Dear Secretary Homsher:

Transmitted herewith for filing with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) is Supplement No. 32 to FirstEnergy Pennsylvania Electric Company’s (“FE PA” or the “Company”) Tariff Electric Pa. P.U.C. No. 1 bearing an issue date of December 10, 2025. The tariff changes contained in Supplement No. 32 are proposed to be effective for bills rendered on or after January 1, 2026.

The purpose of this filing is to reflect changes to the Distribution System Improvement Charge (“DSIC”) Rider. The rate change is consistent with the Commission’s Order entered November 21, 2024, at Docket No. R-2024-3047068. The DSIC rates are set to zero (0%) percent and will continue to be set to zero until the later of March 31, 2026, or the plant account balances exceed the agreed upon settlement amounts for each FE PA Rate District.

will apply consistent with the Commission Orders dated June 9, 2016 and April 19, 2018, at Docket Nos. (ME) P-2015-2508942, (PN) P-2015-2508936, (PP) P-2015-2508931, and (WP) P-2015-2508948 approving the Distribution System Improvement Charge (“DSIC”). This charge will be effective during the period January 1, 2026 through March 31, 2026. (C)

1. General Description

A. Purpose: To recover the reasonable and prudent costs incurred to repair, improve, or replace eligible property which is completed and placed in service and recorded in the individual accounts, as noted below, between base rate cases and to provide the Rate Districts with the resources to accelerate the replacement of aging infrastructure, to comply with evolving regulatory requirements and to develop and implement solutions to regional supply problems.

The costs of extending facilities to serve new customers are not recoverable through the DSIC.

B. Eligible Property: The DSIC-eligible property will consist of the following:

- Poles and towers (account 364);
- Overhead conductors (account 365) and underground conduit and conductors (accounts 366 and 367);
- Line transformers (account 368) and substation equipment (account 362);
- Any fixture or device related to eligible property listed above, including insulators, circuit breakers, fuses, reclosers, grounding wires, crossarms and brackets, relays, capacitors, converters and condensers;
- Unreimbursed costs related to highway relocation projects where an electric distribution company must relocate its facilities; and
- Other related capitalized costs.

C. Effective Date: The DSIC will become effective July 1, 2016.
