**RE: Docket #M-2025-3054271 - Tentative Order and Large Load Model Tariff**

Dear Commissioners,

Please accept this public comment with my concerns on the Commission's Tentative Order and proposed Model Tariff for Large Load Customers at Docket #M-2025-3054271.

This order remains too narrow to fully provide meaningful safeguards to protect rate payers. I urge you to consider the Pennsylvania Rate Payer Protection Act (Senate Bill 1114) proposed by Senator Muth to provide a clearer, more consistent, and more protective framework for rate payers.

Electricity is a basic necessity and rate increases hit low- and fixed-income households the hardest. For rural customers, who already face higher energy costs, even small increases can constrain family budgets. Putting data-center-driven electric rate hikes on consumers is unfair, economically inefficient, and undermines both affordability and sound utility regulation. The entities should bear the costs, not the communities.
