AT&T Enterprises, LLC (“AT&T”) submits this response to the January 21, 2026 data requests from the Bureau of Technical Utility Services, Telecommunications Section, designated Set II. AT&T’s response is based on diligent investigations and reasonable inquiries and reflects the current state of AT&T’s knowledge, understanding, and belief with respect to the matters about which the data requests seek information.

3. Provide an explanation for AT&T Digital Link Service located in the Pennsylvania Service Guide Local Exchange Services Price List.

Response to Question 3:

AT&T Digital Link is a business service offering. As described in Section 9 of the AT&T Enterprises, LLC Pennsylvania Service Guide, AT&T Digital Link is a Local Exchange Service which permits outward and inward local calling capability from a customer's premises utilizing Direct Outward Dialing (DOD), Direct Inward Dialing (DID) and Main Listed Number (MLN) over dedicated digital facilities (as described in the AT&T Business Service Guide) and Originating Toll Free Service (8YY).

AT&T Digital Link Service (ADL) supports both line and trunk applications for customers. The Company will determine whether a Customer requires a line or a trunk application based upon: 1) the quantity of telephone numbers at a customer location and 2) Customer's existing service requirements, unless Customer requests a change to existing requirements.

AT&T Digital Link Service has been grandfathered since August, 2014. As such, there have been no new subscribers to the service since that time.

4. Provide an explanation for AT&T Digital Link Service located in the Pennsylvania PUC Tariff No. 2.

Response to Question 4:

As described in PA. P.U.C. No. 2 of the AT&T Enterprises, LLC Tariff, AT&T Digital Link Access Service (DLAS) provides switched access, (1) on an originating basis only for Toll Free (8YY) Service Calls from, and (2) for other Calls, on a terminating basis only to, the Premises of an End User which is obtaining the AT&T Digital Link Service offering (DLS End User) under the Company's Local Exchange Service Tariff. DLAS is provided via common switching and switched transport facilities, and utilizes dedicated digital facilities associated with AT&T Digital Link Service to connect the DLS End Office to the DLS End User's Premises.

Response to Question 5:

AT&T Digital Link Service is the customer-facing local exchange service. It describes what the customer has at their premises, including local calling functionality (outward and inward calling using DOD, DID, MLN, and related features) and how that service is configured (line or trunk).

AT&T Digital Link Access Service is a switched access service. It describes how calls are routed to and from a Digital Link customer through the network, including access, transport, interconnection, and billing arrangements. It does not define the customer's retail calling service. It governs the network access used to support that service.
