To the Honorable Commission:

Hospitrans Corporation, by its undersigned authorized representative, respectfully submits this Petition for Reconsideration from Staff Action, pursuant to 52 Pa. Code §§ 1.31 and 5.44, requesting that the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission reconsider the Dismissal Notice dated February 2, 2026, in the above-captioned matter.

**1. Background**

1. On or about December 2025, the Commission conditionally approved Hospitrans Corporation's application for Passenger Carrier Authority, subject to compliance with specific post-approval requirements within sixty (60) days.
2. On February 2, 2026, the Commission issued a Dismissal Notice stating that the application was dismissed due to non-compliance with certain requirements, including:
  - a) failure to have the insurance company file evidence of bodily injury and property damage liability insurance (Form E), and
  - b) failure to file a tariff establishing just and reasonable rates.

**2. Reasons for Non-Compliance**

3. Hospitrans Corporation did not willfully or negligently disregard the Commission's Order.
4. The Applicant encountered extraordinary and unforeseen financial barriers in securing the required commercial insurance. Multiple brokers quoted annual premiums approaching or exceeding **\$30,000 per vehicle**, which made immediate compliance financially impossible for a newly formed small business.

5. During the compliance period, the Applicant actively sought alternative insurance solutions, requested extensions, and continued working to meet the Commission's conditions in good faith.
6. Because the insurance filing (Form E) could not be completed due to these prohibitive costs, the tariff filing and remaining steps were delayed as well.

### **3. Good-Faith Efforts**

7. Hospitrans Corporation has remained committed to full regulatory compliance and has continued pursuing lawful insurance options and finalizing its tariff documentation.
8. The dismissal resulted from temporary financial hardship—not from a lack of intent to comply.

### **4. Request for Relief**

9. Hospitrans Corporation respectfully requests that the Commission:
  - a) **Reconsider and vacate** the February 2, 2026 Dismissal Notice; and
  - b) **Grant a reasonable extension of time** to allow the Applicant to secure compliant insurance and file all remaining documentation.
