7. FINANCIAL FITNESS

Oversight of Marketing – US Power Electric (Telephonic Enrollments Only)

US Power Electric will ensure that all telephonic marketing and sales activities are performed in a fair, honest, and ethical manner, in full compliance with 52 Pa. Code Chapter 111 (Marketing and Sales Practices) and Chapter 54 (Disclosure Statements). Oversight applies to both in-house employees and any subcontracted call center partners.

1. Written Policies and Procedures

- All telephonic sales are governed by written Telemarketing Compliance Policies that prohibit deceptive or misleading claims.
- Marketing scripts are reviewed and approved by Compliance before use, and all required disclosures (pricing, terms, rescission, PUC resources, etc.) are built into those scripts.
- Policies strictly prohibit agents from misrepresenting themselves as the utility or from guaranteeing savings.

2. Training of Sales Agents

- Every sales agent must complete mandatory training before making any outbound or inbound sales calls. Training covers:
 - • Proper identification of US Power Electric and the customer's EDC.
 - • Disclosure requirements under 52 Pa. Code § 54.5.
 - • Customer rights, including the three-day rescission period.
 - • Prohibited practices (false savings claims, utility impersonation, abusive tactics).
- Agents must pass a compliance exam before being allowed to enroll customers.
- Annual refresher training and targeted retraining are conducted whenever regulations or products change.

3. Quality Control Monitoring

- 100% of telephonic enrollments are recorded.
- A dedicated Quality Control (QC) team reviews a statistically significant sample of calls daily to ensure compliance.
- Compliance staff monitor live calls at random intervals.
- Enrollments are only finalized after an independent Third-Party Verification (TPV) confirms customer consent and key contract terms.

4. Vendor/Subcontractor Oversight

- All subcontracted call centers must sign a compliance addendum requiring adherence to PUC telemarketing rules.
- Vendors are required to provide US Power Electric access to all call recordings, agent rosters, and training records.
- US Power Electric reserves the right to audit vendor operations and terminate any vendor relationship immediately for non-compliance.

5. Complaint Resolution and Enforcement

- A toll-free customer service line is maintained to receive and resolve complaints promptly.
- All complaints are logged and investigated within 30 days.
- Corrective actions may include retraining, disciplinary measures, or termination of agents/vendors for violations.

6. Recordkeeping and Reporting

- All telephonic enrollment recordings and TPVs are stored for a minimum of two years, as required by PUC rules.
- Compliance reports summarizing call audits, complaints, and corrective actions are provided quarterly to senior management.

An EGS will file an annual report reporting for customer groups defined by annual usage. Reports must be filed using the appropriate report form that may be obtained from the PUC's Secretary's Bureau or the forms officer, or may be down-loaded from the PUC's internet web site.
- **Reports of Gross Receipts:** Applicant shall report its Pennsylvania intrastate gross receipts to the Commission on a quarterly and year to date basis no later than 30 days following the end of the quarter.
- **The Treasurer or other appropriate officer of Applicant shall transmit to the Department of Revenue by March 15, an annual report, and under oath or affirmation, of the amount of gross receipts received by Applicant during the prior calendar year.**
- **Net Metering Reports:** Applicant shall be responsible to report any Net Metering per the Standards on http://www.puc.pa.gov/consumer_info/electricity/alternative_energy.aspx. Scroll down to the Net Metering Standards Section.

- Applicant shall report to the Commission the percentages of total electricity supplied by each fuel source on an annual basis per 52 Pa. Code § 54.39(b)(4).
- Applicant will be required to meet periodic reporting requirements as may be issued by the Commission to fulfill the Commission's duty under Chapter 28 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. Chapt. 28, pertaining to reliability and to inform the Governor and Legislature of the progress of the transition to a fully competitive electric market.

AGREED

- d. **TRANSFER OF LICENSE:** The Applicant understands that if it plans to transfer its license to another entity, it is required to request authority from the Commission for permission prior to transferring the license. See 66 Pa.C.S. § 2809(D) and 52 Pa. Code § 54.41(a). Transferee will be required to file the appropriate licensing application.

- i. **CEASING OF OPERATIONS:** Applicant is also required to officially notify the Commission if it plans to cease doing business in Pennsylvania, 90 days prior to ceasing operations.





...“ in accordance with Section 2809(c)(1)(i) of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. 2809(c)(1)(i), to assure compliance with applicable provisions of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. 101, et seq. and the rules and regulation of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission by the Principal as a licensed electric generation supplier; to ensure the payment of Gross Receipts Tax as required by Section 2810 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. 2810; to ensure the payment of annual fees as authorized by Act 155 of 2014; to adhere to the requirements of the Alternative Energy Portfolio Standards Act, 73 P.S. § 1648.1 et seq. and 52 Pa.Code 75.1 et seq.; and to ensure the supply of electricity at retail in accordance with contracts, agreements or arrangement. Payment of claims shall have the following priority: (I) The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; (II) Electric Distribution Companies for the reimbursement of Gross Receipts Tax; and (III) Private Individuals. Proceeds of the bond may not be used to pay any penalties or fines levied against the Principal for violations of the law, or for the payment of any other tax obligations owed to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.”

The Applicant has read and understands the terms and conditions of the Operating Agreement. The Applicant agrees to accept the concepts and obligations set forth in this Agreement and the Operating Agreement posted on the PJM website at: <http://www.pjm.com/documents/agreements/pjm-agreements.aspx>.
