Dear Mr. Walsh:

The Bureau of Audits has reviewed Newtown Artesian Water Company's quarterly Distribution System Improvement Charge (DSIC) filing submitted on January 22, 2026 to become effective on February 1, 2026. In the filing, the Company is not proposing to revise its currently effective DSIC rate of 0.00%.

Based upon staff review, it appears that the proposed DSIC rate for the three-month period of February 1, 2026 through April 30, 2026 is consistent with the tariff and, accordingly, is permitted to become effective as filed.

The DSIC is subject to continuous Commission review and audit as well as reconciliation reports in accordance with Section 1307(e) of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. § 1307(e).

Pursuant to the Commission's regulations at 52 Pa. Code § 5.44 (relating to petitions for reconsideration from actions of the staff), you may appeal by filing a petition for reconsideration with the Commission within 20 days of the date of this letter.
