**PREHEARING ORDER #3**

On October 15, 2025, the Customer-Generator Coalition (CGC) filed a Petition to Intervene in the above-referenced matter. The October 15, 2025, Petition identified the CGC members as Aspen Power, 38 Degrees, CVE North America, Syncarpha Capital, LLC, Twilight Renewables, Bollinger Solar, and CEP Renewables, LLC.

On October 29, 2025, the CGC filed its Motion to Amend Petition to Intervene of Aspen Power, 38 Degrees, CVE North America, Syncarpha Capital, LLC, Twilight Renewables, Bollinger Solar, and CEP Renewables (Motion to Amend 1). The CGC advised that Motion to Amend 1 was filed solely for the limited purpose of updating the list of participating entities, and to update the names of existing coalition members to reflect their official corporate designations as reflected in Appendix A to Motion to Amend 1. The CGC maintained that Motion to Amend 1 should not be construed to supersede, withdraw, or replace its original Petition to Intervene in

this proceeding. The CGC explained that since filing its initial Petition, it has experienced strong interest from additional entities seeking to join and participate formally as members, and that these members have a direct, substantial, and legally protectable interests in the outcome of this proceeding because they currently operate, or have pending interconnection applications for, renewable generation facilities within PPL's service territory that would be materially affected by the proposed tariff changes. The CGC moved to add the following members:

- EDPR NA Distributed Generation LLC;
- GS Power Partners;
- Propect14 LLC;
- Radial Power LLC;
- Solar Renewable Energy, LLC;
- SR1 Captura Sage Holdco I, LLC; and
- Scale Microgrids.

Motion to Amend 1 was endorsed with a Notice to Plead. No active party to this proceeding responded to the CGC's Motion to Amend 1.

On November 5, 2025, a Prehearing Conference was held in this matter. During the Prehearing Conference, the Petition to Intervene in this proceeding filed by the Customer-Generator Coalition was granted. Through an oversight, the CGC's Motion to Admit 1 was not addressed during the Prehearing Conference.

On December 2, 2025, the CGC filed its Second Moton to Amend Petition to Intervene of Aspen Power, 38 Degrees, CVE North America, Syncarpha Capital, LLC, Twilight Renewables, Bollinger Solar, and CEP Renewables (Motion to Amend 2). The CGC advised that Motion to Amend 2 was filed solely for the limited purpose of updating the list of participating entities. The CGC explained that these entities have a direct, substantial, and legally protectable interests in the outcome of this proceeding because they currently operate, or have pending interconnection applications for, renewable generation facilities within PPL's service territory that would be materially affected by the proposed tariff changes. The CGC explained that Motion to Amend 2 supplements the prior filing to reflect the addition of the following parties:

- Dynamic Energy Solutions, LLC; and
- Encore Renewable Energy

The CGC further explained that Motion to Amend 2 reflects the removal of Twilight Renewables from its Petition to Intervene. As with Motion to Amend 1, the CGC averred that Motion to Amend 2 should not be construed to supersede, withdraw, or replace its original Petition to Intervene in this proceeding. Motion to Amend 2 was endorsed with a Notice to Plead. No active party to this proceeding responded to the CGC's Motion to Amend 2.

As no active party to this proceeding has objected to either CGC Motion to Admit 1 or Motion to Admit 2, both Motions will be granted in the Ordering Paragraphs below.

### ORDER

THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED:

1. That the Customer-Generator Coalition's October 29, 2025, Motion to Amend Petition to Intervene of Aspen Power, 38 Degrees, CVE North America, Syncarpha Capital, LLC, Twilight Renewables, Bollinger Solar, and CEP Renewables is granted.

2. That pursuant to the October 29, 2025, Motion to Amend, the Customer-Generator Coalition's Petition to Intervene is amended to reflect the addition of the following entities:

- EDPR NA Distributed Generation LLC;
- GS Power Partners;
- Propect14 LLC;
- Radial Power LLC;
- Solar Renewable Energy, LLC;
- SR1 Captura Sage Holdco I, LLC; and

- Scale Microgrids.

3. That the Customer-Generator Coalition's December 2, 2025, Second Motion to Amend Petition to Intervene of Aspen Power, 38 Degrees, CVE North America, Syncarpha Capital, LLC, Twilight Renewables, Bollinger Solar, and CEP Renewables is granted.

4. That Pursuant to the December 2, 2025, Second Motion to Amend, the Customer-Generator Coalition's Petition to Intervene is amended to reflect the addition of Dynamic Energy Solutions, LLC; and Encore Renewable Energy, and the removal of Twilight Renewables.
