INTERCONNECTION AND TARIFFS FOR LARGE LOAD CUSTOMERS

Dear Sir/Madam:

I am concerned about the impact of adding new large-load customers on the cost and quality of service to the general public who are already customers of regulated Pennsylvania public utilities.

I would like to suggest that whatever tariffs are established for pricing electricity to large-load customers provide a benefit to current general customers.

As an example, because large-load customers may require the addition of capacity to existing utilities, the costs of adding such additional capacity should be borne solely by the new customers. This should include both capital cost as well as operating costs. And should overall operating costs per unit be reduced as a result of this added capacity, a portion of this saving should be allocated to reduce the cost across all current customers.

In this way, current customers – in particular, the general public – will be shielded from the high cost of adding capacity to address the new peak load driven by the new large-load customers.

In addition, I suggest that capacity expansion be sized to maintain current Quality of Service levels for existing customers.
