The Applicant, *Clear Energy Solutions, LLC*, proposes to operate as a non-jurisdictional natural gas broker/marketer serving commercial, industrial, and institutional end-use customers throughout the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The Applicant will not take title to natural gas or directly provide commodity supply. Instead, it will facilitate competitive retail natural gas supply contracts between licensed natural gas suppliers (NGSs) and end-use customers.

Services will include:

- Market analysis, price monitoring, and risk-management consulting;
- Development and solicitation of competitive supply bids from licensed NGSs;
- Negotiation and execution assistance for fixed, variable, and indexed natural gas procurement agreements;
- Ongoing account management, renewal coordination, and customer education on rate structures, capacity, and cost components.

The Applicant will perform these functions in accordance with all applicable PUC regulations and ethical marketing standards, acting solely as an intermediary to help customers obtain the most favorable and transparent supply options from approved Pennsylvania natural gas suppliers.

The Applicant does not intend to engage in aggregation of natural gas load, retail sales, or any jurisdictional utility operations.

Electronic Data Interchange and Internet Requirements

Any NGS suppliers and/or broker/marketers that wish to use the Electronic Data Interchange (EDI), in the NGDCs where its available, must meet the EDI certification requirements of the NGDC. Certification is a testing process using the Commission approved Internet protocol. To initiate this process, the NGS is encouraged to contact the NGDC as early as possible after filing an application for a license with the Commission, since certification may require as many as four months to complete and customer service contract dates may not commence prior to certification. NGDC requirements of new suppliers may be found on the respective NGDC home web page. Pennsylvania’s industry stakeholder group the Electronic Data Exchange Working Group (EDEWG) develops and maintains the EDI transactions and related business practices, which are found on the Pa. PUC website at http://www.puc.pa.gov/filing_resources/issues_laws_regulations/electronic_data_exchange.aspx. The EDEWG meets telephonically the first Thursday of each month at 2:00pm ET to discuss EDI change control requests and other issues.

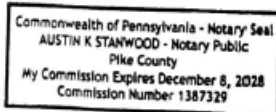

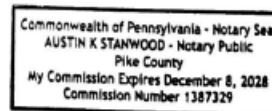

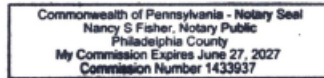
