Witnesses must be available at the time of the hearing.

Please note that this is not a notice for public input hearings. Public input hearings were held on December 15, 2025 (Manheim Township) and December 16, 2025 (telephonic) for members of the public to give testimony regarding the rate filing. Witnesses who testified at the public input hearings are not required to participate in the evidentiary hearings that will be held in January 2026.

FAILURE TO APPEAR. If you are an **Active Participant** in this proceeding, meaning that you advised the Administrative Law Judge that you wish to have an active role in this proceeding and submit evidence, witnesses and testimony in the technical evidentiary hearings, you may lose the case if you do not take part in this hearing and present evidence on the issue(s) raised.

REPRESENTATION. If you are an individual, you may represent yourself or you may have an attorney represent you. All others, including a partnership, corporation, limited liability company, trust, association, or governmental agency or subdivision, must be represented by an attorney licensed to practice law in Pennsylvania, or admitted pro hac vice. Only an attorney may represent someone else.

PRESENTING EXHIBITS. If you intend to present any documents or exhibits into the hearing record, such documents or exhibits should be attached to your written testimony pursuant to the litigation schedule established at the prehearing conference on November 18, 2025. Proposed exhibits should be properly pre-marked for identification purposes. The admission of documents and exhibits at the evidentiary hearing may be permitted or denied at the discretion of the presiding officer.

CONTINUANCES. You may request a continuance of the hearing if you have a good reason. All continuances will be granted only for good cause. To request a continuance, you must submit a written request (a “motion”) at least five (5) days before the hearing. Your motion should include: (1) The case name, number, and hearing date; (2) The reason for the request; and (3) Whether the other party agrees (or if you do not know).

ACCOMMODATION. Any party who needs an accommodation for a disability in order to participate in this hearing process may request one. Please call the OALJ scheduling office at least five (5) business days prior to your hearing to submit your request.

If you require an interpreter to participate in the hearing, please call the scheduling office at least ten (10) business days prior to your hearing to submit your request.

DOCUMENTS. All Parties to proceedings pending are encouraged to either open and use an eFiling account through the Commission’s website at www.puc.pa.gov OR to ensure timely arrival, submit the filing by overnight delivery as explained below.

This service allows a user to file documents electronically and receive an automatic email notification whenever a document is added, removed, or changed on the PUC website in a specific case.
