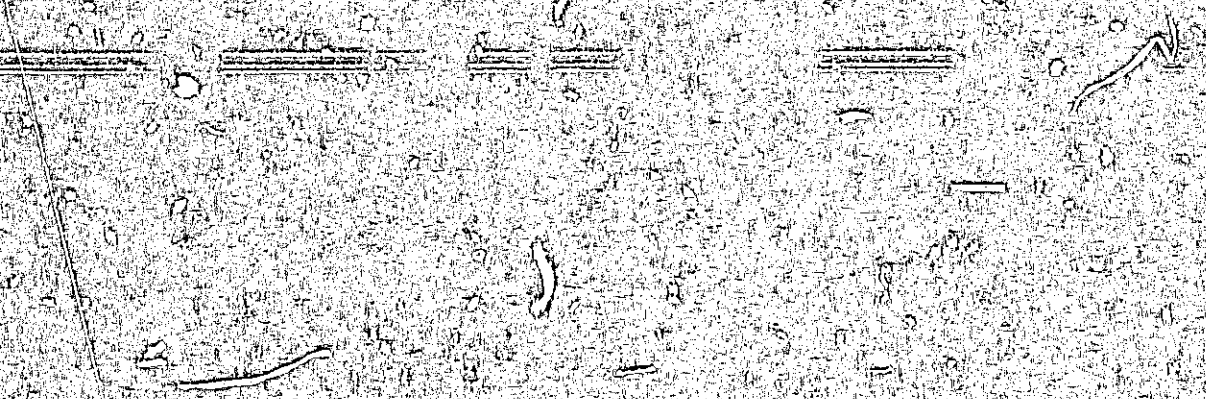

RULES AND REGULATIONS (Continued)

WATER SERVICE AFTER DISCONTINUANCE

When water service to any property has been terminated for reasons as stated in 4.(1), it will be renewed only after the acceptance of a new application and when the conditions, circumstances or practices which caused the water service to be discontinued are corrected to the satisfaction of the Company.

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6. BILLS FOR WATER SERVICE

- (1) All bills shall be rendered monthly for service during the preceding period and are due on presentation thereof. A penalty of 1% per month will be added to all monthly bills for service not paid within twenty (20) days from due date of the bill. The post mark indicating the mailing date shall be considered as the date of presentation of a bill. For failure to make payment, the service may be shut off after due notice. All bills will be made out in the name of the consumer whom the Company will hold responsible for their payment.
- (2) The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and any agency thereof is entitled to a thirty-day period from the due date of any bill within which it may pay for water service without the imposition of a penalty.
- (3) Payments mailed, as evidenced by the United States Post Office mark on or previous to the end of the period during which the bills are payable at face, will be deemed to be a payment within such period.

7. GENERAL

- (1) All lines and fixtures, shall at all reasonable hours be subject to inspection by the proper employees of the Company.
- (2) In cases of permanent vacancy of a consumer's property, the consumer must notify the Company in writing of such vacancy, and upon his failure so to do he will become responsible for any damage to the property of the Company, arising from such failure.
- (3) When water has been turned off at any premise for non-payment of bills or other violation of Rules and Regulations, the charge for restoring service will be \$10.00.
- (4) A turn-on order in any case will not be issued until all arrears due the Company shall have been paid, and a new application has also been made for service.

RULES AND REGULATIONS (Continued)

7. GENERAL (Continued)

- (5) The Company reserves the right at all times, after due notice, to shut off the water for violation of or refusal to comply with the Rules and Regulations of the Company, and to make a charge of \$10.00 for the resumption of service.
- (6) Bills or notices, relating to the Company or its business, shall be mailed or delivered to the applicant's last address, as shown by the books of the Company, and the Company shall not be otherwise responsible for the delivery. The Company shall mail or deliver all such notices and bills to the address given on the application, until a change in writing has been filed with the Company by the applicant.
- (7) As necessity may arise in case of break, emergency or other unavoidable cause, the Company shall have the right to temporarily cut off the water supply in order to make necessary repairs, connections, etc., but the Company will use all reasonable and practicable measures to notify the Consumer, in advance, of such discontinuance of service. In such case, the Company shall not be liable for any damage or inconvenience suffered by the Consumer nor in any case for any claim against it at any time for interruption in service, lessening of supply, inadequate pressure, poor quality of water, or any cause beyond its control. The Company shall have the right to reserve a sufficient supply of water at all times in its reservoirs to provide for fire or any other emergency and may restrict or regulate the quantity of water used by Consumers in case of scarcity, or whenever the public welfare may require it.
- (8) No agent or employee of the Company shall have authority to bind it by any promise, agreement, or representation, not provided for in these Rules and Regulations.
- (9) Consumers shall limit water use to all usual and normal use for a residence property. Water shall not be used wastefully. If any consumer will violate this rule, the Company may shut off water service to such consumer until the consumer satisfies the Company of intention to comply with this rule. The use of swimming and wading pools is prohibited except as approved by the Company.

8. SPRINKLERS AND HOSES

- (1) All hose must be held in hand. The use of a spaker hose, setting hose in a stationary position, or letting it run unattended shall be considered Automatic Sprinkling and is not permitted.
