Dear Mr. Homsher:

In its Supplemental Update Order in Docket No. M-2012-2293611 issued on September 21, 2016, the Commission directed that utilities should continue to file quarterly DSIC updates reflecting the eligible property placed into service associated with repair, replacement or improvement during the stay-out period. Accordingly, Columbia submits its update of DSIC-eligible property placed into service that was associated with a repair, replacement or improvement for the months September 2025 through November 2025, the costs of which are being recovered through base rates.

As noted in the September 19, 2025 filing, the company implemented a new work management technology system in July 2025 which delayed the classification of DSIC eligible additions in that quarterly filing. The company has since implemented systematic and process enhancements which resulted in the processing of DSIC eligible additions on a prospective basis beginning in September 2025. As a result, the information submitted with this filing now reflects the delayed classification of DSIC eligible additions from June 2025 through August 2025 that were not captured in the September 19, 2025 filing in addition to the DSIC eligible additions from September 2025 through November 2025. The company continues to implement systematic and process enhancements.
