

I do not support the construction of large data centers in Pennsylvania.

****produce more than they consume—at least 150% before construction—****so they reduce, rather than increase, our costs.

There should be a per-gallon tax on all water used and a binding requirement to employ local labor. If local labor is not utilized, these companies should be required to fund training programs for future workers at their own expense.
